Why Focus on Sustainability in Digital Preservation Education?

- Growing challenges
 - Global impact of energy use – will double by 2026
 - Environmental impacts (e.g. e-waste, water consumption)
 - Global inequities – social and environmental costs of data infrastructure
- Access vs. *Sustainable* Access – centering people and planet
- Environmental sustainability x social justice in digital archives
- Ethical responsibility
- Holistic approach
 - Technical, environmental, social
- Current and future skills

Education and Critical Pedagogy

- Informed by bell hooks' education as practice of freedom
- Fosters a justice-oriented approach
 - Inclusivity and intersectionality
- Engaged pedagogy
 - Real-world challenges and issues
- Critical thinking
- Social responsibility
- Real-world issues x ethical practices

Developing Framework for Centering Sustainability

- Educating for sustainable digital preservation
- Awareness
 - Understanding the environmental and social impacts
 - Critically evaluate impact of digital technologies
- Critical analysis
 - Evaluation digital preservation practices through a sustainability lens
- Emphasis on praxis
 - Bring theory into conversation with case studies
- Social justice lens
 - Focus on sustainable, equitable and responsible digital preservation
