William H Street, saxophone, holds advanced degrees from Northwestern University, the Conservatoire National de Bordeaux (France) and the Catholic University of America. His major teachers have been Frederick L Hemke, Jean-Marie Londeix, George Etheridge, Frederick Ockwell and John P Paynter. Dr Street, a member of the Ensemble International de Saxophones de Bordeaux, was also a a member of the Chicago, Washington, D.C. and Frederick Hemke Saxophone Quartets prior to ioining the University of Alberta Department of Music in 1988. He has become an integral part of the faculty as saxophone instructor, chamber music coach and Director of the University Concert Band.

William Street has appeared as soloist with orchestras and bands throughout Europe, Central and North America and Asia. He can be heard on compact disc recordings Sunthesis: Les Septs Iles (QM6901, Paris), L'Ensemble International de Saxophones (ACD0086, Tokyo) and Evolution V for five saxophonists (CRC 2086, Chicago) by Marilyn Shrude, recorded with the Chicago Saxophone Quartet. Dr Street has a strong interest in music education and appears frequently as clinician, recitalist and adjudicator throughout North America and France.

Professor Munn studied with Gladys McKelvie Egbert (Calgary), Irwin Freundlich (New York), Guido Agosti (Accademia Chigiana, Siena, Italy). She was opera coach for seven years at the Banff Centre, Music Director of the Music Theatre Division, and seven years as pianist with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra. Professor Munn has performed with many Western Canadian orchestras. Recently retired from the Department of Music, she was responsible for instituting courses in piano literature, pedagogy and vocal accompaniment. She has been the Music Advisor to the Western Board of Music and was appointed to the University of Alberta Department of Music in 1962. Professor Munn is now associated with the Alberta College Conservatory of Music.

Geoffrey Whittall, marimba, has studied percussion at the University of Alberta where he received a Bachelor of Music Honours degree and at Northwestern University in Illinois where he recently completed a Master of Music degree in percussion performance. He has performed often with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and has recorded two albums with them. He was a featured soloist at the 1990 New Music Chicago Festival. Geoff was appointed Instructor of Music at Grande Prairie Regional College in 1990 where he teaches percussion and directs the Jazz Ensemble.
