A precurser to this *Directory* was published in 1985. Those who are familiar with it will note that this edition has been completely updated and revised. We hope to make *The Social Research Directory* an ongoing publication and produce a further edition within two years. If you have any suggestions which we could incorporate in it, we would appreciate receiving them.

We would like to thank those individuals and libraries whose contributions have made this book possible. We thank the researchers who participated in our needs survey for helping us set *The Directory* off in the right direction, the staff of the libraries you see listed here for their alacrity and care in furnishing the information that makes up *The Social Research Directory*, and the Summer Temporary Employment Program of the Government of Alberta for financial assistance.

Lastly, please note that this book is to be used only as a guide. The information in it, except for some minor editing to ensure consistency, has been taken directly from questionnaires completed by the organizations listed here. The information was gathered during July and August 1988 and it is subject to change.

This *Directory* has been prepared taking into account the needs of its users — social researchers in community agencies, government, and education. The eighty libraries and resource centres listed here have been selected on the basis of three principle criteria.

Firstly, all the libraries and resource centres listed collect information about the individuals and groups that make up society, their welfare, and their interactions; secondly, the public has access to every collection, even if material does not circulate or if hours and service are limited; and thirdly, all of them are located in Edmonton.

The collections listed in this book are arranged in alphabetical order. The table of contents contains a complete listing of the individual entries. City of Edmonton and Government of Alberta libraries are generally listed under Edmonton or Alberta; all areas of the University of Alberta Library are listed under University of Alberta Library, and other collections maintained by the University can be found under their unique names.

The Social Research Directory provides information about libraries whose contents range from the general to the specialized. This has been taken into account in the index. Comprehensive terms are used to index those collections which are broad in scope, while specialized collections are indexed with more detailed terms.

Several points, as noted below, should be observed when using the individual listings.

**Purpose**: This identifies the collection's focus and the users it is aimed at. Although some do not mention the public as patrons, this does not mean that the public is excluded.

**Subjects**: The bold type represents the principle subjects collected. The terms following the semi-colon represent some but not all of the subjects subsumed under the principle ones.

**Holdings**: Not all types of material collected are listed here. 'Journals' is used to represent professional and academic periodicals: magazines, newspapers and newsletters are listed separately.
