


SURVEY PARTICIPANT PROFILES


GENDER




POSITION




PRIMARY AFFILIATION



PROVINCE/TERRITORY




SOTL CANADA: TIMELINE




LEVELS OF FUNDING SOURCES BY POSITION




LEVEL OF SOTL PROJECTS






FREQUENCY OF COLLABORATIONS




