Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750)

First-prize winner of the 1973 JS Bach International Organ Competition in Bruges, Belgium, and finalist in the Kiel and Munich 1971 International Competitions in Germany, **Réjean Poirier** has given many harpsichord, organ and fortepiano concerts as a soloist, chamber musician and conductor of baroque orchestras across Canada, the United States, Bermuda, France, Spain, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany.

His numerous appearances and recordings have been broadcast inernationally on the networks of th Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, Radio-France, Radio-Télévision Belge and the Spanish National Radio. He has also performed with soloists such as Emma Kirkby, Sarah Cunningham and André Bernard.

Mr Poirier has held the position of Director of the Studio de Musique Ancienne de Montréal Orchestra from 1974 to 1988 and has conducted such distinguished groups as the Orchestre baroque d'Ilede-France and Tafelmusik. Réjean Poirier has also performed in numerous international festivals in Europe and North America.
