Richard Troeger has worked with early keyboard instruments and their literature since the age of thirteen. His teachers have included Hugh McLean, Marie Zorn, Thomas Binkley, and Anthony Newman. He holds degrees in Performance and Musicology from Indiana University and completed his Doctorate in Early music there.

Dr Troeger performs on the harpsichord, clavichord, and fortepiano, and in two-harpsichord recitals with Paulette Grundeen. He has been heard as a performer and lecturer throughout North America, and has appeared on CBC Radio on a number of occasions, including several appearances on ARTS NATIONAL. He is the author of numerous articles on early performance practice, contributed the chapter on Dance to Anthony Newman's BACH AND THE BAROQUE (Pendragon) and has published a book on keyboard playing, TECHNIQUE AND INTERPRETATION ON THE HARPSICHORD AND CLAVICHORD (Indiana University Press, 1987). In preparation is a study of the French unmeasured harpsichord prelude, and a book on Baroque and Classical instrumental articulation (undertaken as a Canada Research Fellow). He was recently invited to write the articles on harpsichord and clavichord playing, among others, for the forthcoming GARLAND ENCYCLOPEDIA OF KEYBOARD INSTRUMENTS. Among his current projects are a recording of J.S. Bach's 6 Sonatas for Harpsichord and Violin with violinist John Lowry, several recordings on the clavichord of major keyboard works by Bach. and an article on the clavichords built by Arnold Dolmetsch at Chickering's (1906-10). He presently teaches at the University of Alberta and is harpsichordist for Musique Chantante.
