Canadian pianist Sylvia Shadick-Taylor enjoys a diverse musical life. She is comfortable as a soloist, chamber musician, accompanist and teacher.

As a soloist Sylvia has a strong interest in contemporary music. Premiering many Canadian and American works, she has performed in Canada and the United States, including her highly successful New York concert début in 1997.

As a chamber musician, Ms. Shadick-Taylor has performed with many ensembles. Recent performances include concerts in Canada, France, Japan, and a performance at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall in New York City with Hungarian/Canadian violinist Nándor Szederkényi. As an accompanist, she spans opera classics to demanding contemporary concert repertoire, her work often being heard on CBC Radio.

Sylvia lives in Edmonton and is a member of the music faculties at the University of Alberta and Alberta College. She works as a vocal coach, adjudicator and clinician and has worked for the Edmonton Opera, the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and Pro Coro Canada.

A graduate of the University of Alberta where she studied with Alexandra Munn, Sylvia has also enjoyed the musical influence of Sheila Shinkewski, Thomas Muraco, Menaheim Pressler, Edith Oppens and Gyorgy Sebok. Her early years were in Saskatchewan and were followed by studies in Banff, Aspen, New York and Salzburg.

Sylvia has recently released two CD's on the Arktos label: "Intimate Impressions" featuring the piano music of Frederic Mompou; and a 1994 release entitled "At Your Service" which focuses on the art of accompanying. She can also be heard on the CD's "Northern Arch" and "Soundland Alberta".
