Rural Economy in 2000: Moving Forward

The mission of the Department of Rural Economy of the University of Alberta is to pursue excellence in the discovery, application and dissemination of knowledge of economic, sociological, and business dimensions of agriculture, food, forestry and the environment. A related focus of Rural Economy's research mission is the pursuit of public involvement to ensure relevance and effectiveness in the discovery, application and dissemination of knowledge in our areas of focus.

Rural Economy was fortunate to continue to build on its academic and support staff resources in 2000, as was also the case in 1999. Towards the end of the year, Ellen Goddard was appointed to the Cooperative Chair in Agricultural Marketing and Business. Since then, Dr. Goddard has very actively revitalised the research and outreach programs of the Cooperative Chair program. Also appointed as a new faculty member late in 2000 was Desmond Ng, whose area of specialization is Agribusiness Management. Dr. Ng's academic training was at the University of British Columbia (BSc); McGill University (MSc); and the University of Illinois (PhD). The complement of faculty members that was achieved in 2000 is facilitated by a very able and dedicated group of support staff. Overall the ability of Rural Economy has been strengthened to contribute to the undergraduate programs of the Faculty of Agriculture, Forestry and Home Economics as well as to the Department's graduate programs. The Department's undergraduate courses are particularly important to the Faculty's BSc programs in Agriculture; Agriculture/Food Business Management; Environmental and Conservation Sciences; Forestry; and Forest Business Management.

A near-record number of new graduate students entered graduate programs in Rural Economy during the course of 2000. Similarly, some 17 students completed their graduate programs in that year. We are pleased that the very high quality of graduates is shown in the continuing pattern of thesis awards and the ability of our graduate students to move into good jobs. One of our MSc students, Cameron Taylor, was awarded the outstanding 2000 MSc thesis award by two different major professional associations, being selected for this honour by both the Canadian Agricultural Economics Society and the Western Agricultural Economics Society. His thesis research completed in the previous year, was co-supervised by Vic Adamowicz and Marty Luckert. As in previous years some staff and students had opportunities to engage in international programs of research and education during the course of the year, reflecting the Department's continuing involvement in international programs that contribute to teaching and research. Two further international projects were entered into in year 2000, as noted in the following pages.

The recent replacements and additions to staff resources well position Rural Economy to undertake an indepth review of the courses that are provided through this Department, at both the graduate and undergraduate levels. It is expected that this will be a major facet of strategic planning for 2001. Other issues that we expect to be of importance in 2001 are whether we should pursue a name change for the department so that the disciplinary focus of the graduate programs and research activities undertaken in the Department are more evident from its name. Currently the Department offers graduate degrees in Agriculture and Resource Economics; Forest Economics; and Rural Sociology. The current areas of research and teaching emphasis are: Resource, Environmental and Forest Economics; Agriculture and Agribusiness Economics and Management; and Rural/Resource Sociology. Two prospective alternative new names have been suggested. One of these is Agricultural and Resource Economics and Sociology. The second alternative suggested is Resource Economics and Sociology. We hope to receive feedback on this issue from friends of the Department.

The very active research programs engaged in by members of this department are illustrated by the information in this report which lists publications that were printed in the calendar year 2000 and notes the funded research projects that were held by faculty this year. Also illustrated in the following sections are the extensive communications and outreach activities of staff, in collaboration with graduate students, through presentations to professional and public groups. Research grants achieved by faculty members continue to be the most important means of funding graduate students' programs and research infrastructure. These resources have also been augmented by generous support from donors. Donations to the endowment and trust funds held by Rural Economy have supported the purchase of materials for Rural Economy's reading room; added to the opportunities for graduate students to participate in professional meetings; and provided for awards to both graduate and undergraduate students. We appreciate the generous support of our many friends and are always pleased to receive communications and visits from graduates and others interested in the mission and activities of the Department of Rural Economy.

A Major Academic Activity: Rural Economy Participation in Sustainable Forest Management - The Network of Centres of Excellence

The Sustainable Forest Management Network, one of Canada's 18 Networks of Centres of Excellence, is centred at the University of Alberta, but national in scope. This is a national research network focused on management of the boreal forest, involving university, industry and government collaboration in research. The Faculty of Agriculture, Forestry and Home Economics plays a major role in this NCE. Several faculty members are partners in the Network. Dr. Vic Adamowicz (Rural Economy) became Project Leader of the Network in late 1998. Dr. Terry Veeman (Economics/Rural Economy) is a co-theme leader of one of the three themes (Strategies and Institutions for Sustainable Forest Management). In addition several Rural Economy faculty members have graduate students funded through the network.

The Sustainable Forest Management NCE is core funded by two federal granting councils: The Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), in collaboration with Industry Canada. The Network is also supported by several industry partners, provincial governments, and First Nations partners. The Network's annual budget for research and networking is now over \$5 million. The Network has been extended to the year 2002.

The Network examines new approaches to forest management that can maintain the nation's forest based-economy while not compromising biodiversity and ecological goals. The Network has three theme or legacy areas: Ecological Basis of Sustainability, Strategies and Institutions for SFM, and Minimum Impact Technologies. The theme areas interact to provide linkages between ecology, forest practices, processing and pollution control technology and social and economic development that are necessary to develop new approaches to forestry and new forest policies.

International Projects

Agroforestry Southern Africa Project is a five year project (M. Luckert, U of A Director), funded by the Canadian International Development Agency, that will continue into 2001. It has provided for a continuation of many collaborative activities of Rural Economy and the University of Zimbabwe that were initiated through the earlier Value of Trees Project. In July 2000, the University of Zimbabwe directors of this project visited Rural Economy to plan future follow activities. A series of educational and research publications associated with the project were completed during the year. Godfrey Kundhlande, whose studies had been supported by this project, completed his PhD studies and returned to take up an academic position in Southern Africa. Graduate studies of another three Zimbabwe students continued to be supported under this program in Rural Economy in 2000. These are Chris Zindi, Sibongile Moyo and Lorraine Dzuda.

Two further international projects of Rural Economy began in 2000. One of these, funded by IDRC, is the *Community Land Management* (Zimbabwe) project which commenced in late 2000. This will provide for research in how communal property rights affect land management in Zimbabwe by the University of Zimbabwe and the University of Alberta, (through Rural Economy). The project will provide funding for three PhD students, one of whom will be based at the University of Alberta. Also approved in 2000 was a three-year linkage agreement between Rural Economy and the International Centre for Research on Agroforestry, (ICRAF). ICRAF is based in Kenya and is one of the Consultative Group of International Agricultural Research Centres.). The title and focus of this project is *Valuation of Environmental Services of Agroforestry Systems*.

Rural Economy Facilities

The Rural Economy Reading Room continues to be a valuable resource for the department and is well-used by students. The scope of the collection has expanded in the last few years beyond the traditional areas of agricultural economics, forest economics and rural sociology to include agroforestry, environmental economics, and resource sociology.

The Rural Economy Graduate Computing Laboratory is a 10 work station research facility that focuses on specialized software used in the disciplines of Agricultural and Resource Economics, Forest Economics and Rural Sociology. Competitive capital funding is being sought to expand the scope and capacity of this facility in the subsequent year.
