

About the Social Research Directory

In 1989, the Edmonton Social Planning Council published the *Social Research Directory*. This guide was created to provide information about library collections of use to social researchers. While the ESPC hoped to update the *Directory* biannually, no further editions have appeared. We believe that this is a valuable resource for the social research community, and we have resurrected this publication for researchers in 2010.

Libraries and resource centres are included in this directory based on the following criteria:

- 1. The library or resource centre collects information about the individuals and groups that make up society, their welfare, and their interactions.
- 2. The public has access to the collection, even if material does not circulate or hours and service are limited.
- 3. The collection is located in Edmonton.

While many libraries and resource centres are included in this directory, **it is not exhaustive**. The directory depends on information submitted by eligible collections. If you are aware of a collection that should be included in this directory but has been missed, please contact library@edmontonsocialplanning.ca.

Collection strengths include the many subject areas related to the field of education. Special collections include the currently authorized resources (textbooks, etc.) for schools in the Province of Alberta, published government documents from the departments of Alberta Education and Alberta Advanced Education and Technology and their predecessors, education-related annual reports from 1901 to the present, and Alberta post-secondary calendars.

Collection Description	The Legislature Library was established in 1906 to serve as the parliamentary library for Members of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta. To assist in responding to Members' information needs, the Library has materials in a wide range of subject areas including public policy, law, government, education, science and technology, business, energy, economics, and the environment. Largest collection of weekly Alberta newspapers and a large Alberta local history collection.
	The Alberta Legislature Library does not have any case law.

Collection Description	The City of Edmonton Archives is mandated to collect the records created by the Corporation of the City of Edmonton which have historical significance. We have Council Minutes and Reports and departmental records dating from 1892. The Archives also collects materials from private donors relating to the history of Edmonton and Edmontonians, their businesses and organizations. Some of these private records may contain the papers of Councillors and Mayors. Some social service organizations have deposited their records with the City Archives.
	There are some notable gaps in the private manuscript side of the collections, especially in the areas of records of new immigrants and visible minorities, First Nations and small, not-for-profit organizations. We welcome inquiries from anyone who has access to those collections and is considering donating such materials.

Reference Services	Researchers may submit general research queries to the reference archivist by email or telephone, in advance of their visits, to determine the strength of the collections around their subject of interest. A Reference Archivist is available to assist with inquiries, and to
	give orientation to the archives and the finding aids. Visitors are expected to do their own research with the materials provided.

Membership and The City of Edmonton Archives is open to the public on **Circulation Policies** weekdays and materials may be consulted on-site in the reference room. None of the materials circulate. Photocopies and Microfilm reader/printers are available for city records and local **Computers Available** newspapers which have been microfilmed. 	The <i>Professional Collection</i> is a modest collection of materials that support the ongoing professional development and program activities of the staff of the Legal Resource Centre who include lawyers, librarians, IT staff, and educators.	
	Because a large proportion of this collection is historical, users should be careful to check the dates to determine if the material is relevant to their needs. The historical pamphlet collection is kept off-site and only accessible by special arrangement.

Collection Description	The Humanities and Social Sciences Library (HSS) is located in the Rutherford Library and contains collections numbering about 2 million volumes including monographs, current and bound periodicals, and government documents that cover a comprehensive range of subjects in the arts, humanities and social sciences. We also offer a very large collection of materials in microformats and a significant collection of Canadian and foreign newspapers. Access to a large and growing collection of databases, electronic books, electronic journals, and statistical sources is provided through the online catalog. Older HSS research resources are housed off-site at the Book and Record Depository (BARD) and are retrieved by placing requests using the online catalog.

There are over 1,200 spaces for individual and group study that includes a large Reading Room in Rutherford South, two computer labs for instruction, and 77 productivity workstations throughout the library.
