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The University of Alberta Press contributes to intellectual and cultural life by publishing in the areas of biography, history, First Nations history and languages, literature, natural history, regional interest, travel narratives and reference books.

The creation and dissemination of knowledge for the public good is integral to the publicly funded Canadian university research sector, and the social and cultural impacts of such publication can be significant.





Fair Dealing Guidelines

- Announced in 2012
- Adopted by all public schools, some independent schools, and numerous post-secondary institutions
- Authorize the copying of portions of works to the same extent as was permitted under collective licences offered by Access Copyright, English Canada's copyright collective.
