The University of Alberta Concert Choir

Founded in 1970, the University of Alberta Concert Choir is a large ensemble of 60 to 70 singers each year. Under the direction of Debra Cairns (on leave this year) and interim conductor Joy Berg, the choir studies and performs a variety of sacred and secular repertoire ranging from madrigals, partsongs and spirituals, to large works with orchestra.

Over the years the Concert Choir has established a strong tradition of choral singing. The choir performs regularly and in recent years has appeared with the Edmonton Symphony Orchesta and the Madrigal Singers in perfomances of works such as Mozart's Requiem, Pulenc's Gloria, and Walton's Te Deum, the latter of which was broadcast noationally by CBC. The Concert Choir has also performed at the Alberta Music conference and Northern Regional Choralfest, and was a finalist (Large Choir category) in the 1994 CBC Choral Competition of Amateur Choirs.

Joy Berg, Interim Conductor of the Concert Choir, was born in Saskatchewan, and has lived throughout the western Canadian provinces. She has received her Bachelor of Music in piano performance (University of Saskatchewan), Masters of Music in Choral Conducting (University of Alberta), and is a candidate for the Doctorate of Music in Choral Conducting (University of Iowa). She has taught in the public school system (Edmonton) as well as at Augustana University College (Camrose). Ms. Berg is in demand as a clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor in both the vocal and choral areas, and enjoys piano accompanying whenever she can. Joy has sung alto with ProCoro Canada as well as several University chamber choirs, and presently conducts Edmonton's "I Coristi" and accompanies the new Edmonton chamber group "Cantilena Consort".
