Includes: diagnosis of condition and evaluation of need for specialized group treatment or alternative service; psychiatric consultation and service; psychological service including testing; medical care, group work; casework service to child and family; remedial education; a high degree of supervision of small groups; a controlled environment geared to individual needs of the disturbed child 24 hours a day. A program of after-care or follow-up service.

Includes: providing directly or by purchase, physical care required, as shelter, food, necessary medical and clothing needs, and counselling, which may include referral to other community agencies.
