### **University of Alberta Concert Choir**

Founded in 1970, the University of Alberta Concert Choir is a large ensemble of approximately 50 singers from a variety of faculties across the University. Membership in the choir is open to students across campus through auditions held at the beginning of each year. Singers come from such diverse disciplines as business, sciences, education and the arts, as well as music itself.

A wide variety of sacred and secular choral masterpieces are studied each year, ranging from motets, part songs and spirituals, to large works with orchestra. The University of Alberta Concert Choir has appeared with the Edmonton Symphon y Orchestra, has performed at the Alberta Music Conference, been heard on national broadcast of the CBC, and been regular national semi-finalists in the CBC Amateur Choir Competition.

Tours form an important part of the education and experience of these young singers. Over the 38-year history of the choir, travels have taken the ensemble to Europe, China and the United States. In recent years the choir has traveled to the east coast of Canada, southwestern Ontario, Vancouver Island, various parts of Alberta, Iceland, and most recently to Vancouver in 2014.

**Dr. Rob Curtis** has conducted the University of Alberta Concert Choir since 2011, during which time the choir has undertaken a number of exciting projects including a tour to Vancouver in 2014, as well as joint performances with other ensembles and soloists within the Department. He received a Faculty of Arts Graduate Teaching Award in 2014 for his work with the choir, and during his time with the choir it has enjoyed an increase in membership while cultivating a refined and energetic sound in its eclectic concert programs. Rob also conducts i Coristi Chamber Choir, one of Edmonton's foremost amateur choral ensembles, and has appeared as a chorister and soloist with a number of ensembles including Pro Coro Canada. He is an active teacher, church musician, clinician and academic, most recently having published an article on the topic of Canadian composer Malcolm Forsyth's choral works.

#### **University of Alberta Madrigal Singers**

Comprising 30 to 40 auditioned singers from across campus under the direction of Dr. Leonard Ratzlaff, the University of Alberta Madrigal Singers have emerged in the past three and a half decades as one of the foremost university chamber choirs in Canada. Frequent first-prize winners in the CBC's Choral Competition for Amateur Choirs, the Madrigal Singers have also had several successes at major international competitions in Germany, including first prize at the Robert Schumann International Choral Competition in Zwickau (1995), third prize in the 5th International Chamber Choir Competition in Marktoberdorf (1997), first prize in the International Choir Competition in Cork, Ireland (1999), and the International Jury Award at this same competition in 2008. They have produced 5 CD recordings, 2 of which (*Balulalow*, 1999, and *The Passing of the Year*, 2004) won Choral Canada's National Choral Award for recordings). They are frequent collaborators with the Alberta Baroque Ensemble, the Edmonton Symphony and Pro Coro Canada.

**Dr. Leonard Ratzlaff** has been a member of the University of Alberta Department of Music faculty since 1981. Dr. Ratzlaff obtained his graduate degrees in choral conducting from University of Iowa. His duties at University of Alberta include supervising the graduate program in choral conducting and directing the Madrigal Singers, a group that has distinguished itself in several national and international competitions, as well as in six CD recordings. In addition to his work with the Madrigal Singers, he directs the Richard Eaton Singers, Edmonton's symphonic chorus. He has premiered new works by Canadian composers Violet Archer, Allan Bevan, Jeff Enns, John Estacio, Alfred Fisher, Malcolm Forsyth, Allan Gilliland, Christos Hatzis, Ruth Watson Henderson, Imant Raminsh and Mark Sirett. Honours include induction into the Alberta Order of Excellence and the Order of Canada, and he is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.
