



Assistant principal flutist with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra for many years, **Shelley Younge** has also performed with the Banff Festival Orchestra, the Banff Opera and Ballet Orchestras, the Edmonton Chamber Players Orchestra, Pro Coro Canada, and the Alberta Baroque Ensemble.

A graduate of Indiana University, Ms Younge has also performed as a soloist with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, Saskatoon Symphony, and the Alberta Baroque Ensemble, as well as appearing with such notable musicians as Lois Marshal, and celtic harpist Mary O'Hara.

She maintains a healthy chamber music and recital career, performing frequently for CBC broadcast in Edmonton and around Alberta.

Ms Younge's long time teaching career has produced many professional flutists who are working around the world. She has taught at the Banff International Music Centre, as well as Music Camrose, and has recently been appointed to the position of Francis Winspear Visiting Professor at the University of Alberta.

Sylvia Shadick-Taylor is comfortable as a soloist, chamber musician, accompanist and teacher. She received a Bachelor of Music Degree from the University of Alberta and then continued her studies privately in New York. Sylvia has performed in Canada, Japan, France, Germany, and the United States, including Carnegie Hall, New York. Her work is often heard on CBC Radio. Sylvia has also released two compact discs on the Arktos label: "Intimate Impressions: Piano Music of Frederic Mompou" and "At Your Service". Originally from Saskatoon, she is now on faculty at the University of Alberta and works as a vocal coach, adjudicator and clinician.
