PROGRAM NOTES

Tonight's program features two musical entertainments, which appeared exactly 201 years ago, on February 7, 1786, when Austrian Emperor Joseph II entertained the visiting Governor General of the Netherlands and his wife, the Archduchess Christine, at the Schoenbrunn Palace in Vienna.

The two commissioned farces were composed by Antonio Salieri (1750-1825), a court favorite with much prestige and official position as the composer and Kapellmeister to the Imperial Majesty, and a somewhat younger musical upstart from the provinces, name of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791), who had recently pleased the Viennese and the Emperor with a very successful German Singspiel - 'The Abduction from the Seraglio'. Salieri's work - 'a divertimento teatrale' was in Italian, Mozart's - a comedy with music - was in German, with spoken text and only 4 musical numbers, and an overture.

Both works deal with theatre life and poke fun at the manners and morals of the people who put on, sponsor, create or otherwise get involved with 'showbusiness'. Considering the princely audience, the tone and the form of the satire is surprisingly earthy and boisterous.

It is recorded in history that the Salieri work was the short term favorite with the audiences (public performances in regular theatres followed), but Mozart's "Der Schauspiel-Direktor' lasted longer. It disappeared after 1830's but later, in various disguises, came back and was translated in French, Swedish, Czech, English, etc.

Our production of both works is in English, because the words, in spite of 'Prima la musica', are essential to the entertainment.
