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ALBERTA TARIFF REDUCTION AND ELIMINATION PRIORITIES, 2002

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INTRODUCTION

This study is based on Alberta's export data from January to December of 2001. The purpose of the study is to provide a document that lists Alberta's top exports and the bound tariff barriers that are faced in these export destinations. The report is intended to assist in the identification of current and potential foreign markets deserving tariff reduction / elimination efforts. This report will serve as a guide in identifying which products and markets should be prioritized in the Doha Round of trade negotiations currently underway at the World Trade Organization (WTO) and in future bilateral, regional or multilateral trade negotiations.

The analysis is focused on those countries with which Canada does not have a Free Trade Agreement (FTA). For this purpose Chile, Costa Rica, Israel, Mexico and the United States are not included in the study.

FORMAT

The products are classified according to the Harmonized Tariff Coding System (HS Codes). The report is divided into an Agricultural Section and a Non-Agricultural Section with further division by HS 2-digit Chapters. Product description is at the 6-digit level in the HS coding system. The threshold used for the study is CAD \$500,000 in total shipment value to any non-FTA country at the 6-digit level.

Tariff information has been taken from the World Trade Atlas database, and uses product descriptions contained therein. Full descriptions for HS product codes are available from the "Customs Tariff" document available on the Canadian Customs and Revenue Agency website, at www.ccr-aadrc.gc.ca

In each Chapter three items are shown:

- 1. Summary Tables of Bound Tariffs and Export Values for 2001:**
These tables provide detailed information about selected products in each HS Chapter or group of similar Chapters. Included in the table is the total value exported to the selected countries and the relevant bound tariffs.
- 2. Historical Export Values by Product:** These tables summarize the total export values of selected products for the 1996 to 2001 period. The total values shown represent shipments to all non-FTA countries and are intended to illustrate trends in the level of exports to non-FTA markets.
- 3. Comparison of Alberta's Exports in 2001 to non-FTA and FTA Countries** These charts provide a graphical comparison of the total volume of exports between non-FTA and FTA countries for the selected products.

SUMMARY TABLES OF BOUND TARIFFS AND EXPORT VALUES

Bound tariffs are the maximum tariffs that countries can impose as a result of concessions made during free trade negotiations—in this case, the Uruguay Round of WTO multilateral negotiations in 1996. It is these “Bound Rates” that are the focus of this study as they will be up for re-negotiation during the WTO Doha Rounds. When bound tariffs are phased in over a period of time the final bound tariff rate is the one that has been reported.

The reporting of bound rates is limited to WTO member countries. Many non-WTO members received significant levels of exports from Alberta in 2001 and these countries are included in the study. For non-WTO countries and countries where tariff information was unavailable the bound rate has been reported as “n.a.”.

Previous Tariff Elimination studies (Volpi, 2001) reported tariff information from Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) member countries as published on the APEC website. This database provides applied tariff information. Applied tariffs are the actual tariffs that are in place for a specific product. These tariffs can be lower than the bound rate but are also more flexible and can be changed at any time provided they remain below the bound rate. For the purposes of this study the APEC information is not utilized except where WTO bound rate information is not available.

China and Taiwan have just recently joined the WTO and as a result their information is not part of the results of the Uruguay Round. Tariff information for China and Taiwan has been obtained from various European Union and WTO websites. Members of the European Community are simply grouped as “EU 15”. EU countries are: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom.

Where bound rate information was provided at the 8 or 10-digit level, rather than the 6-digit level reported, the tariff range was provided.

SUMMARY FINDINGS

Alberta’s exports for the January to December 2001 period amounted to more than \$57.5 billion, up from \$55.8 billion in 2000. The United States remains the primary destination for Alberta products and accounts for more than 88% of export values. Non-FTA nations as a whole accounted for nearly \$5.9 billion in exports over the 2001 period, down from nearly \$6.2 billion in 2000. In general terms, the Top-10 non-FTA destinations for Alberta products over the 2001 period are: Japan, EU 15, China, South Korea, Taiwan, Iran, Venezuela, Hong Kong, Brazil, and Indonesia. The top 3 non-FTA countries (Japan, EU 15, and China) together represent 54% of the exports to non-FTA countries.





Asia continues to be the primary non-FTA destination for Alberta beef, with Japan, South Korea, and Taiwan being the most important non-FTA countries for frozen and fresh cuts of beef exports. Europe has also played a small role in the area of fresh cuts. Overall, the volume of frozen beef products (with bone and boneless) exported to non-FTA countries decreased in value than \$30 million in 2001. The volume of fresh beef exported to the U.S; however, far exceeds the volumes being shipped to other destinations.

Japan is the primary importer of both frozen and fresh Alberta pork. Europe remains the primary importer of horsemeat, with Japan and Switzerland importing a smaller amount of this product. The bound tariffs on both pork and horsemeat are not as restrictive as those imposed on beef. Pork exports increased by more than \$36 million in 2001.


Asia, and in particular, Japan, is a main non-FTA destination for several types of edible animal offal. A number of other countries, such as Cuba, Peru, and Venezuela are also importers of this product. The tariffs imposed by these countries are typically high and may deserve consideration for reduction efforts.

Cuba remains a primary destination for poultry meat where the bound tariffs remain high. Japan is the primary destination for pig and poultry fat and exports for this product continue to rise.







South East Asia and Europe were the primary destinations for exports of Alberta peas in 2001. The bound rates imposed by India, Bangladesh, and Pakistan are 100%, 200%, and 100% respectively. India and Bangladesh imported \$25.8 million and \$20.6 million in peas in 2001. Alternatively, Europe imported \$10.4 million in peas and has a 0% bound rate.

Columbia imposes a tariff of 178% on red beans (HS 071332), and is the largest importer of this product, with a value of \$2.087 million in 2001. India, the largest importer of lentils, imposes a tariff of 100% on this product. Lentil exports continued to grow in value in 2001.

The majority of exports for both peas and lentils were to non-FTA countries.



Wheat continues to be a very important exported product for Alberta and it is exported all over the world, including the regions of Asia, Latin America, Africa, and Europe. Exports of durum wheat; meslin, non-durum wheat; and barley to non-FTA countries recovered slightly in 2001.

Tariffs on the Chapter 10 products vary greatly across nations, from a low of 0% to a high of 200% for those countries captured by the 2002 tariff study. A considerable number of all the Chapter 10 products were exported to non-FTA countries.



Malt is the most important export product within the Chapter 11 products with \$129 million being exported in 2001, \$95 million of which went to non-FTA nations. Japan, South Korea, and South Africa were the most important destinations of non-FTA nations. Malt exports to non-FTA nations rose approximately \$29 million in 2001.




Canola or Rape seed (HS 120500) is the most important product in this Chapter. Japan and China are the primary importers of canola, and exports to these countries increased by over \$39 million from last year. Japan, South Korea, and Taiwan are the main destinations for exports of forage products and these values increased considerably over last year.



Canola oils (HS 151490) are the most important export product in Alberta for Chapter 15. Exports to non-FTA countries decreased by \$29 million in 2001 and are significantly lower than 1998 levels. FTA countries account for the majority of exports for canola oils.


















Low-density polyethylene (HS #390110) is an important type of plastic exported by Alberta to a number of nations throughout the world. The main non-FTA importer of the product is China; however FTA nations represent more than half the value shipped abroad. Non-FTA nations accounted for \$76 million in imports of this product in 2001. The bound rates vary considerably across countries with China having a bound rate of 6.5%.

Exports in low-density polyethylene decreased substantially in 2001, from approximately \$197 million in 2000 to \$76 million in 2001.
























Machinery and parts exports were composed of a variety of products, typically exported in small volumes to many different countries. Europe, China, and Russia were three of the main importers of these products. Tariffs vary by country and by product, although some countries, such as Venezuela, had high bound tariffs for a number of product categories.

The Ministerial Declaration on Trade in Information Technology Products (ITA) was concluded in Singapore in December 1996. Over 40 countries and the EU have committed to reducing tariffs to zero on certain information technology products by January 2000. These products are primarily found in HS Chapters 84, 85 and 90. The bound rates for such products have been adjusted to reflect this agreement.

Additionally, there are some products that might fall under the ITA, although this can be difficult to ascertain at the HS 6-digit level. Since there is significant natural resource extraction and refinement capacity in Alberta, but no semiconductor production capacity, it is reasonable to assume that much of the machinery and equipment exported under these later categories is for the purpose of oil and gas production, and not information technology production. Within this Chapter, the

study has included four such products that may fall under the ITA: 841989, 841990, 847989 and 847990. Further breakdown of these products to the HS 8-digit level does not provide any definitive answers as to the exact nature of the exports and whether they fall under the ITA or not. As a result, the bound rates for these products have not been reduced to zero as they would be if the products did, in fact, fall under the ITA.

Figure 29. Alberta's Total Chapter 84 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001 Selected Products





Figure 29. Alberta's Total Chapter 84 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001 Selected Products (continued)





Figure 29. Alberta's Total Chapter 84 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001 Selected Products (continued)







Figure 29. Alberta's Total Chapter 84 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001 Selected Products (continue)

Figure 30. Alberta's Total Chapter 85 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001 Selected Products








Figure 30. Alberta's Total Chapter 85 Export Values to Non-FTA and FTA Countries in 2001




