# **Program Notes**

The Ceremony of Carols was completed in 1942. It was originally written for treble voices with harp but was later arranged by Julius Harrison for S.A.T.B. with harp. The work is based on medieval and Renaissance carols. Britten's setting expands upon these melodies yet preserves the ancient carols through predominantly canonic writing. The ceremony begins and ends with the medieval carol *Hodie* and is tied together by the interlude for solo harp. The overall character is quite stark and beautiful.

Norman Luboff spent his life in the U.S. as an arranger and performer of folk and popular music. The *African Mass* is based on some elements of African folk music including rich parallel moving chords, soaring solo lines and a strong rhythmic underpining. It was written in 1964.

Sven Lekberg's *Four Carols for a Holy Night* expresses the emotions of joy, awe, humility and gratefulness that are a part of the Christmas season. Written in 1969, the rich, chromatic harmonies are often reminiscent of barber-shop quartet style.

Willi Zwozdesky has an active career as choral arranger and conductor. He received undergraduate training here at the University of Alberta in music theory and is currently based in Vancouver. The melodic theme for this Christmas arrangement is the 15th-century tune *This Endris Night*. This piece was commissioned by Jon Washburn and the Vancouver Chamber Choir in 1992.

Diane Loomer is another prominent name in Canadian choral music. Most of her time is spent as a conductor and clinician. She is cofounder and co-conductor of the Elektra Women's Choir from Vancouver and has won several awards with this group. Loomer has also received many commissions to compose and arrange choral music. Like Zwozdesky's arrangement, *Yule-tide Fires* (1992) expands upon a single melody and was written for the Vancouver Chamber Choir.

The final piece on the program is a fun arrangement of *Deck the Halls*. James McKelvy is an arranger and editor of choral music and was the conductor of the University of California, Berkeley Glee Club and Treble Clef. In this arrangement, the 7/8 meter creates an exciting and driving rhythmic pulse.
