William Street, saxophonist

The winner of many awards including the Certificat d'Aptitude de Saxophone, France's highest recognition of excellence in music performance and pedagogy, William Street has earned worldwide respect as one of North America's finest instrumentalists. He holds degrees from Northwestern University, the Conservatoire National de Bordeaux, France and the Catholic University of America. His teachers have included George Etheridge, Frederick L. Hemke, Jean-Marie Londeix, Frederick Ockwell and John P. Paynter. Dr Street, a member of the Bro-Street Duo and the Ensemble International de Saxophones de Bordeaux, was also a member of the Chicago, Washington, D.C. and Frederick Hemke Saxophone Quartets prior to joining the University of Alberta Department of Music in 1988, where he teaches as Director of the University Concert Band, saxophone instructor, and chamber music coach.

He has appeared as recitalist, conductor and soloist with orchestras and bands throughout Europe, Central and North America and Asia, including the Milwaukee and Edmonton symphonies, the Orchestra Filharmonica Marchigiani (Italy) and the Orchestra de Camara del Nuevo Mundo (Mexico). Bill can be heard on compact disc recordings Sunthesis: Les Septs Iles (OM6901, Paris), L'Ensemble International de Saxophones (ACD0086, Tokyo), At Your Service - Légende by Florent Schmitt (Arktos 94005) with pianist Sylvia Taylor and the Centaur recording of Evolution V for five saxophonists by Marilyn Shrude, recorded with the Chicago Saxophone Quartet. His recent compact disc recording of Tre Vie, Concerto for Saxophone and Orchestra by Malcolm Forsyth with Grzegorz Nowak and the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra was nominated for a 1999 Juno award. He has also recorded héliosaxo (Arktos - SRI- CD97018), a compact disc recording of twentieth century music for saxophone and piano with pianist Roger Admiral, featuring the music of composers Harbison, Karlins, Lauba, d'Indy, Rolin, Houkom. His recitals and concerts are frequently broadcast on programs of the CBC radio stations.

Bill served as President of the North American Saxophone Alliance (NASA) from 1992-1994 and has represented Canada at music conferences in France, Japan, Italy, the Russian Federation, Spain and the United States. He is the former Secretary of the World Saxophone Congress International Committee, and was instrumental in preparation for the XI World Congress held in Spain in October 1997. He has written articles and reviews published in the NASA Journal as well as the Bulletin de l'Association des Saxophonistes de France (ASAFRA) and is listed in the new English publication The Saxophone by Richard Ingham as "one of North America's leading proponents of new music". Bill served as a member of the adjudication panel for the 1999 Glazounov International Saxophone Competition in Moscow and the 1998 North American Saxophone Alliance International Classical Saxophone Competition in Chicago. His published

work includes the English translation of Hello! Mr. Sax, ou les Parametres du Saxophone (Leduc) by Jean-Marie Londeix, Elise Boyer Hall, and The Life of Elise Boyer Hall in Les États Généraux Mondiaux du Saxophone. He and Anna Street recently translated into English the Méthode d'Etude de Saxophone, by Jean-Marie Londeix published by Éditions Henry Lemoine in Paris.

Pianist Roger Admiral was born in Dogsnest, Ontario. His main teachers include Virginia Blaha, Peter Smith and Helmut Brauss. After undergraduate studies at the University of Western Ontario he came to Edmonton in 1988 and completed the Doctor of Music degree at the University of Alberta in 1998. He has participated in piano masterclasses of Cecile Ousset, Paul Badura-Skoda, Boris Berman and Claude Helffer. In 1990 and 1993 he was awarded Johann Strauss Foundation Scholarships for Lied-duo study at the Mozarteum in Salzburg.

From 1990 to 1993 Roger was a member of the Hammerhead Consort. During this time the Consort was awarded the 1992 Sir Ernest MacMillan Memorial Award and a First Prize in the 1991 CIBC National Music Competition. Currently he is part of the Kovalis Duo with Montreal percussionist Philip Hornsey. This duo will tour 10 Canadian cities in January of 2000.

Since coming to Edmonton Roger has introduced local audiences to the music of many prominent modernist European composers such as Pierre Boulez, Karlheinz Stockhausen, Luciano Berio, Luigi Nono, Iannis Xenakis, André Boucourechliev, Bernd Alois Zimmermann, Helmut Lachenmann, Brian Ferneyhough, György Kurtág and Tristan Murail. He also has collaborated regularly in concerts with Edmonton musicians Kathleen Corcoran, Allison Storochuk and William Street and with I Coristi, Alberta College Percussion Ensemble and Saint Crispin's Chamber Ensemble.
