Scenes from The Old Maid and the Thief

Scene I

In the opening scene of the opera, two embittered old maids, Miss Todd and her nosey neighbour Miss Pinkerton talk about what might have been, and their sorry state in life, when a handsome, young beggar comes to the back door. The young maid, Laetitia, and Miss Todd quickly usher a reluctant and befuddled Miss Pinkerton out the front door and eagerly greet the mysterious stranger in from the back door.

Scene II

Early the next morning Bob, the beggar, sleepily enters to the amorous and awestruck gaze of Miss Todd and Laetitia.

Scene III, IV and V

Some weeks later, Laetitia, and Miss Todd have fallen in love with Bob, the handsome young "thief", who is still holed up at Miss Todd's home. As this scene opens Laetitia sings of her unrequited love for him. Immediately thereafter, Miss Pinkerton bursts through the door with more alarming news about the thief who has been robbing and harassing the town. Only Miss Tod and Laetitia know who the real thief is—themselves, who, in an effort to keep Bob from leaving have been supplying him with stolen liquor, food and clothes. But Bob, having grown tired of being cooped up and longing for the fresh air of summer, packs his bag in preparation for leaving to go back to the life of a beggar.
