Rural Economy in 2004: Taking Stock and Planning for the Future

The mission of the Department of Rural Economy of the University of Alberta is to pursue excellence in the discovery, application and dissemination of knowledge of economic, sociological and business dimensions of agriculture, food, forestry and the environment. A related focus of Rural Economy's research mission is the pursuit of public involvement to ensure relevance and effectiveness in the discovery, application and dissemination of knowledge in our areas of focus.

Rural Economy's Annual Report provides a wealth of information of the many activities, achievements and events during the preceding year. Our report includes a listing of our staff members and their major areas of teaching, research and other responsibilities. An account of the research output of the staff of the Department is given by the listing of their publications and research grants. Our Annual Report is our most comprehensive means for us to communicate with our valued friends, within and outside the University of Alberta, about some of our achievements and plans. Other information on Departmental activities, including graduate programs, courses and course descriptions, is available on our webpage (www.re.ualberta.ca) and through our regular newsletters. If you would like more information on any activities or to be put on a mailing list for newsletters or seminar notices, please don't hesitate to contact us. Full contact details are on our recently upgraded web site. Rural Economy had many significant achievements in 2004.

We had the pleasure of hiring a new staff member, Bodo Steiner, who will complement the existing pursuits of staff in the Department through his interest in contracting throughout the food chain and in the wine industry. Various staff and students won awards through a variety of venues. Vic Adamowicz was selected as the first economist to receive the Canadian Institute of Forestry's Canadian Forestry Scientific Achievement Award. Peter Boxall, Kevin Chen, Jim Unterschultz and Scott Jeffrey were chosen to be the Co-editors of the Canadian Journal of Agricultural Economics. Of significant note is the success of one of our PhD students (Kenneth Caine) in winning a Pierre Elliott Trudeau Foundation Doctoral Scholarship, the largest social science graduate research award in the country. The above highlights only some of our activities and I encourage you to read the entire report to get the complete picture.

Our faculty continue to be very successful in competitive research grant opportunities. A team of researchers from across Canada was selected for a national research network funded by Agriculture Canada in the area of Consumer and Market Demand. This network is hosted by the Department of Rural

Economy, largely because of the strength in consumer analysis found in the Department. An additional national network in Farm Level Policy funded by Agriculture Canada will also be hosted within the Department under the leadership of Jim Unterschultz. Researchers were also successful in obtaining funding from a variety of national and provincial sources to examine everything from air quality, carbon credit trading, CLA enriched milk products, consumer acceptance of alternative meats, the role of states and society in forest governance, forest tenure and attitudes towards biotechnology. These projects, as well as others, reflect our response to the pressing needs for research in agriculture, food, forest and environment from both sociology and economics perspectives.

Continuing enhancements to the collections held within the Eric Berg Reading Room and to the Research Computing Lab provide enrichments to the teaching and research programs of staff and students within our Department. Both of these facilities have benefited from the success of staff in obtaining competitive grants and from the generous donations of many friends to the Department.

We were saddened by the passing of Professor Emeritus Len Bauer, a friend and valued member of our community. Len was honoured with the Wilson Loree Award for the Development of Excellence in Farm Business Management in May 2004. His Len Bauer Bar None Scholarship continues to grow and will be sufficient to provide a significant financial amount for agricultural and food business students in perpetuity. Donations continue to be received, reflecting the esteem in which Len was held.

I wish to take the opportunity to thank the many individuals who have contributed to the achievements of the Department this year. These include staff, both academic and support, colleagues across North America who contribute to collaborative research programs and to providing input on staff promotion, evaluation and nomination for awards, and our many contributors from government and industry within Alberta who provide input on Advisory committees (e.g. Cooperative Chair in Agricultural Marketing and Business) and research and teaching collaborations.

Overview of the Cooperative Program in Agricultural Marketing and Business

The Cooperative Program in Agricultural Marketing and Business was created by industry funding in the late 1980's. The broad purposes of the program are to conduct research, extension and teaching in the areas of agricultural marketing and business. The focus is on issues related to group activities whether these be for cooperatives or other organizations.

The program funding is largely used to fund graduate student research. Currently there are four Masters students and one PhD student funded through the program. Their research topics vary from: Principal-Agent Problems and Capital Constraints in Canadian Agribusiness; Supply and Marketing Cooperatives; to Factors Affecting the Demand for Beef in Canada.

Students working in the cooperative program were well represented in various national and international professional meetings throughout the year.

The program also encourages various extension activities. This year the highlight of the program was the Annual Symposium. Symposium 2004 "Reducing Risk, Protecting People: Implications for Health, Food, and Agribusiness" was held on June 2, 2004 at the University of Alberta. Risks are inherent in the agriculture/food industry. Historically, risks centered around weather and markets. In more recent times the industry is facing newer risks from resource availability to changes in consumer preferences, to disease and health issues. Symposium 2004 provided us with an opportunity to examine risk in the context of the overall industry and in individual farm or firm management. Invited speakers from the U.S. included Brian Roe (Ohio State University) who spoke on U.S. consumer's concerns about food production and processing technologies and Tim Richards (Arizona State University) who spoke on risk management in the context of financial performance of co-operatives and on recent mergers and acquisitions in the U.S. co-operative sector, Rural Economy professors spoke on a variety of topics; Vic Adamowicz spoke on consumers concerns about drinking water quality, Michele Veeman spoke on consumers concerns about GM food and Jim Unterschultz spoke on farm level risk management. Cindy Jardine, an AHFMR scholar in the Department of Human Ecology spoke on roles and responsibilities in risk communication. Graduate student research in the Department of Rural Economy was highlighted through the presence of 20 research posters. The symposium was well-attended with approximately 100 people in attendance.

Rural Economy Facilities

The Rural Economy Reading Room continues to be a valuable resource for the department and is well-used by students. The scope of the collection includes, in addition to the traditional areas of agricultural and resource economics, forest economics and rural sociology, related material on

agroforestry, environmental economics, and resource sociology.

The Rural Economy Graduate Computing Laboratory was expanded in 2003 to a 13 work station research facility. There are three types of workstations in the computing lab, designed for different types of work.

The most sophisticated machines in the lab are designed for computationally intensive operations such as number crunching with large data sets. These machines are dual processor, dual monitor machines with lots of memory and large hard disk drives. This allows students to work with very large data sets in an efficient manner without taxing network bandwidth. There are four of these in the lab. These machines also have the linux operating system installed for use by students who may need development tools and other packages that windows does not provide.

The next class of machines in the lab are high end workstations that are suitable for graphics manipulation and medium duty number crunching. They are single processor machines with a single monitor and large hard drives. There are five of these machines.
