Canadian First World War Poetry Monographs, 1914-1918: A Bibliography

Overview

Purpose: to provide a resource to researchers interested in Canadian First World War poetry

Design: searches were carried out in NEOS and WorldCat catalogues, and in Canadian poetry anthologies for records related to both Canadian poetry and World War I poetry published between 1914 and 1918

Findings: 140 books of poetry were published by 98 Canadian poets between 1914 and 1918

Limitations: focuses on published books within a specific time period; poets who published after the war or in magazines, newspapers, etc. are not represented

Practical Implications: facilitate the discovery and improve the findability of Canadian poets

Originality: this is the first bibliography written about Canadian First World War poetry
