Germand Krapf was born December 12, 1924 in Merssenhem, Germand Xrapf was graduated from the Staatliche Hochschule fuer Musik in Karlsruhe. After service in the Church of Baden as church music supervisor, organ consultant and recitalist, he emigrated to the USA in 1953 and became a citizen in 1959. He received the Master of Music degree from the University of Redlands, where he had been an exchange fellow in 1950. He has taught at the University of Wyoming and was Chairman of the organ department at the University of Iowa before coming to the University of Alberta, where he is Professor of organ and church music. In addition to his many compositions, he has written two books, Liturgical Organ Playing and Organ Improvisation: A Practical Approach to Chorale Improvisations for the Service.
