Over the past decade **Kraig Scott** has developed one of the most active organ studios in Washington State. Currently he teaches at both Whitman College and Walla Walla College where he also serves as Music Director to the 1700-member Walla Walla College church. In addition to his teaching he maintains a busy performing schedule on organ and harpsichord and is also in demand as a piano accompanist. Recent appearances include the Eastman School in Rochester, New York, the University of Oregon, the University of Washington, Central Washington University, and Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Oregon, and Epiphany Episcopal Parish in Seattle. In October of 2002 he played an all Bach recital on the Walla Walla College 92-rank Casavant, and made his second appearance with the Walla Walla Symphony performing Haydn's C Major Organ Concerto in the opening concert of the 2001-2002 season.

While still a teenager Mr Scott became the organist at the Holy Rosary Cathedral in Vancouver, British Columbia, and has since held similar positions in Lutheran, Episcopal and Christian Science churches. Since 1993 he has been Music Director at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Walla Walla. His DMA is from the Eastman School of Music where he also received an MA in historical musicology and the coveted Performer's Certificate, as well as the prestigious Jerald C. Graue Fellowship for outstanding work in musicological research. He teachers include David Craighead, Russel Saunders, Arthur Haas, and John Hamilton.
