International Hockey Rules

THIS GAME is being played under rules as set down by the International Ice Hockey Federation. There are many minor differences between Canadian Amateur Hockey rules and those of the international body, but the main differences are these:

1. Body-checking is sharply curtailed under international rules. Body checking is allowed only by the defensive team inside their own zone. No body checking is allowed by an offensive team in their opponent's half of the rink.
 2. Under Canadian rules, if a penalty shot is awarded, any player on the non-offending team is entitled to take the shot. Under international rules, a penalty shot may be taken only by the player against whom the foul is committed.
 3. Icing the puck in international rules occurs the instant the puck crosses the goal line, regardless of whether the teams are of the same numerical strength. The practice in Canada of shooting the puck down the ice when a team is short-handed thus becomes open to a call of icing.
 4. Under international rules, a penalty shot is automatically awarded if a player in possession of the puck has no opponent between himself and the opposing goalkeeper, and while in such position is prevented from having a clear shot on his opponent's goal because of a stick thrown by a player in any zone.
- Contrary to general public opinion, the centre ice red line is used under International rules in exactly the same manner as under C.A.H. A. Rulings.

...The Japanese Team...

THIS OLYMPIC hockey team is the first team to represent Japan in international hockey competition since the 1936 Olympics held in Germany. The team has played six (and lost six) games in Canada prior to its visit here tonight — but the team manager has made it quite clear that this tour is being undertaken strictly to provide experience for his players in the Canadian-style of play.

The team has an average age of 24 years, an average weight of 70 kilograms (155 pounds) and an average height of 168 centimetres (roughly five feet, eight inches).

Many of the players have already played in some international competition, and at least six of the players took part in the world championship games in Moscow in 1957. Yoshihiro Miyazaki, wearing sweater number three, has gained hockey experience with the Kenora (Ontario) Thistles. Star of the team is considered to be Isao Ono, wearing sweater number 15, who has played in international games in Canada, the States and in Moscow.

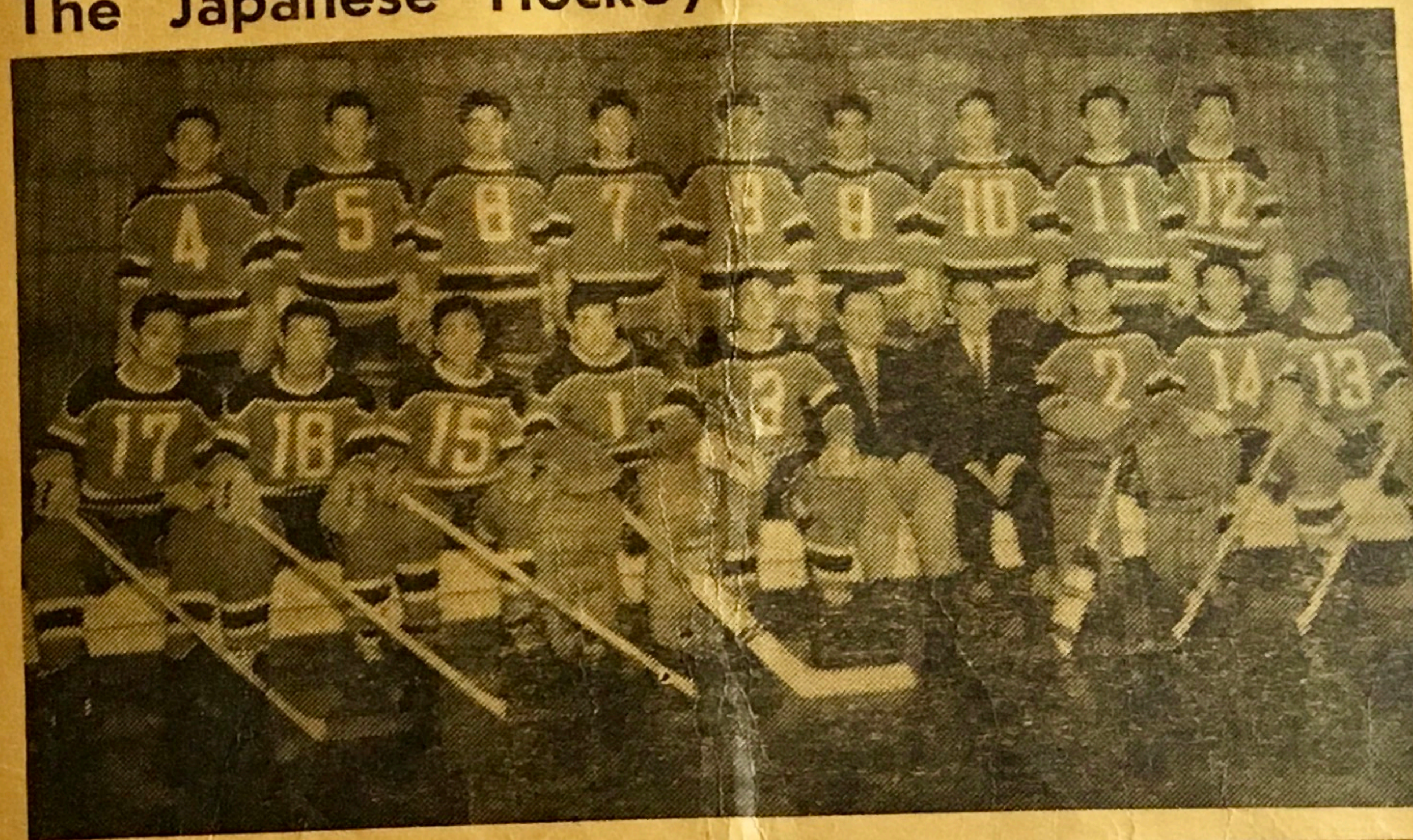
The Japanese will wind up their Canadian tour about mid-February after which they travel to Squaw Valley, California, for competition in the Olympics. It is possible that in these games they will meet the Canadian standard-bearers, Kitchener-Waterloo Dutchmen of Ontario.

Ponoka Stampeders' netminder, Eric Paterson has been chosen to tend goal for the All-Star aggregation, thus giving the Ponoka team six men on the all-star squad.
