Internationally recognized Polish-Canadian pianist Marek Jablonski was born in Cracow and resided for many years in Edmonton.

He has performed as a soloist and with orchestras throughout Canada and the United States and is regularly invited to concertize in Europe. He made his New York debut at Carnegie Hall with Zubin Mehta at the podium. Mr Jablonski has performed in major European centres including Paris, London, Berlin, Vienna, Madrid, Brussels and Milan, the latter two cities hosting complete recital series works of Chopin. Mr Jablonski has also toured South American and the USSR.

Mr Jablonski has made recordings and has been a frequent guest on both radio and television in Canada and in Europe.

Mr Jablonski has been a guest artist at the Banff School of Fine Arts for the past fifteen years and is regularly invited to give master classes throughout Canada. He has also given classes in Belgium, France and South America and conducts the annual piano master class at the Bergamo Festival in Italy. Currently, Mr Jablonski also gives masterclasses for the Advanced Performance Programs at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto and at the Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore.

In 1993, he joined the faculty of the Department of Music at the University of Alberta.
