The Transformation Stream is designed to support large-scale, Canadian-led **interdisciplinary research projects** that address **a major challenge with the potential to realize real and lasting change (high reward)**.

The challenge may be fundamental, leading to a scientific breakthrough, or applied, with a social, economic, environmental or health impact.

Projects are expected to be world-leading, drawing on **global** research expertise where relevant.

The Transformation Stream Grants will support projects that:

- tackle a **well-defined** problem or challenge;
- propose a **novel world-leading approach** that is different from the current state-of-the-art approaches to the issue;
- are **interdisciplinary**, bringing different perspectives to the defined problem; and
- have the potential to be **transformative**, defined as the potential to **create a significant and real change or impact** -- a noticeable leap or tangible breakthrough versus an incremental advance.

NFRF Application Stages:

Three mandatory stages to apply to NFRF using the [Convergence Portal](#):

- [Notice of Intent](#) (NOI) - Deadline: November 2, 2021
 - INTERNAL RSO DEADLINE: Single PDF on [RHP](#): October 26th, 4:30PM
- [Letter of Intent to Apply](#) (LOI) - Deadline: January 11, 2022
 - INTERNAL RSO DEADLINE: Single PDF on [RHP](#): December 20th, 4:30PM
- [Application \(by invitation only\)](#) - Deadline: September 20, 2022
 - INTERNAL RSO DEADLINE: Single PDF on [RHP](#): September 13th, 4:30PM

Eligibility

- Ensure that you and your team members meet the eligibility requirements from NFRF ([Eligibility](#))
 - Team of at least 5 participants - must include at least 1 confirmed early career researcher (ECR)
 - Core 5 participant DOES NOT CHANGE

Here are some things to remember:

- RSO will require Institutional contact information for non UofA co-PIs and co-Apps.
- RSO may request translation of eligibility confirmations for foreign institutions
- RSO will also need to provide eligibility of team members for co-PIs and co-Apps on applications led at other institutions. Those requests should be forwarded to your [Research Facilitator](#).

NOI - Content: Application title; language of the applicant; Indigenous research - Indicate whether your project involves Indigenous research, [as defined by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council \(SSHRC\)](#); keywords; fields of research; outline of challenge (maximum of 3,500 characters); overview of approach and potential changes (maximum of 3,500 characters); list of collaborators; suggested reviewers (optional at NOI stage; minimum of 20 at LOI stage) and reviewer exclusions (if applicable).

Note: This content may be updated at the LOI stage.

Institutional submission for review and approval:

- University nominated principal investigator will need to create a new application request [via the Researcher Home Page \(RHP\) system](#) for each stage - NOI, LOI and full application.
- In addition, UofA co-applicants on applications **led at another institution** must also create a new application request via the [Researcher Home Page \(RHP\)](#) at LOI and full application stage only. If there are multiple co-PIs and co-Apps from UofA on applications led by other institutions, one PI will need to be picked as UofA lead PI.
- Faculty (Chair and Dean) approval on-line - required prior to RSO internal deadline.
- Acknowledgement, in PeopleSoft, of UofA co-PI(s) and co-App(s) of their participation in the proposed project - required for RSO final approval.
- RSO Internal deadlines:
 - NOI - October 26 by 4:30 pm
 - LOI - December 20 by 4:30 pm
- Submission deadline to agency via the Convergence Portal:
 - NOI - November 2 by 4:30 pm
 - LOI - January 2, 2022 by 10 am

Applicant to Self-Assess Readiness:

- To reflect the expertise required to deliver on the ambitious and interdisciplinary nature of the project, the nominated principal investigator (NPI) - who is going to be the application lead at the University of Alberta (UA) - must understand the competition criteria and commitment required.

	<p>To ensure you are prepared for the competition, use the checklist below.</p>
	<p>The proposed project cannot be funded by other granting agencies (e.g. Tri-Council).</p>
	<p>The proposed project requires expertise from a minimum of 2 of the 3 Tri-Agencies' disciplines.</p>
	<p>The proposal is a project (not a program) that has clear objectives to tackle a recognised Canadian and/or international problem. The proposed project should resolve the challenge through a noticeable leap or tangible breakthrough rather than an incremental advance.</p>
	<p>The proposed project is very ambitious, incorporates different disciplinary approaches, bringing a novel perspective to the defined challenge. Proposal needs to demonstrate disciplines are interconnected, interdependent, and influence each other in design, data collection and outcomes.</p>
	<p>UA-NPI is an internationally acclaimed leader in their respective research field, and has the proven experience and expertise to lead a large-scale interdisciplinary project, which requires integration and coordination beyond usual disciplinary perspectives.</p>
	<p>UA-NPI has put together a diverse team of world-leading individuals that draw on global research expertise. Note, teams will need to show cohesion and prove productivity in the application.</p>
