WHAT IS TRACKING CHANGE @ COP24?

Tracking Change @ COP24 is being organized as a youth networking event and educational travel experience for select Grade 10-11 students from November 25 – December 5, 2018. The students will travel with chaperones from their home communities to Edmonton on November 25. Once arriving at the Edmonton airport (or arriving in the city by vehicle), they will travel by taxi to their accommodation. Following a day at the University of Alberta main campus, participants will depart for Paris, France on November 26, where they will spend a day enjoying tourist activities and educational travel. On November 27, participants will depart for Katowice, Poland, where they will stay until they depart for home on December 5.

Tracking Change @ COP24 involves the following activities:

- Poster making and presentations
- Environmental workshops with students in Poland
- Meetings and presentations with UNESCO
- Participation in COP24 side-events
- Fun in Paris at the Eiffel Tower and in downtown Katowice

Participation in the Event: Chaperones and students are responsible for ensuring they arrive on time for all events. Students will ride on trains in Paris and in coach buses provided by the event organizers in Poland when they travel among sites.

What costs are being covered? The program will cover the costs of airfare, accommodation and meals for the duration of the trip. The costs of food etc. while traveling as well as any extra costs associated with travel (e.g., taxis) will be reimbursed (to the chaperone). The cost of the admission to organized tourist activities and events will also be covered. However, extra spending money for shopping or other activities arranged by the chaperone in spare time will not be covered.

Health and Safety: Chaperones are responsible for the health and safety of students. It is the responsibility of the student/parent/chaperone to notify the organizers of any medical conditions or allergies that need care before traveling. It is the responsibility of the student to behave in ways that are respectful of others. There is a zero tolerance for drugs/alcohol at this event; those using drugs and alcohol will be asked to leave and the expense of their travel will not be covered.

What should I bring?

Students are required to bring a poster about a climate-related issue in their region. Posters that are focused on some aspects of climate change and water are of strong interest. Information for posters will be sent out in the participant package.

If the student has not completed a poster, they can bring ideas, notes, and/or photos and drawings that they would like to develop into a poster while in Edmonton.
