INTRODUCTION

PURPOSE

The Edmonton Social Planning Council has been involved in assisting over sixty communities in the City of Edmonton concerned with urban issues and problems. As a result of communication with various community groups and organizations, it has become apparent that the most common problem expressed by citizens is the problem of how to get more members of the community aware of and participating in the issues and problems of their neighbourhoods. On a provincial and national level, the same kind of concern has been expressed by municipal officials involved in the community planning process. Although authorities have invited public participation in the planning process, effective participation has been somewhat limited. Given a growing need for citizen participation, the Edmonton Social Planning Council has adopted as a priority one of research into and development of innovative ways to facilitate more effective and representative citizen involvement in community affairs. This need has been expressed for several reasons, some of which include the following:

- (a) Policies cannot be formulated in a vacuum if they are to be responsive to community needs.
- (b) Data received from public input to urban planning can help to prevent conditions, or at least provide early detection of conditions which could lead to social problems.
- (c) Public participation can also help to enhance commitment to policies developed on a joint decision making basis; thereby reducing longterm conflict.
- (d) In this manner, a long-range cost saving can be ensured.

Given expressed needs related to citizen involvement, the Edmonton Social Planning Council has utilized and experimented with various methods of facilitating public awareness and citizen involvement. These have included planning workshops, consultation, educational seminars and community development work. We do feel, however, that experimentation

with other innovative methods is worthwhile. Consequently, we now hope to experiment with community dramatic presentations as a technique to facilitate community involvement. Emphasized in this proposal is a strong evaluation research component, designed to determine effectiveness of the technique and to evaluate its transferability to other situations. The following will outline the goals, objectives of the project and process to be used in development of the project. To date, about three months of preliminary investigation and brainstorming has been carried out by Social Planning Council staff and volunteers, in consultation with three theatre groups in Edmonton. Several inner-city neighbourhoods have expressed enthusiasm in the possibility of the project occurring in their community. In order to pursue the project beyond this point, however, funding will be required for the following goals and objectives.

PROJECT: DRAMA FOR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

PURPOSE:

To facilitate education of community residents on community issues and problems, leading to participation by residents in community affairs.

GOAL:

To develop and evaluate community dramatic presentation in relation to the project's purpose.

To develop a planning and supervisory committee of specialists in the following areas of expertise:

- (a) theatre
- (b) knowledge of inner-city communities
- (c) knowledge of social and urban planning.

- 1. Liaison with Drama Department at the University of Alberta.
- 2. Liaison with community workers in the inner-city.
- 3. Liaison with community groups and others working on inner-city concerns.
