#### **Agriculture and Agri-Food**

Agriculture Minister **Lawrence MacAulay** (Cardigan, PEI) announced up to \$709,138 in federal funding fo a project with the University of Prince Edward Island's Atlantic Veterinary College to create diagnostic tests that will make it easier to safeguard the health of Canada's bovine and swine herds. #### **Bank of Canada**

The bank announced the inaugural winners of its student Scholarship and Work Placement Program. The private sector economic forecasts have been used as the basis for fiscal planning since 1994 and introduce an element of independence into the Government's fiscal forecast. Statistics Canada published its Survey of Household Spending, 2014. Canadian households spent an average of \$59,057 on goods and services in 2014. The full release is available online.

Nearly 1 in 10 enterprises in industries covered by the 2014 Survey of Advanced Technology used global positioning system (GPS) technology, making it the most widely adopted geomatics and geospatial technology. #### **Canadian Food Inspection Agency**

The Canadian Food Inspection Agency updated a Jan. 29, 2016 food recall warning to include additional product information identified during the CFIA's food safety investigation. Mannarich Food Inc. is recalling Mannarich Food brand Fuzhou Fish Balls and Parker Lee brand noodle products from the marketplace because they contain egg which is not declared on the label. People with an allergy to egg should not consume the recalled products which have been sold in Manitoba, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Quebec and may have been distributed in other provinces. #### **Transport Canada**

On behalf of Transport Minister Marc Garneau (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce-Westmount, Que.), Transport Canada has ordered Nissan Canada to immediately inform certain vehicles owners of a safety issue. The safety issue applies to owners of 2005 and 2006 Nissan X-Trail models. A defect in the fuel reservoir filler pipe coating could result in dangerous fuel leaks if unrepaired. While these vehicles were recalled by Nissan in 2014, the department remains very concerned the defect hasn't



been corrected in enough of the affected vehicles. The Minister of Transport obtained the authority to order a manufacturer to further inform vehicle owners of a safety issue in 2015. The National Energy Board released Canadian Energy Dynamics: Highlights of 2015, providing insight, statistics and regional descriptions that frame the key developments in Canada's energy markets in 2015. Dynamic changes in supply, demand, and infrastructure continually shape Canada's energy sector. 2015 saw a six-year low in crude oil prices, with West Texas Intermediate ending the year around \$35 per barrel. Natural gas prices also remained low in 2015. Canadian exports of electricity reached a record high of 58 terawatt hours in 2015 due to new supply and lower than expected domestic demand. In addition, non-hydro renewable capacity continued to grow in 2015, with solar capacity expanding by 11 per cent and wind capacity growing by 8 per cent; however, annual additions of non-hydro renewable capacity slowed considerably in 2015.
