Enjoy the sound of music and have a Happy Chinese New Year! Gong Xi Fa Cai!!





She has done much concert work including new music and Broadway style, and musical review for Sun City in Johannesburg. Recently, she returned to England to do

concerts with Trio Monde in a Bach to Broadway soiree series at Farnham Castle, Losley House and the Bognor Regis Music Club.

Judy Loewen is a native born Edmontonian, whom graduated from the University of Alberta with a Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance, and a Master of Music degree in harpsichord performance. She is active in the Edmonton music scene as a teacher and as a collaborative pianist.

Stephanie Kwan is completing the fourth and final year of her Bachelor of Music program at the University of Alberta, where she studies piano with Professor Janet Scott-Hoyt. She holds an ARCT diploma from the Royal Conservatory of Toronto. Previous teachers include Dr. Jacques Després, Dr. Boris Konavalov, Oxana Lutsenko, and Maureen Goebel. An active performer and teacher, Stephanie is the recipient of numerous awards, including the Bessie Brooks Winspear Scholarship, a Faculty of Arts Leadership Award, Louise McKinney Scholarships, and the Dorothy Buckley Two Piano Scholarship. Last fall, she

performed Francis Poulenc's Piano Concerto in D Minor with the Concordia Symphony Orchestra. Stephanie is responsible for organizing tonight's concert, and has held a major leadership role in other numerous musical initiatives, including "Keys for Humanity" and "A Koncert for Kids."

Matthieu Damer started playing the cello at the age of five. Since then, he has played in many musical groups, including the Edmonton Youth Orchestra,

the Academy Strings, and the University Symphony Orchestra. He is currently in the first year of his Bachelor of Music program, where he studies cello with Tanya Prochazka. Possessing a diverse range of musical talents and interests, Matthieu is also an up and coming francophone singer and songwriter.

Sarah Huang was born in Lethbridge, and studied violin in Medicine Hat with Robert Bordston. Despite the rigorous academic requirements expected of a fourth year Honours Physiological & Developmental Biology student, Sarah is active in a variety of University of Alberta student organizations, such as the UA Wise. She also devotes significant time to music, and frequently participates in chamber music groups at the University.

Andrea Kipp is in the fourth year of her Bachelor of Music program at the University of Alberta, where she studies viola performance with Aaron Au. Andrea participated in the Agassiz Chamber Music Festival, and is also a capable pianist and violinist. In her spare time, Andrea enjoys watching hockey with her husband Mike.

Sabrina Steed has always been an avid violinist: she began playing the instrument before she could walk or talk! Born in Calgary, her teachers included Dr. Lia Elson, Fiona Carnie, and Denuta Ciring. She is currently in the third year of the Bachelor of Music program at the University of Alberta, where she studies with Dr. Guillaume Tardiff. A member of the Academy Strings and the University Symphony Orchestra, Ms. Steed has participated in the Kiwanis Music Festival, as well as the Agassiz Chamber Music Festival in Winnipeg, Manitoba. She enjoys playing the organ and piano in her spare time.

Patricia Tao joined the U of A Faculty in 2002. For 10 years as pianist of the Guild Trio, she performed throughout North America and Europe. Dr. Tao also toured Europe as an "Artistic Ambassador" for the United States and throughout the U.S. for Columbia Artists' Community Concert series. She served as an artist-in-residence at the Tanglewood Music Center and the University of Virginia and has given live radio broadcasts on NPR's Performance Today," WNYC's "Around New

York," WQXR's "The Listening Room" and the St. Louis public television series "Premiere Performances." Commissions and premieres of new works by leading American composers include William Bolcom, Harvey Sollberger and Sheila Silver. She has recorded on the CRI label, and her solo CD for Arktos will be released in fall 2003. Dr. Tao received her Bachelor of Arts from Harvard University, Master of Music with Distinction from Indiana University and Doctor of Musical Arts from the State University of New York at Stony Brook. Her principal teachers were Leonard Shure, Gyorgy Sebok and Gilbert Kalish, and in chamber music, Bernard Greenhouse, Leon Fleisher, Julius Levine and Timothy Eddy. She has previously taught at the Western Washington University and at the University of Virginia.



Valentina Li – Music Director of the Alberta Chinese Orchestra

Born in Hong Kong, she is a renowned Guzheng teacher in Edmonton. She has graduated from the University of Toronto's Economics program and Education diploma from Chinese University of Hong Kong, a professional registered teacher. She was a student of the famous Zheng master Hon See-wah and Professor Zhao Yuz-Hai and has benefited from the coaching of many other Guzheng teachers. In addition, she also learned erhu from erhu master, Professor

Wong Guo-tong of Central Conservatory of music. Valentina devoted her life to promote Chinese music. Her prolific career included teaching and holding numerous concerts in the town halls, gaining critical acclaims.

In 1985, Valentina founded the Tung Fai Guzheng institute in Hong Kong. Many of the students have won prizes in Hong Kong. As a diligent teacher, she gained the love and respect from her students. In 1992, she was invited by Yuen Long District Arts Committee to be the Music Director of the Yuen Long Regional Orchestra. The Orchestra is subsidized by Hong Kong Government. At the same period, she had established two Orchestras in different secondary schools. She had made significant contribution in promoting Chinese music.

In 1997, she immigrated to Edmonton. In 1999, she and the erhu player, Ma Jian, formed the Alberta Chinese Orchestra of Edmonton. Tung Fai Guzheng Ensemble was also established in Edmonton. Valentina has also published a number of writings on newspaper and made recordings on Zheng music, along with demonstrating the music on TV. She has done demonstrations in elementary schools and presentations on Chinese music in Ethnomusicology of the Department of Music in University of Alberta. Currently, she is the president and Music Director of Tung Fai Ensemble and Alberta Chinese Orchestra. She is also the director of the Chinese Garden Association

In 2003, we had performed various shows for the community, including the Heritage Day Festival, Edmonton Chinese Garden ground breaking ceremony, Photographic Arts Society anniversary and the Centennial City library 90 anniversary celebrations.

Our goal is to promote Chinese music and perform music for the community. Our activities will be organizing concerts and Chinese music training classes. Everyone is welcome to participate.
