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Abstract

Grief is a universal experience manifesting itself in the most individual of ways. Traditions, cultures, circumstances surrounding the passing of a loved one, their identity, role in society, as well as their relationships all play a role. Events and rituals over a prescribed period of time typically mark grieving but processing and understanding grief is a deeply personal experience. Early theoretical frameworks suggest grief follows a prescribed set of stages, tasks, and timelines. Recent theories acknowledge grief can be limitless in duration. This study explores how those who have lost a loved one use social networking sites to share their grief, allowing for a continued bond with them. A case study explored how the family of Manmeet Singh Bhullar, an Alberta Cabinet Minister and Member of Legislative Assembly, used social networking sites to share their grief and loss after his passing in November 2015 at the age of 35. Facebook and Instagram posts were compared with the ways in which the continuing bonds theory notes people maintain a relationship with someone they have lost; sensing their presence, talking with them, having them serve as a moral guide, and talking about them. Findings determined social networking sites allow for continued expressions of grief, collectively and personally. Recommendations include further research into the role and use of social networking sites in the grieving process.

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Prologue

One of life's greatest truths is that it will one day end. We do not know when, where and how, and we certainly may never know why. Death has a way of leaving us gasping for meaning, not only of the life that is lost but also of the lives that remain behind. It becomes seemingly impossible to not think of life being separated into two starkly different halves – one before and one after the loss of your loved one. We wander through the grief and loss, sometimes on autopilot, seemingly numb and unaware of the world and people that are moving about around us; other times so aware of the emptiness and harshness of life without the one you love, that the scars and wounds remain forever raw.

The many impacted by the loss of one are trying to make sense of what has happened. Each connected through a shared loss and yet isolated in their individual grief, which is as unique as the relationship they each held with the person they have lost. Grief does not look the same, feel the same or come at the same time for everyone, and yet it can bind family, friends and strangers together like nothing else. It is a rite of passage into a club that no one wants to belong to and yet everyone will find themselves in, one day. It is an unspoken truth amongst you allowing you to feel a sense of comfort with one another that cannot be explained.

Our loss and grief finds ways to express itself, sometimes through the presence of words and other times through the absence of them. A film of memories circles through our mind, always wishing the content was larger and always thankful when another moment comes to remembrance. We hold our shared words and the sound of the person's voice deep in our hearts, we view pictures and videos with a longing to remember every detail and every feeling that we

had in that moment in time, we mark milestones past and present, with a realization that happiness will never feel as authentic as it once did and sadness will always be a tinge darker.

We rely on our individual and collective memories, artefacts and feelings to share a grief that seems insurmountable. The telling of one story leads to another, the sharing of one picture leads to another, the tears of one find themselves in the eyes of others, the smile of one is reflected in the face of others, as we continue to recognize the loss and the love that we feel.

This research is a case study to examine how grief, as we have historically looked at it and how it has evolved over time, crosses over into our use of social networking sites. The main objective of this study is to examine how those who have lost a loved one experience grief and loss through on-line social networks. Secondly, it will focus in on how social networking sites allow those who are grieving to continue a bond with their loved one after they have passed.

The research question for this study is:

What is the role of social media in grief and loss?

The objectives of this study are:

- 1. Explore how individuals use social networking sites to express the grief they feel due to the loss of a loved one.
- 2. Understand the role of social networking sites in grief and loss to demonstrate the application of the continuing bonds theory.

The findings of this research serve as further discussion and understanding for those who are currently experiencing grief and loss of a loved one as well as those who are supporting someone through this process, whether as friends, family or as practitioners. Additionally, the study may be of interest to social networking sites as they continue to implement policies and

processes that are reflective of the way the end user carries out use of the platform. Ultimately, it is hoped that this study allows those who find themselves in the midst of grief and loss, to know that they are not alone and that for as long as they are here, they carry on the story of the loved ones they have lost.

Literature Review

In order to connect the current world of social media with the grief process, it is important to understand the process of grief through a theoretical lens, the rituals and traditions surrounding it, the ways in which grief was initially shared online, and how social networking sites provide a way to manage and express grief online on a personal level and larger scale.

Grief

Grief is a universal concept that we all will experience at some point in time. So the question then is not when but how. Grief is an experience that can be varied and unique for each individual.

Freud first studied grief in 1915 with his essay titled *Mourning and Melancholia*, asking the question of what we do with the feelings we have for someone when they have passed. In this essay he stressed the idea that losing someone is intrinsically about our relationship with ourselves (Green, 2013).

Theories of Grief

Stages of grief, Kübler-Ross. Within the grief theory literature, Kubler-Ross serves as a guidepost from which many people approach the grieving process. Categorizing grief within five stages, she herself acknowledges grief does not fit neatly within these stages. Rather, they are ways of "learning to live within the one we lost" (Kübler-Ross & Kessler, 2005, p. 7). The five stages – denial, anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance, are not linear.

Denial is a stage that focuses not only on the person passing but also on the person who is grieving the loss of someone. This stage of grieving allows for those experiencing the loss to survive. It provides for a gradual way of dealing with loss by only handling how much we can at that particular moment in time. As reality sets in, the healing process starts. Anger is the stage that begins when the individual has enough awareness to realize that they will survive. Anger appears in multiple layers and has multiple recipients. It can manifest in many ways, towards many people. "Anger is a natural reaction to the unfairness of loss" (Kübler-Ross & Kessler, 2005, p. 16). The stage of bargaining serves as a diversion from pain, allowing for the transition from one state of loss to another. This is where the 'what if' questions appear, moving from what we could have done differently to what will happen in the future. Depression is the stage that places the bereaved squarely in current time. Within grief, depression allows for nature to protect those grieving by "shutting down the nervous system so that we can adapt to something we feel we can't handle" (Kübler-Ross & Kessler, 2005, p. 21). The new reality and the realization that their loved one has physically left them, is the stage of acceptance: In this stage making adjustments serves as a core component.

Tasks of Mourning. While Kubler-Ross addressed grief through stages, Worden (2009) provided a process that focused on tasks. Similar to the five stages of grief, Worden's Tasks of Mourning are void of a particular order and are experienced by the bereaved through revisiting them over time (Rothaupt & Becker, 2007). Worden, in his text, "Grief Counseling and Grief Therapy", outlines four tasks.

Task one is to accept the reality of the loss, "come full face with the reality that the person is dead, that the person is gone and will not return" (Worden, 2009, p. 39). This task involves acceptance at an intellectual and emotional level. Traditional rituals such as funerals aid in acceptance.

The second task is to process the pain of grief encompassing physical, emotional and behavioural pain: Worden (2009) believes this pain has to be "acknowledged and worked through or it can manifest itself through physical symptoms or some form of aberrant behaviour" (p. 44). Not experiencing this task of processing the loss leads to not feeling. Task two can be cut short with the bereaved cutting off feelings or denying pain. Remembering only the good, idealization of those who have passed, avoidance of reminders of those who have passed, and the presence of alcohol and drugs can also lead to not experiencing this second task. Pain is manifested through sadness, anxiety, guilt, depression and loneliness (Worden, 2009).

In task three the focus is to adjust to a world without the deceased: this task involves three areas: external, internal and spiritual adjustments. The external focuses on how death affects one's every day functioning in the world. Internal adjustment focuses on how the death affects one's sense of self. Lastly, spiritual adjustment is a focus on how death affects one's

beliefs, values and assumptions about the world. Failure to adapt can be a hindrance to experiencing the third task.

Worden's fourth task has evolved over time and is seen as the most difficult. In this task the goal is "to find an enduring connection with the deceased in the midst of embarking on a new life" (Worden, 2009, p. 50). Failure to carry out this task can be seen as not living, "one's life has stopped with the death and has not resumed" (Worden, 2009, p. 52). Although Worden's approach is task based and that may allow for the interpretation that the tasks have a start and end, Worden writes that these tasks are repeatedly revisited, and at times people may be experiencing more than one simultaneously.

Worden (2009) goes further, explaining that the tasks of mourning are better understood by applying mediators of mourning, "to understand why the tasks are handled differently by individuals, one must understand how these tasks are mediated by various factors" (p. 57). There are seven mediators in total:

The first mediator refers to the identity of the person who has died "to understand how someone will respond to a loss, you need to know something about the deceased" and their kinship, which "identifies the person's relationship to the survivor (Worden, 2009, p. 57). Knowing what the relationship between the two people is can provide insight on how deeply and differently the grief will be felt. A parent's loss can be felt differently by two children depending on their age; the loss of a grandparent can be better understood and accepted than the loss of someone at a young age.

The second mediator delves into the nature of the attachment the survivor shares with the person they have lost. Referring to the survivor, the following elements are to be considered;

strength of attachment, security of the attachment, ambivalence in the relationship, conflicts with the deceased, and the level of dependency in the relationship.

How the person died is the third mediator. Traditionally, deaths can be listed in the four categories of natural, accidental, suicidal, and homicidal. When coupled with other mediators, the 'how' can impact the extent of grief that is felt. The suicide of a young person may have a more startling impact than the natural death of an elderly person.

The fourth mediator is historical antecedents. Knowing how someone has handled grief, loss, and stress in the past can serve as an indicator of how they will handle it in the present. Mental wellbeing also factors in here, as someone with a history of mental health concerns may be at higher risk while experiencing a loss. Not fully grieving a past loss while experiencing a new loss can also complicate situations by bringing forward unresolved feelings and or family issues.

The fifth of Worden's variables is the personality variables of the mourner. Age, gender, coping styles, and worldviews are just some of the personality characteristic that impact how someone will respond to or experience grief. "Boys and girl are socialized differently, and many of the differences in how men and women approach the tasks of mourning may be more a part of this socialization than in some intrinsic gender differences" (Worden, 2009, p. 65).

The sixth mediator looks at social variables; the perceived emotional and social support from others, internal and external, to the family. "Most studies find that those who do less well with bereavement have inadequate or conflicted social support"; although the social support helps with the bereavement, "it does not necessarily accelerate the grief process" (Worden, 2009, p. 73, p. 74).

The seventh and last mediator for Worden is concurrent stress. This refers to change and crises that arise after a death. While change is expected following a loss; significant changes and additional losses after the death, including economic in nature, can lead to a lesser degree of wellbeing.

In Worden's (2009) view "mourning is finished when the tasks of mourning has been accomplished" (p.76). However, he says there is no definitive time frame for this. One indicator of mourning being finished is when "a person is able to think of the deceased without pain... mourning may seem to be reaching an end when interest is regained in life however some feel it is never finished" (Worden, 2009, p. 77).

Continuing bonds Theory. Moving away from a staged or tasked theoretical lens for grief, the importance of ongoing relationships with those who have passed began to gain attention. Klass, Silverman, and Nickman (1996) brought forward a different way of approaching grief in which "interdependence is sustained even in the absence of one of the parties" (p. 37) The continuing bonds theory suggests "the bereaved remain involved and connected to the deceased, and that the bereaved actively construct an inner representation of the deceased that is part of the normal grieving process" (Klass et al. 1996, p.37). In this approach it is understood that death does not make a relationship disappear. Although previous theories relied on this disconnect from the person who is lost in order to live in the present and accept the current reality, continuing bonds looks at "recognizing how bonds formed in the past can inform our present and our future" (Klass et al. 1996, p.38). This approach does not subscribe to the idea that bereavement ends after letting go, instead, stress is placed on "negotiating and renegotiating the meaning of the loss over time" (Klass et al. 1996, p. 39).

Klass et al. (1996) see the process of grieving staying with the mourner for a lifetime, the mourner is "changed by the experience; they do not get over it, and part of the change is a transformed but continuing relationship with the deceased" (p. 40). The grief someone experiences leaves them not only grasping with the meaning of death but also the meaning of the person that they have lost in the present life that they are still carrying on in. At the core of this theory is the understanding that "continuing bonds can be a healthy part of the survivor's ongoing life" (Klass et al. 1996, p. 44).

In *Processes of Grieving: How Bonds are Continued*, Klass and Walter (2001) build on the theory of continuing bonds by providing means by which the bonds can be maintained. They recognize that many factors play a role including family styles, subcultural patterns, religious believes, personality constructs, attachment patterns and ego developmental levels (Klass & Walter, 2001, p. 435).

Klass and Walter recognize research on this area needs further work; however, they do provide four key points of discussion on how contemporary society approaches bonds between the living and those that have passed.

The first is sensing the presence of the person who has passed. Although typically seen as hallucinations, "significant enough portions of the population sense the presence of the dead that it cannot be labeled pathological or even hallucinatory" (Klass & Walter, 2001, p. 435). Secondly, to continue the relationship after death, talking with the person who has passed is another mechanism that can be used, allowing for a continued conversation with and about the person that has passed.

The third process by which bonds can continue is for the person who has passed to play the role of moral guide for those they have left behind. Marwatt and Klass (1995) identify four functions as providing moral guidance and having links to moral behaviour: the person serving as a role model, providing situation specific guidance, giving clarification of values, and lastly seeing the deceased as an integral part of the survivor's identity.

The final and fourth process identified by Klass and Walter (2001) is talking about the person who has passed, where "mourning can include the attempt to complete the dead person's identity to write 'the last chapter' of their biography" (p. 439). This is done through conversations with friends and family, reviewing writing and artifacts.

Grief Online

Towards the second half of the 20th century, mourners looked beyond themselves to deal with the grief. This involved counselling, therapy and help through support groups. By 1990, these help groups appeared online, providing the advantage of accessibility at all times from anywhere (Walters, 2015).

With the use of social media, new social relationships and platforms provide for death to be discussed at a social and conversational level, similar to other major life events that are marked through social media. Our day-to-day occurrences whether milestones or mundane tasks are shared over social media. The same is true of communicating, sharing and posting about death, "death is no longer sequestered from life" (Walter, 2015, p.11).

The presence of death online began with the use of memorial sites, web memorials and guest books, making the web a place where people shared their grief (Gibbs, Meese, Arnold, Nansen, & Carter, 2015, p.256).

Social Media and Grief

The "basic establishment of online social technologies in many people's everyday life practices might be the one reason why death seems to be more visible and less segregated than before in modern lives" (Christensen & Gotved, 2015, p. 4). People are now sharing "death, loss, and grief in more visible and accessible manners...this sharing of death and mourning can creatively constitute new communal spaces for designing, performing, and remediating rituals of grief and commemoration" (Christensen & Gotved, 2015, p. 5). The use of social media to discuss the topic of death shows how the grieving process is intrinsically social. "To socially perform and share, grief is basically a quest to re-establish life as a meaningful structure without the deceased and to heal the personal, social, and cultural gap that the death of this person has left behind" (Christensen & Gotved, 2015).

Social media has influenced the way that we experience loss, "providing a possible venue for grieving, support and coping during bereavement" (Rosetto, Lannutti, & Strauman, 2014, p 975). While initial online methods such as web memorials, chat groups, and online obituaries existed for "emotional expression, reminiscing, disclosure, paying tribute, continuing bonds, sharing grief and establishing community following a loss" (Rosetto et al. 2015, p.975), social media sites "express varied emotions, communicate with bereaved others and communicate with and about the deceased person" (Rosetto et al. 2015).

Social networking sites such as Facebook, Instagram and Twitter provide those grieving with an outlet to "post photos, comments, and memorials on to their profiles as a way to express their respect and love for their deceased loved one" (Kakar & Oberoi, 2016, p. 373).

Facebook. "Founded in 2004, Facebook's mission is to give people the power to build community and bring the world closer together. People use Facebook to stay connected with friends and family, to discover what's going on in the world, and to share and express what matters to them " (Facebook, 2015). As of June 2017, it listed 1.32 daily active users and 2.01 billion monthly active users (Facebook, 2015). It is estimated that up to ten thousand Facebook users die each day (Bouc, Han, & Pennington, 2016).

Facebook allows people to "become part of a network or community of grievers" (Frost, 2014, p. 258). On Facebook, the involvement of those taking part in the grief is voluntary as they have the choice to join memorial groups if they wish. It also allows for a "connection from anywhere at any time" (Frost, 2014, p.259). Facebook also allows for a variation in the type of involvement each person has, "participants can be observers or contributors to discussion and post photos and posts at their own discretion, in their own time" (Frost, 2014, p.259). With the Facebook profile of the deceased remaining as it was when they were alive, the focus is placed on the person who passed instead of those mourning. (Frost, 2014).

Frost (2014) indicates Facebook posts related to Facebook memorials are made from people in four categories. The first type of post can be characterized as being made by someone who knew the deceased and they are speaking directly to that person. Second is someone who knew the deceased and are writing or responding to others, group members. A third type is where

they did not know the deceased but they are writing to the group or the deceased. Lastly, are posts made on someone's personal timeline about a deceased loved one where they are speaking directly to the person they have lost.

In 2009, Facebook introduced the memorialization of a deceased person's Facebook page. This meant instead of deleting a user's page after death, "Facebook adopted a policy that memorialized pages by keeping them intact, allowing people to interact with the profile of their deceased friend just as they would with those that are still alive" (Bouc et al. 2016, p. 635).

In 2015, Facebook provided users with the option of creating a legacy contact. "With this feature, users of Facebook can select a friend or family member to be the manager of their page when they pass away" (Bouc et al. 2016, p. 635). Facebook explained their decision to add a legacy contact by saying "by talking to people who have experienced loss, we realized there is more we can do to support those who are grieving and those who want a say in what happens to their account after death" (Facebook, 2015).

Instagram. Newer to the social media vernacular, Instagram allows for the sharing of photos. Launched on October 6, 2010, Instagram was acquired by Facebook on April 9, 2012. It lists 700 Million plus monthly users and 400 Million plus daily users (Instagram, 2017).

"While social network sites such as Facebook have profiles and walls belonging to the deceased...in contrast, Instagram has no convergent or shared and sacred place for mourning and commemoration" (Gibbs et al, 2015, p.262). The use of hashtags and user labels are ways in which connections to others are made. "Places for mourning on Instagram are found in conversations defined by consensus around hashtags...rather than around a profile of the

deceased...this leads to conversations being decentred and far more rhizomatic than the mourning found on other social media." (Gibbs et al, 2015, p.263).

The 2014 study by Gibbs et al. (2015), focused on the use of the hashtag #funeral. It found three prominent themes surrounding Instagram use as related to death. First, sociality, "the central aim of sharing images is to signify presence and to communicate an important context and affective situation to a wider social network" (Gibbs et al, 2015, p.264). Second, memory and memorialization: photo sharing has a role in our memory and the memorialization of those we lose. Though these pictures were historically displayed in more traditional locations such as in the home, Instagram allows for these images to be shared informally and instantly. Thirdly, death and technology: technology and photo sharing on Instagram allow for informal and personal memorialization that extends beyond formal rituals such as funerals.

Methodology

"Only from his actions, his fixed utterances, his effects upon others, can man learn about himself; thus he learns to know about himself only by the round-about way of understanding" (Stake, 1978).

In qualitative research, understanding from the perspective of the participant is the primary objective. With a focus on "behaviours, opinions and attitudes...this type of research studies "the effects of events on people, cultural influences and developments" (McGloin, 2008,

p. 45). "Data collected in qualitative research typically take the form of spoken or written words", and "the questions of how and why are paramount" (Astin, 2013, p. 93).

Although qualitative research methods share similar characteristics, there are different distinct approaches to data collection and analysis.

Case Study

Case study methodology has a focus on people and therefore, can be categorized under human studies, focusing "on this relation between lived experience, expression, and understanding" (Stake, 1978, p. 5).

According to Yin (2014), case study research is the preferred method in situations when the main research questions are "how" and "why" questions, a researcher has little or no control over behavioural events, and the focus of study is a contemporary (as opposed to entirely historical) phenomenon.

Stages and Components of Case Study Research

In case study research, as outlined by Yin (2014), there are five main components: a case study's question, its propositions, if any, its units of analysis, the logic linking the data to the propositions; and the criteria for interpreting the findings.

Similar to Yin's components, Hancock, and Algozinne (2006) outline that a case study "identifies topic or question(s) of interest, determines appropriate unit to represent it, and defines what is known based on careful analysis of multiple sources of information about the "case" (p.10).

Several important characteristics are seen in case study research. Most often it addresses a phenomenon, an event, program or situation. The phenomenon under study is looked at in its natural context "bounded by space and time" (Hancock & Algozinne, 2006, p. 15). Information gathering during a case study takes on a descriptive nature, "grounded in deep and varied sources of information" (Hancock & Algozinne, 2006, p.16). Based on this criteria for data inclusion, the researcher identifies themes and categories of behaviours and events rather than proves relationships or test hypotheses (Hancock & Algozinne, 2006). Case study lends itself to research that requires a detailed analysis of an event in its natural context while relying on multiple sources. This research required a detailed analysis of an event in its natural context, for this reason a case study is an appropriate approach. For this reason, case study is well suited to this research question and objectives.

In order to better understand the role social media plays in grief and loss, this research set out to explore how individuals use social networking sites to express their feelings during times of grief, and also how social networking sites serve as a way to continue bonds between people after death. The unit of analysis is the Facebook and Instagram posts of individuals, using the logic that the content in the posts on these two sites will demonstrate key characteristics of the continuing bonds theory. The criteria to interpret the findings are that the posts are direct responses to the passing of Manmeet Singh Bhullar. The four characteristics of the continuing bonds theory; sensing the presence of the person who has passed, talking to them, having them serve as moral guide, and lastly, talking about them, will inform the analysis.

The research will also focus on a particular event and time frame, with varied sources of information, all coming together to share common themes and categories of behaviour.

Case study design

Yin (2014) highlights three types of case study research designs; exploratory, explanatory and descriptive. An exploratory case study identifies the research questions or procedures to be used in a subsequent research study, which might or might not be a case study. Explanatory case studies explain how or why some condition came to be. Lastly, descriptive case studies describe a phenomenon (the case) in its real-world context.

Many case study orientations exist within these three designs. Ethnographic studies have researchers directly immersed in the daily activities and interactions of a group. Historical case studies describe events, programs and organizations and their progress over time. Psychological case studies focus on human behaviour with the individual typically the focus. Sociological case studies focus on society, relationships, and institutions with an interest in the structure and behaviour of these organized groups and individuals.

Designs can also be determined as being intrinsic, instrumental or collective. When wanting to know more about an individual, event or organization, an intrinsic case study is employed. Instrumental case studies have the goal of better understanding a theoretical question or problem. A collective case study is designed to review an issue in question with an attempt to add existing literature in the hopes of better conceptualizing a theory (Hancock & Algozinne, 2006).

Recognizing that qualitative research is best suited to understanding the impact of a particular event, through the thoughts of individuals, the case study approach will be applied to one of life's most defining events; death.

This case study will focus on the death of my younger brother, Manmeet Singh Bhullar. Born in Calgary on March 1, 1980, he is the second child of my parents, Baljinder Singh and Sukhvir Kaur Bhullar, and second grandchild to his paternal grandparents, Jagir Singh and Mohinder Kaur Bhullar and maternal grandparents Ram Singh and Gurdev Kaur Shergill. We share one younger brother, Appy. On January 7, 2012, Manmeet married Namrita Kaur Rattan, daughter of Dalbir Singh and Kiran Kaur Rattan.

Manmeet attended school in northeast Calgary, first at Chief Justice Milvain Elementary, then Annie Gale Junior High, graduating from Lester B. Pearson High School in 1998. He went on to complete a Bachelor of Arts Degree with a sociology concentration in 2005, from the University of Athabasca, and a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Windsor in 2011.

On March 3, 2008, Manmeet entered provincial politics, being elected to the 27th legislature as the MLA for Calgary Montrose, making him the youngest MLA to be elected to the provincial legislature at that time. Manmeet delivered his maiden speech in the legislature on April 16, 2008, sharing his experience as a son of immigrants, recognizing the value of education, and his desire to instil confidence in youth. An excerpt of his maiden speech is included in Appendix A with the full transcript in Appendix B.

He was elected two more times in 2012 and 2015 as the MLA for Calgary Greenway.

Manmeet served seven years, eight months, and 21 days in the Alberta Legislature. While in office, Manmeet held the following roles:

- March 13, 2008 to January 12, 2010, Parliamentary Assistant for Advanced Education and Technology.
- January 15, 2010 to October 11, 2011, Parliamentary Assistant for Municipal Affairs.

- October 12, 2011 to December 12, 2013, Minister of Service Alberta.
- December 13, 2013 to September 14, 2014, Minister of Human Services.
- September 15, 2014 to May 23, 2015, Minister of Infrastructure.
- June 1, 2015 to November 23, 2015, Critic for Finance and Treasury Board and Critic for Infrastructure.

A member profile from the Legislative Assembly of Alberta is included in Appendix C. Manmeet became the first turbaned Sikh to serve in a Ministerial position in a Canadian legislature.

On Monday, November 23, 2015, while driving from Calgary to Edmonton, Manmeet stopped on the QEII highway to offer assistance to a vehicle that had rolled over. As he was making way his way to the vehicle, a semi-truck struck him. Manmeet was transported to hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. The family released a statement later that evening:

"The light in our lives went dark today. Manmeet Singh left us while he was doing what he loved more than anything – helping someone else. We know he would want us to be thankful for the countless blessings he was given by God. Just as his faith, wife, family, friends, and community gave him strength, it will give us strength now. We thank you for your support during this difficult time and ask for privacy. He demanded excellence of himself and those around him. We are all better because of him."

In order to address the research question, data was collected through searches on social networking sites. To show the reach and impact of Manmeet's passing, searches were conducted on Instagram, Facebook and Twitter. Primary search words included #nicetomanmeetyou, @manmeetsbhullar, #manmeetbhullar, yycgreenway, bhullar, manmeet, and manmeetbhullar. The discussion and findings focus on Instagram and Facebook.

Searches included posts that belong to public accounts, or those that have granted permission for the researcher to be a friend or follower on the particular social networking site. Permission was received through an information and consent form to include specific posts in the findings and discussions. Search dates were limited to November 23, 2015 through November 24, 2016. In accordance with ethics requirements, permission was received from the Research Ethics Office at the University of Alberta. A copy of the information and consent form is provided in Appendix E.

Facebook and Instagram posts were compared against the four ways in which Klass and Walter (2001) categorize individuals continuing a bond with the deceased:

- 1. Sensing the presence of the person who has passed.
- 2. Talking with the person who has passed.
- 3. Seeing the person who has passed as a moral guide.
- 4. Talking about the person who has passed.

Findings

After Manmeet's passing, social media became a key source for people sharing the news and also sharing their grief. News outlets reported on the outpouring of grief via social media. By the morning after his passing, the hashtag #nicetomanmeetyou was trending online and was included in over 1700 tweets (Ramsay, 2015).

Initial messaging was focused on shock and sharing of the news. People expressed the loss they felt personally, loss to community, the sharing of condolences, their experiences of their time with Manmeet, and their thoughts on the characteristics and values most important to Manmeet.

After the initial week when posts focused on what had happened and the rituals of mourning, such as the memorial service, social networking gave way to sharing deeper thoughts about how people were dealing with their grief, the void they were feeling and how they felt they would come to terms with the loss.

The research showed that social media provides a way for individuals to express the grief they feel due to the loss of a loved one and that it also allows for individuals to experience grief as described through the continuing bonds theory, where a continued relationship remains with the individual and there is no letting go (Klass et al. 1996) Instead, a person continues to experience and share grief, making meaning of their loss.

When reviewing the data, Klass and Walter's (2001) four key points of how people maintain bonds with someone who has passed, are consistently demonstrated. Users posted pictures of Manmeet alone as well as pictures they had with him, Manmeet's quotes and people's quotes about Manmeet, news stories, and sometimes pictures that resonated with the grief they were feeling. Most often, images were accompanied by their own thoughts, with the hashtag #nicetomanmeetyou occurring as a common theme in the post and at times serving as the only text that was included with an image. Posts were common on milestones such as a measured passage of time since Manmeet's passing, holidays, his birthday, and announcements of initiatives in his memory.

In beginning to review Instagram posts, it felt natural to start with the profile of Manmeet's wife, Namrita Rattan (@nkrattan). She has posted six times on Instagram since Manmeet's passing, with each post exemplifying the continuing bonds theory; talking about him,

talking with him, and referring to him as her moral guide, in the form of giving her situation specific guidance and serving as a role model.




Figure 10. Namrita Rattan Instagram post. Everything I do. (Rattan, 2016).

The posts of family members are presented below based on the four elements of the continuing bonds theory as outlined by Klass and Walter (2001).

Sensing the Presence of the Person who has Passed

The first element of the continuing bonds theory is sensing the presence of the person who has passed. Although typically seen as hallucinations, "significant enough portions of the population sense the presence of the dead that it cannot be labeled pathological or even hallucinatory" (Klass & Walter, 2001, p. 435). These posts were characterized with the use of words such as angel, always with me, guiding me, watching over us. The posts recognized

Manmeet's physical presence is no longer here but that *he still has a role in their life and that their love and thoughts still reach him.*

Talking With Someone Who Has Passed

To continue the relationship after death, talking with the person that has passed is another mechanism that can be used, allowing for a continued conversation with and about the person that has passed. These posts capture *direct conversations with Manmeet*, sharing the loss they feel, the influence he has on their life, how they have been coping. This category saw the most posts in relation to particular milestones such as Manmeet's birthday and holidays, marking time since his passing. In many ways, this is the category in which you see language that gives insight into the relationship he had with each person. Through their recollection of moments they shared with Manmeet, as well as what they miss the most about him, the reader gets a sense of the

personal relationships that shaped Manmeet's life. This category is also one where Manmeet's own words are shared through screen captures of his tweets and quotes and accomplishments.

This category very often mixes feelings of the present time as well as what they experienced with Manmeet at one point of time.




Figure 28. Rabina Shergill Instagram post. Talking with Manmeet. (Shergill, 2015).

Serving as a Moral Guide

The third element of the continuing bonds theory is for the person who has passed to *play* the role of moral guide for those they have left behind. Marwatt & Klass (1995) identify four functions as providing moral guidance and having links to moral behaviour: the person serving as a role model, providing situation specific guidance, giving clarification of values, and lastly seeing the person who has passed as an integral part of the survivor's identity. Posts in this category refer to both the words and accomplishments of Manmeet as well as their own behaviours and achievements that have been realized and those they aspire to. Inspiration and

hero are common words used in the posts within this category. Legacy acts such as establishments of a scholarship, naming of a school, and volunteer initiatives are highlighted within these posts.




Figure 35. Taran Rana Instagram post. Manmeet as a moral guide. (Rana, 2016).

Details on the scholarship are still being established and once details are confirmed more information will be available. METRO




Figure 42. Sharon Shergill Instagram post. Manmeet as a moral guide. (Shergill, 2015).

Talking About the Person who has Passed

The last and fourth element of the continuing bonds theory identified by Klass and Walter (2001) is *talking about the person who has passed*, quite often done through conversations with others. Posts in this category talk not only about Manmeet's character but also how his character has shaped others. This category also saw posts that may not have mentioned him directly by name, but referred to him via the hashtag #nicetomanmeetyou. Life events were again a common occurrence in this category as they were in the talking with the person who has passed category. Many times users not only referenced their own relationship with Manmeet, but also the relationship they knew he had with others.

Instagram's built-in feature of allowing for commenting, liking, and reposting on someone's post essentially makes the fourth feature of the continuing bonds theory present in each of the above categories simply through the use of the social networking site itself.

Discussion

For a deeper look into one individual's use of social media to share their grief and loss, the Facebook and Instagram account of Manmeet's cousin Amardeep Lail was reviewed. The focus on one individual allows for not only a comparison against the four elements of the continuing bonds theory but also exemplifies the principle of the continuing bonds theory that a person travels through their grief time and time again, with no specific linear progression.

Amardeep and Manmeet are cousins; his mother is Manmeet's father's sister. Born four months apart, they share a close bond as both family and friends. Their childhood consisted of regular sleepovers; summer months spent outdoors and at each other's homes, birthday parties with one being by the other's side when it came time to cut the cake. The innocence of childhood that they possessed with one another lasted through to adulthood; no matter the obstacles they faced, laughter was part of the process. They held each other's secrets, relished in the other's success, and comforted one another during setbacks. At Manmeet's wedding Amardeep pointed out that he always felt like he was Manmeet's soul mate.

Amardeep spoke at the memorial service for Manmeet. An excerpt of his speech is below:

"He was my best friend. It was just a given. Meeta was always with me. I can say without a doubt that I'm here today because Meeta never gave up on me. There was a time in my life that I wandered. I wandered from my friends, my family. All he ever said was get better. He never gave up on me, no matter what. No matter how low I felt, he said, you can get better. My daughter's not old enough to know this, but I'll make sure she knows that she has a dad because Meeta never gave up on me. Meeta talked about faith to me, to a lot of people. There was one point when I found about this, I was going to a different state of mind. But, it was gone. I got faith, we all do. One thing that I truly believe and is getting me through this time, helping all of us, its what Meeta's Dad said: It's okay, God needed him more. And yes, God did need him more and I thank God for 35 beautiful years." (CBC Player, 2015)

The morning after Manmeet's passing; Amardeep shared his feelings for the first time on social media. A simple sentence on Facebook saying "I woke up today hoping yesterday was a bad dream, but it wasn't, you're really gone and life will never be the same, my soul hurts. Love you so much Meeta" (Lail, 2015).

Over the course of the first few days, Amardeep used his Facebook account to share posts from his friends as well as media stories. While sharing personal pictures that he had with Manmeet, he didn't post any of his personal thoughts again until after the memorial service when he posted a comment saying "Thank you God for letting us have 35 amazing years with Meeta. Thank you all for your love and support and for showing us that Manmeet Singh Bhullar was not just ours but everybody's. Rabh Rakha (God watch over us)" (Lail, 2015).

The continuing bonds theory does not see death as an end to a relationship, and Amardeep's use of social media in reference to Manmeet, is the embodiment of this line of thought. The continuing bonds theory suggests "the bereaved remain involved and connected to the deceased and that the bereaved actively construct an inner representation of the deceased that is part of the normal grieving process" (Klass et al. 1996, p. 37).

Even with Manmeet's absence, Amardeep constructs an ongoing narrative in which his day-to-day life consists of a dialogue with and about Manmeet. Amardeep's Facebook timeline in reference to Manmeet reads much like their relationship; reflecting on their relationship through his own words, recognizing what others think and feel about him, and championing the values and beliefs that are important to Manmeet.

The continuing bonds theory separates itself from preceding theoretical frameworks on grief with an underlying belief that grief is not a linear progression; instead it manifests itself by

the griever continuously making sense of their loss. Amardeep in his own way tries to make sense of the gravity of loss even months afterwards. A simple sentence of "I miss you so much Meeta nothing feels the same anymore without you" (Lail, 2015). Manmeet's birthday and three months after his passing, and another on November 23, 2016, one year after his passing saying "I will never understand why God took you away from us but will continue to pray for acceptance and hopefully one day achieve it" (Lail, 2016) gives you a sense that although time has passed, Amardeep recognizes the void he feels and the reality that now surrounds him. Whether days, months or a year after Manmeet's passing, Amardeep acknowledges that as he grieves he will continuously revisit acceptance of Manmeet's death.

Amardeep's social media posts are indicative of the four main ways in which Klass and associates determine a bond can be continued. Amardeep talks about Manmeet, talks with him, makes reference to his presence guiding him, and reaffirms Manmeet as a moral guide.

Sometimes this is done within separate posts and other times one or more of the four categories is displayed in a single post.




Figure 60. Amardeep Lail Instagram post. Dr. Parabhdeep Bhullar-Lail (Lail, 2016).

Klass et al. (1996) state that "recognizing how bonds formed in the past can inform our present and our future" (p. 38). On July 16, 2016 Amardeep and his wife Sukhi became parents for the second time. They chose to give their son the middle name of Manmeet. Amardeep shared this news on social media.

Perhaps this one choice of giving his son the name of his cousin and best friend, emulates the thought process behind honouring a bond that was developed in the past by ensuring it has life in the future, even if one of the people with whom the initial bond was created is no longer here with his physical presence.

Conclusion

This case study provided insight into how a family has used social networking sites to share their grief after the passing of a loved one. Through each family member's posts on

Facebook and Instagram we see them coping with the reality of what has occurred, reaffirming their love for the person they have lost, sharing the character, values and accomplishments they saw their family member embody, and navigating the world without him. Long after the rituals of mourning had taken place, social networking sites served as a means for continued expressions of grief.

On social networking sites we see the family find a place to continue their grieving even if they are not in the same physical location. Perhaps most visible is the social networking site's ability to serve as a place where those experiencing grief can continue to have a relationship with the one they lost. It is a tangible space where family members share their thoughts with others and in turn with the loved one they have lost. The platform directly facilitates the four components of how to continue a bond with a loved one after their passing, a place where "interdependence is sustained even in the absence of one of the parties" (Klass et al. 1996, p.37). It allows for each person to recognize that the loss of a loved one has left them "changed by the experience, they do not get over it, and part of the change is a transformational but continuing relationship with the deceased" (Klass et al. 1996, p.40).

Through the posts you see the family members demonstrate the ways in which the continuing bonds theory propose that a person maintain a relationship with someone they have lost; talking with them, sensing their presence, having the person serve as a moral guide and talking about them. The innate ability of the social networking sites to encourage sociality, cements the continuing bond principle of talking about the person as a way to continue your relationship with them.

Social networking sites also allow for each individual to experience their grief collectively and personally, as we do in life. For some this means the sharing of their own personal feelings, for others it is the collection of lessons they have absorbed from the person, recognizing the presence they feel, and honouring milestones. For some of the family members it means remembering the person regularly on a particular date and for others posts are sporadic. Much the same as grief, each post is personal in nature, and different for each person. Though they have all lost the same person their grief is unique to each one of them, and so they forge an ongoing relationship that is equally unique.

Theoretical framework pertaining to grief and loss and the use of social networking sites was limited. Furthermore, there was very limited literature found that applied continuing bonds theory to an analysis of the use of social networking sites in grief and loss. This case study serves to provide a rich example of current day application of grief and loss theory to the use of social networking sites and their inherent ability to foster continuing bonds.

This case study focused on a particular family and the loss of a particular individual. For some this may be seen as a limitation, with concerns regarding the extrapolation of findings to other audiences. Limitations may also exist in that the person's use of social networking sites to share grief and loss may be directly correlated to their overall use of social networking sites, and if that is limited then perhaps it is not an outlet they will feel comfortable using as a coping method.

For this case study the time frame of activity that was looked at was one year. Longer time frames may need to be examined to meet the threshold for what would be considered a

continuing relationship. From a theoretical standpoint as well as grieving standpoint, a one-year time period may still be defined as too soon to witness long-term impact.

The continuing bonds theory is a newer theoretical framework through which grief is understood, referring to grief as a process that does not have a definitive end. Those practitioners who believe grief needs to result in closure and putting the loss behind you in order to move forward may see the use of social networking sites to facilitate the continuing bonds framework as a hindrance to the health of the mourner.

Future Research

This study has strong potential to serve as reference for researchers wanting to delve further into the role of social networking sites as a coping mechanism for grief and loss. Further research may consider age as a defining factor in the use of social networking sites for expressions of grief. Practitioners looking to provide those they care for with an outlet of expression may see social networking sites as a possibility. For owners of social networking sites, this case study may provide insight into enhanced features on their platforms that make the collection of these posts an easier process and more amenable to serve as legacy projects for their users.

On an individual level, this research project is a starting point in creating a larger library of work to chronicle the life and legacy of Manmeet Singh Bhullar. Much like his life, in which his family served as his foundation, this exploration of his family's sharing of their grief and loss can serve as foundational blocks to an exploration of the role he played in government and in his community.

Epilogue

On November 23, 2015, I was going through a 'normal' Monday at work. No Monday or even any other day has ever felt 'normal' since then. Looking out my office window I could feel the cold. My desktop always had Twitter loaded on one of the screens. That morning I remember seeing tweets about my brother speaking at an event at the University of Calgary. Since his party was no longer in power, official announcements and speaking engagements didn't always take up his day or take up space in the news. Nonetheless, for me, every event, story and tweet about him is one that I noted diligently. He had just gotten back from Brussels the night before so I figured he would have been tired and I would message him at some point to ask him how the event went. For some reason that day my usual reflex of texting him as soon as I saw something about him on social media didn't kick in. Come to think of it a lot of things didn't happen as per normal that day. A short while later I saw tweets about the weather turning ugly and the highway between Calgary and Edmonton being in poor condition. A tweet with a picture of a lineup of cars not moving on the highway is forever imprinted onto my eyes. Again, I didn't pick up my phone and text my brother to ask him if he was on the road, as I usually would have. Instead, I took one more look at my screen, realized I was late for a meeting and got up from my desk. Those cars were stopped because my brother was involved in a collision on that road, a collision that would take his life.

At the exact moment at which my brother took his last breath, I sat in a mindless meeting, making notes of something so insignificant. I ended my work day and got into my car, having

two phone calls with friends, again about something that mattered so much at that point and in a matter of an hour would seem so inconsequential because life was to be changed in ways that left all the events leading up to this one moment, coloured in a different light. I will always wonder what it meant that I didn't get a feeling something was horribly wrong.

I was still on my phone when I walked into the home finding my mom coming to stand close to me and at a distance I saw my younger brother sitting on the couch in silence while the television was on but showing nothing. This wasn't right. Why wasn't he at work? My mom interrupted my call with the words "hang up, something happened".

The minutes, hours and even days after that are remembered with the most vivid detail and the foggiest recollections I have ever had in my memory. Maybe at a different time I will have the strength to put those moments into discernible words. For now, they live inside of me, finding their way to the forefront of my eyes at moments most and least expected. It is a film I cannot choose to play, pause or edit when I deem fit. They are the faces and anguish of my parents, my brother, my sister in law, my grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins and friends, each experiencing their individual despair amongst our collective unfathomable loss.

Within the chaos I knew someone was waiting for a statement from the family. I sat in the basement typing on my laptop, writing words that didn't seem real but also came together faster than I would ever expect. It's a statement that I never wish I had to write. It's a statement I have critiqued a thousand times over ever since. Much like everything I have said about my brother since this has all happened; I never feel the right words are strung together to share the profound love that I have for him. Even now I write this thinking as soon as it is submitted I will know I should have said less or maybe I should have said more and should have said it

differently and far more eloquently. While finishing up writing up the statement, along with other family and friends, I had Jim Prentice by my side, the former Premier of Alberta and a dear friend of my brother's, beloved by my entire family as one of our own, even before he spent the better part of the next week by our sides, grieving with us as only family can. When I started out with this project Jim was the first person on my list of people I wanted to talk to, fate would not make that possible. It was Jim who suggested that the statement end with a hashtag. Though he didn't quite refer to it that way because he wasn't one to brand himself as the most social media savvy person, we understood what he meant. I remember my cousin Sharon Shergill saying "What about nice to Manmeet you?" It felt right.

Grief has a way of making you feel like you belong to something bigger than yourself and yet can leave you feeling so isolated all in the same breath. You find people around you mourning the same person that you are mourning but in ways that are so different. Sometimes in a crowded room you want nothing but to be alone and other times your solitude leaves you crying for help when no one seems to hear you or see you. When you lose someone, especially someone who lived a large part of their life as a public figure, you find yourself overwhelmed with the outpouring of grief and support. You are left feeling a deep sense of gratitude for those that stop what they are doing for a few minutes, a few hours or maybe even a few days, to reach out to you and remember that your world has essentially stopped. At times this gratitude also leads to questioning how so many people can miss the same person that you and your family are missing. You find yourself trying to balance your own loss and grief with those that want to reach out to you. And then, you are reminded that in a world where death finds itself falling on countless families every day, yours is blessed to have not only people you know, but complete

strangers recognize your loved one as one of their own. It is truly humbling. It shows you that as he was in life, he is in death, yours but also so many others'.

In writing this research paper I found myself in awe of the thoughts and moments that have been shared in remembrance of my brother. Posts that left me smiling remembering what happiness felt like, and crying knowing the time since he left us has been marked with a fondness for the past and sadness for the future that we will always grieve. I have read these posts countless times over the last few months and I find myself feeling the anguish every time as if the loss is fresher than ever. When we lose someone, we grieve not only the life that they had but also the life that they were to have. The profiles of each one of my family members serves as a diary of their feelings and I wish so much that they were able to add new memories with my brother and not just memories of him. Selecting only a few posts was an impossible task and that is why I have included them in their entirety in Appendix F.

Much like the theoretical framework that forms the basis of this case study, my family is not about leaving someone behind. Our love is fierce, protective, all-encompassing and without end. In the face of a loss that will always remain incomprehensible we allow our love for Meeta to grow. From the immediate days after losing him to today, I hear people utter the words moving on and moving forward. Though they are only words, they are words that do not sit well with me. Maybe it implies to me leaving those we love in the past, having to somehow move past them in order to be all right. Instead, I find myself often thinking we have to *carry on and carry forward*. With that change from move to carry, I think that in all we do we carry our loved one with us; we carry their love, their legacy, and them, forward. We talk with them, we talk about them, we remember their lessons and have them serve as our moral guides and we feel their

presence in ways that are inexplicable. We do this because the alternative of feeling as though they are no longer a part of us tears us to shreds, leaves us unable to breathe and renders us powerless under the weight of a world without them.

We are taught to think that the loss of our loves ones comes in a particular order; parents before children, older before younger. Foolishly, I felt that for all of my life's moments I would have my brother standing by my side. One day we would have to mourn the loss of our elders but I knew that I would be equipped to do so because I would have my brother with me. And then, life did what it always does; it didn't follow the logic we set out to follow. My brother is and always will be the most important man in my life. It is the relationship that will sustain me, guide me, and carry me forward.

At our last dinner together as a family, he reminded me to complete my Masters. His desire for me to be more and pursue more is a voice I hear clearly. He would not consider this project as an end goal; he would see it as a beginning, because there is always more to be done.

To my family and friends, we are one, and we honour Meeta by continuing our bond as a family. My unwavering gratitude and love follows you in all that you do. Thank you for your support over these past 22 months and your support of this project, your words literally provided me with what I needed to get this done. Thank you in particular to Dr. Parabhdeep Bhullar-Lail, Hamreet Sekhon and Jagmeet Sekhon, for providing me with your encouragement, clarity and support of this project.

I am and always will be defined by my family and what we endure together.



Ministerial Statements

The Speaker: Allow me, hon. members, on behalf of all of you to acknowledge to each and every one of you and particularly the party caucuses that in spite of the differences of opinion that get discussed in this Legislature, I've had a real sense of the loss that you've all shared, and your co-operation has been quite exceptional. I would therefore call upon the hon. Premier to make some remarks.



Ms Notley: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. On another day I would be happy for an occasion to rise in the House and shower a member with praise. Today I wish with all my heart that there was no need to do such a thing. I'm deeply saddened by the loss of Manmeet Bhullar. We have all lost a dear friend to a tragic accident, and we can only pay him the tribute he so richly deserves in his absence.

Today we remember our colleague the late Member for Calgary-Greenway. I count myself lucky in that I had the pleasure of his acquaintance for seven years. He and I both became MLAs in the same election, as part of the class of 2008. He was a lot younger than me.

He was just 28, the youngest MLA ever elected at that time, and he already had an impressive history of public service behind him. He'd organized a youth group in Calgary. He'd volunteered generously to raise money for community and youth causes. His community leadership had attracted recognition that led to his receiving the Alberta centennial medal, the centennial medallion, and the Athabasca University leadership award. He came to public life with a determination to do even more for his community.

As new MLAs we had a lot to learn about this Legislature, about our new responsibilities, and about each other, and it wasn't long before I grew to appreciate his good humour, his sense of duty, his sharp intelligence, and his powerful compassion, fuelled by his faith. He served the people of Calgary-Greenway and all Albertans as an MLA and as a minister of the Crown always with utmost integrity and dedication. Clearly, he was always meant to accomplish great work.

As Minister of Service Alberta he acted to protect Albertans from unscrupulous contractors while homeowners were rebuilding after the southern Alberta floods. That protection went as far as laying charges. His special passion was advocating for the vulnerable in our province, especially children. That passion found its expression when he became Minister of Human Services, responsible for children in care. He led the move to greater transparency and reporting on fatalities of children in care. He led it with an unprecedented openness born, I believe, out of a confidence that, he felt, it was simply the right thing to do.

Whether in government or in opposition, Manmeet was accessible, authentic, committed, and very capable. He had a special place in his big heart for people trying to escape discrimination and threats of

refugees. Just two weeks ago he spoke passionately in the Legislature on issues of human rights in Pakistan, India, and Afghanistan. Manmeet was also very gracious, and just last week, as we ended our estimates debate on Executive Council, he offered up his very generous and personal praise of and directly to public officials for the work that they do both now and when they worked with him. He saw the good in everyone around him, and when confronted with hurt, his first instinct was to do whatever he could to put it right. It was typical of the Member for Calgary-Greenway that he would stop to help someone in need, stepping from the warmth of his vehicle in the midst of a heavy snowstorm. For him there was no other way to live. He thought of others before himself. With his energy and his youth and his passion I truly expected to see Manmeet in public life for decades to come, and I believe without question that Albertans are worse for the fact that we will not.

My thoughts continue to be with his family, his friends, and his colleagues. A family has lost a son and a husband, Calgary-Greenway has lost a champion, Albertans have lost a strong voice, the Progressive Conservative caucus has lost a loyal member, and this House has lost a colleague, a good and decent man.

His passing is a reminder that the members of this House are a family despite the differences between us and the disagreements they sometimes provoke, and we will do what every family does when it loses a loved one: we will grieve together, we will draw strength from one another, we will help each other to heal, and most of all we will never forget the per-

son we lost, the Member for Calgary-Greenway, Manmeet Bhullar.

The Speaker: The Leader of Her Majesty's Official Opposition.

Mr. Jean: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. A fitting day is the birthday of the first Sikh guru. [Remarks in Punjabi] Greetings. [As submitted] Namaste. It is with great sadness that I rise today to speak on the passing of the Member for Calgary-Greenway, our dear friend and colleague Mr. Manmeet Singh Bhullar.

Death will always carry with it an incredible sense of pain. In all of mankind's endeavours to understand the deepest mysteries of the world, nothing has remained more elusive or out of reach than comprehend-

ing the meaning of death. It touches us all. As families, as different communities of faith, as a society we have all learned that there is simply no easy remedy, no tonic, no invention that can mend the grief and brokenness we all feel in our hearts with such a sudden loss of life. So we look to each other, we turn to our individual faiths, we pray for one another, and we remember in our own way this man. We take comfort in seeking and understanding a simple truth. That truth is that we were put on Earth with a meaning and for a purpose, a purpose to love one

another, a purpose to serve one another and our fellow persons, and a purpose to make a positive difference in our world for others.

We stand in this Chamber where giants have truly stood, where the dedication of men and women who, with far-reaching vision, have sought to see Alberta be the very best it can be. We are known around the world as a refuge and as a place to be. Manmeet Bhullar brought part of that reputation here. The dedication of men and women from Alberta, people with far-reaching vision, is known. This week we have lost one of our finest, friendliest, and kindly giants – I don't mean in stature although that is true; I mean in purpose, vision, and accomplishment – a

man who, with a deep sense of patriotism and commitment to his province and country, sought to bring people together, a man who, in deep commitment to his Sikh heritage and faith, always sought to be the champion of the needs of the afflicted, the needy, and the vulnerable. We could take a great example from him, and we should.

Manmeet accomplished much in public life. Before he became an elected official at the age of 28, he served as an adviser to our former Premier Jim Prentice. Upon his election he promised to be an MLA who bridged people together, and, in my opinion, his ability to stay true to this pledge is among his greatest accomplishments. As Service Alberta minister he made some

important reforms. As Infrastructure minister he proudly championed new schools and other important projects right across the province. But I believe that in the eyes of history he will be most fondly remembered for his work and accomplishments overseeing the Department of Human Services. There is perhaps no ministry in any provincial government that requires such empathy, compassion, and humanity. During his time in office there was perhaps no one who better exemplified these particular traits. Lifting the veil for families and our most vulnerable



children will always, without question, be one of his crowning achievements. But it is the love he felt for those without a voice that we will all remember in our hearts. He truly felt it and lived it.

In opposition his service continued. His most recent advocacy work, to help refugees and at-risk minorities in Afghanistan, was just the sort of project he would champion and talk about frequently to his friends.

To his family, friends, caucus, and all of his colleagues here today, deepest condolences. To his father and mother. Bill and Sukhvir Bhullar, and to his wife, Namrita, my personal sympathies: no greater loss than a son. We all hope and pray for a comfort that is beyond understanding and that will surround them all, all of us, during this difficult time.

Manmeet truly had limitless potential in what he had to offer our province. We will always be a little less for the silencing of such a large, towering individual. But his family can be reassured; Alberta will forever hear his voice. Mr. Speaker, we are all saddened here today, but the work of this place must continue. He would want that. Manmeet Bhul-

lar's work will continue. We must do that. Let us all strive every day to be like Manmeet and do all that we can to help Albertans, to help Alberta be the best it can be, especially for those in need. That would be what he would want.

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Government House Leader.

Mr. Mason: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I would seek the unanimous consent of the House so that the leader of the Progressive Conservative party, the Member for Calgary-Mountain View, and

the Member for Calgary-Elbow be able to respond to the Premier's statement and that in the case of the leader of the Progressive Conservative party the customary three-minute limit be set aside. [Unanimous consent granted]

The Speaker: The hon. member, the leader of the third party.

Mr. McIver: Thanks, Mr. Speaker. The PC caucus would like to thank all other members of the House

Ric McIver, Leader of the Progressive Conservative Opposition for your understanding. As we gather here today, there's a hole in our close-knit caucus. It's not just a physical hole. You can see the flag-draped desk here amongst us. It's a reminder that one of our family members is missing and is missed. There's a hole in our hearts. The Member for Calgary-Greenway, Manmeet Singh Bhullar, was not just our colleague: he was a son. a husband, a brother, a friend, a confidant, community leader, and the heart of the PC caucus. His death on Monday has left us heartbroken.

Manmeet, Manny or Meeta if you prefer, was first elected to this Legislature in March 2008, but many of us in this House knew him long before. In the hours following his leaving us, we heard from some hon.

members who told us that they played sports with Manmeet, they went to school with him, they served on a community board with him, or they campaigned with him long before he ran himself. I knew him when I arranged with him and the then mayor Bronconnier to declare the first-ever Sikh Awareness Week in Calgary. Even then, years ago and not far removed from his teenage years, Manmeet was inspiring young immigrants to dream big and to be part of the solution. He passionately lectured them – believe me: passionately – to embrace Canada and recognize the rule of law, the only thing that

protected their quality of life. At the same time, he was a fierce defender of the underdog and would not stand for the bullying of minorities. I remember him talking about getting taunted for switching from his turban to his helmet when he was playing high school football. Now, he did crack a bit of a sly smile when he thought about how he could settle his own scores on the football field. Lord help those who brought on Manmeet's ire, but he needed to clear the way for more modestly proportioned athletes to follow.

In the Alberta Legislature the MLA for Calgary-Greenway served on numerous committees and served as the Minister of Service Alberta, Human

Services, and Infrastructure. At the time of his first election he was the youngest caucus member. Even then he knew it.

Manmeet the advocate and MLA accomplished more in his short years than some will fulfill in a long, long lifetime. He was involved in helping so many people and organizations, and his philanthropy and advocacy knew no borders. Manmeet was not bound by the borders of Alberta or even Canada. Recently he was on a personal mission to south Asia to find ways to protect persecuted Afghan minorities and refugees. Sometimes heck, most of the time I didn't even know where he was, and he made

this trip at his own expense. We learned yesterday that two families from Afghanistan are now safe in the Punjab thanks to Manmeet's efforts.

I'd like to share some remembrances from our PC caucus members. The Member for Calgary-Lougheed will always remember Meeta as a, quote, spiritual mountain of a man. He loved him like a brother, a very much younger, bigger brother with a much more impressive beard. He particularly notes working side by side with Manmeet to secure assistance for the people of Nepal after its devastating earthquake.

The Member for Calgary-North West laughs when she remembers how often he liked to point out that he watched her on TV since, as he said, he was a very young child – and she joked that this was his way of pointing out how much older she was than him – and how he always wanted her to sing the channel 2 and channel 7 theme songs. She has now admitted that she has never had the heart to confess to him that she didn't know all of the words.

The Member for Calgary-West remembers Manmeet advocating fiercely for him when he decided to enter politics, and he remarked on the way that Manmeet had such a profound effect on any room that he walked into, including this one. Manmeet Bhullar

never went anywhere unnoticed.

The Member for Grande Prairie-Wapiti remembers two years of sitting beside Manmeet in this Chamber and listening to him belt out *O Canada* with his powerful lungs. He says that Manny was great at many things; singing was not one of those things, and he smiles at the tone-deaf version of our national anthem that he endured on the front bench during that time.

The Member for Calgary-Fish Creek said that he had the honour of working with Manmeet in the community for just causes and through the mutual engagement in the rich fabric of diversity we're all blessed with in Alberta long before he was honoured to serve literally elbow to elbow with Manmeet as a legislative col-

league, and he's grateful for the time he has shared working closely with him over the past six months.

The Member for Vermilion-Lloydminster remembers being told that his Movember mustache didn't compare to Manmeet's facial hair when Manmeet was 12 years old.

Dr. Starke: And it's true.

Mr. McIver: Yeah, it's true, too.

He loved Manmeet's sense of humour and admired his energy.



Finally, a message from the Member for Calgary-South East: Manny, I will miss our chats, your quiet wisdom, and your smile; it was so nice to Manmeet you. We have heard that line a lot in the last few days. It was a hash tag trending on social media, and it gave Albertans a place to share some wonderful memories of our friend. I have picked out just a few.

Since the news broke of Manmeet's passing, we have heard from current and former colleagues, members of the press gallery, constituents, family, and many members of this House. The PC caucus is most appreciative of all the kind words and wonderful descriptions of Meeta, the anecdotes of precious memories of him and the insights into his character that we have seen and heard: a big man with a big heart and, even then, larger than life, a brother, best friend, hero, a passionate advocate for Alberta, a humanitarian. And, apparently, Manmeet gave the very best hugs.

Yesterday our caucus went to pay our respects to the Bhullar family, and it wasn't hard to see where Manmeet got his strength, his pride, and his courage. As they grieved, they told wonderful stories about the boy they loved and the man they were so proud of.

As Manmeet would say: I've got this.

His grandmother talked about how he always wanted her to tell her stories. He could never get enough of his grandmother's stories. It was only a week ago when he had to leave before one of her stories was finished, and she told us now that they will never get to finish it. His unfinished story is perhaps the saddest thing in our hearts. Farewell, Meeta. Thank you for the time you gave us. Thank you for the inspiration. We love you, and now it is up to us to continue the great work you have always done. [Standing ovation]



The Speaker: Hon. member, I'm pleased to say that one of my first remembrances of your peer was in my very novice days in this House. Apparently, he had stood to ask a question, and I saw a shadow come over the room. I wondered where it came from. I then said: Hon. member, I'm sorry; I didn't see you. He looked at himself. He said: we really are going to have trouble with this new Speaker from here on in.

Our condolences to you and your peers in your party. I know that these members are with you.

Dr. Swann: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. To the Sikh community gathered here today: namaste. I appreciate this opportunity to add a few words and

comments on this sad occasion. Like everyone, I was deeply shocked, saddened to hear of the death of our colleague Manmeet Bhullar. Manmeet was a passionate, hard-working, good-hearted servant of the community. This House has lost one of our most respected members. We will feel his absence every day.

Although I did not always agree with Manmeet, I never doubted he was working for what he thought would be the best interests of Alberta. In particular, I'll remember his hard work in making public the names of children who died in government care.

To the Bhullar family: the people of this province extend our deepest thanks for so generously lending Manmeet to public life for these past years. Indeed, everyone in this Chamber knows all too well the sacrifices our families are asked to make so that we can serve here. As you so beautifully described, we understand that with Manmeet and the Bhullar family – the light has gone out of our lives. It's my sincere hope that you know that his light also helped make our province brighter.

The Speaker: The hon. leader of the Alberta Party.

Mr. Clark: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. It is a sad day but a tremendous honour to stand here today and speak about a great man. The last time I had a long discussion with Manmeet was after he gave his moving speech in celebration of Diwali. The Legislature rotunda was absolutely captivated, and there was silence as he talked about the persecution of Sikhs. Despite the anger that this persecution rightly generates, he spoke of the fact that it is only light that can fight darkness. Now, he was a big man, as we've heard today, and his stature got lots of attention, but much more than that I remember his words. His words were tremendously powerful, passionate, intelligent, meaningful.

A lot has been said about the work he did in this House and the very public way he supported his community and stood up for vulnerable Albertans, but what many don't know, of course, that we've now talked about today, is the work that he did quietly all around the world, helping those people badly in need, not for glory or for personal reward but because it was necessary and he knew that he could help. Manmeet worked tirelessly behind the scenes trying to help Sikh and Hindu families living in Afghanistan who faced constant discrimination and the inability to fully practise their faith in the face of threats of violence.

He spent his own money travelling the world in order to help those who needed his aid, using his significant personal charisma and experience to insert himself into conversations with officials in Brussels, India, and other parts of Asia in order to advocate for his community, and I think it's important to note that he inserted himself into those conversations whether they liked it or not. He stepped in to help because he could, because he knew it was needed, and there really is no more fitting tribute to Manmeet Bhullar than to recognize his work helping others.

He is exactly the sort of person we need in public office, and the world needs more Manmeet Bhullar, not less.

His loss is absolutely devastating, and I can't imagine what his family is going through, nor his community, nor his colleagues in the PC caucus and your staff. My team has connections to yours, as I'm sure you know, and on their behalf I offer our sincerest condolences and offer any support you need at any time.



Oral Question Period

The Speaker: The Leader of Her Majesty's Official Opposition.

Mr. Jean: Mr. Speaker, this question, like all of our questions today, is based on one that was asked by our dear friend Manmeet Singh Bhullar. I'm going to talk about the government's least favourite subject, the economy and jobs. Premier, there are many things that you cannot control in the economy – for example, the price of oil and other countries' oil production levels – but you can control your policy responses to the economy. Do you really think now is the right time to implement tax hikes, that can result in massive job losses?

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Well, first of all, the economy-wide carbon price, which our government announced that it would be implementing as part of its climate change strategy, a strategy which I believe is long overdue and a strategy that will make Alberta a leader not only on a national stage but on the world stage, will be completely recycled back into the economy because it is those very issues that we are very concerned about. We understand that the economy is vulnerable, and therefore we are committed to ensuring that that carbon pricing is recycled back in and, in fact, will almost inevitably create more jobs, not less.

Mr. Jean: We are already number one in the world of oil-producing countries with our environment.

Again, from the Member for Calgary-Greenway on June 22: "I represent the people of Alberta, and I'll fight to make sure their jobs are looked after, Madam Premier." Will the Premier please tell us what her plan is to find thousands of Albertans new jobs when their employers pick up and move to Saskatchewan or to British Columbia because of her government's new taxes and bad policies?

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Well, thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I think it's really important to understand that even with the implementation of the climate change leadership plan, that I was proud to announce on Sunday, Alberta overall remains the lowest taxed jurisdiction in the country, to the tune of about \$8 billion, and that's not actually going to change. So the fact of the matter is that we're not particularly worried about jobs leaving, nor are we worried about emissions leakage because we worked very hard with industrial and economic leaders across the province to put together this plan. We have the endorsement of many leaders within those communities because

they see that this is actually a good way forward for our province.



Mr. Jean: The Premier forgot to ask the people that pay the tax, the citizens of Alberta, how they felt about the \$3 billion tax, which is, again based on a question from Manmeet Bhullar:

Madam Premier, it is your opportunity now to protect the economic interests of hard-working Albertans. How, ma'am, are you going to protect a dry cleaner, how are you going to protect a pizza shop owner, how are you going to protect your neighbourhood florist by raising their [business] taxes by 20 per cent or by saddling them with a carbon tax? I added the last part about the carbon tax, but he would've if he was here today.

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Well, indeed, when we introduced our climate leadership plan on Sunday, one of the things that we talked about was different models for rebating the economywide carbon price to particular parts of the economy, and one of those parts is the small businesses that were just outlined by the member opposite. You can anticipate that we will actually be reaching out to small businesses to ensure that any negative consequences from the plan will be addressed and, in fact, that they would be able to benefit from a number of incentives to bring about the kinds of emissions reductions that all Albertans and our children need us to make real.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Lougheed.

Mr. Rodney: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Hon. Bhullar truly lived the spirit of namaste, and one of his final projects was the protection of vulnerable minorities in Afghanistan. When the world's attention was rightly focused on the Syrian crisis, Manmeet did not forget the critical needs of the 2,500 remaining Afghan Sikhs and Hindus out of over 200,000, most of whom had fled or perished during almost four decades of festering violence. Now, this summer he undertook a personal mission to south Asia, drawing upon his rich, world-wide network of relationships to acquire homes and jobs, medical care, and schooling for asylum seekers abroad. To the Premier: how will humanitarian efforts like these held dear by hon. Bhullar be supported by the government of Alberta?

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Well, thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I've always found the advocacy from the Member for Calgary-Greenway for religious minorities incredibly commendable, and a number of the organizations that he thought were important, whether it be Women for Afghan Women, the World Sikh Organization, the Organization of Human Welfare, and a number of different government officials and volunteers, undertake incredibly valuable work in our province and abroad, and our government will continue to support the work of these innovators as they work to promote human rights and as they work to promote effective settlement because they reflect the values that I think all Albertans want to see lived every day.

Mr. Rodney: Thank you, Premier. While meeting with Afghan minorities who had fled the country, hon. Bhullar discovered that many of them had been systematically prevented by locals and sometimes by government from practising their religion, obtaining education for their children, and accessing basic health care. He also learned that Afghan authorities could not protect Sikh and Hindu women from forced marriage and religious conversion. Manmeet expressed his passion for helping those most in need through a promise to help Afghan minorities that the world has forgotten. Again to the Premier. Please tell us: what can the government of Alberta and in-

deed all Albertans learn from Manmeet's commitment to safe and supportive social environments, which will enable Albertans to truly realize their dreams?

Ms Notley: Well, I think that it's fair to say that Manmeet Singh Bhullar's ideas about how we need to reach out and make sure that the fundamental human rights of people all over the world are respected are one of the reasons why people are so moved by and troubled by what happened on Monday. He was a person who spoke for values that are held deeply in many of our hearts, values of inclusion, values of freedom, values of respect for people regardless

of their religion and indeed sometimes in respect of their religion. We are a strong and free province because of the diversity we have in this province. Mr. Bhullar knew that, and we will do everything we can to continue that legacy in the work that we do.

Mr. Rodney: One of hon. Bhullar's greatest passions was striving to ensure that all Albertans are treated with the dignity and respect that they deserve, and that includes everyone: citizens, permanent residents, and those seeking to become Albertans. Manmeet sought to bring Afghan refugees to our province with the hope that they would experience and enjoy an environment in which they had the opportunity not just to survive but to thrive and

in which they were afforded protection from basic human rights violations and systemic discrimination. Finally, to the Premier: what can the government of Alberta do to ensure that refugees, new Canadians from Afghanistan, Nepal, and all over the world will have the opportunity to live in an open and welcoming environment in the future regardless of where they're from?

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. The member's question underscores the importance of our province doing its part to help those from war-torn areas who face violence, oppression, and poverty every day. The thriving communi-

ties that we already have in Alberta demonstrate that our province welcomes people from many faiths and many countries. It also underscores the need to reach out to those people when they come to our province, to include them in our communities, to include them in our institutions, to help them with language support, and to ensure that they are genuinely, quickly part of our family. That's the way to make sure that they live in the way that the member has so eloquently described and that Manmeet Bhullar was seeking to have happen.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Grande Prairie-Wapiti.



Mr. Drysdale: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Member for Calgary-Greenway was a tireless champion for openness and transparency in government. During his time as Minister of Infrastructure he oversaw the creation of a website that tracked the progress of school builds in all communities around the province. This system was designed to show Albertans when and where they can expect new spaces for students. The member said that the interactive website "was a very powerful tool by which people could see regular progress on projects." To the Minister of Infrastructure. In estimates you outlined that this website would be restored as soon as the updating of information is complete, and we applaud that commitment. When will this happen?

The Speaker: The hon. Minister of Infrastructure.

Mr. Mason: Thank you very much for the question, Mr. Speaker, and to the hon. Member. The website that was created when the hon. Member for Calgary-Greenway was Minister of Infrastructure is a great tool to see progress on the development of schools in the province, and I share the member's desire for more openness and transparency. We expect that updated school build information will be loaded on the site in coming weeks. A full list of the schools can be seen at infrastructure. alberta.ca, and we're working with school boards to confirm remaining details and aim to relaunch projects. alberta.ca very soon. I would also like to announce today that we will be expanding the site to include progress updates for all capital projects.

The Speaker: First supplemental.

Mr. Drysdale: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you to the minister for the response. Again to the minister: given that the last motion submitted by the Member for Calgary-Greenway urged the government to accept this policy, the practice of disclosing any relevant legislation and policies upon which it bases decisions affecting Albertans, will your government commit to ensuring that this measure of transparency is followed through by making public this type of information?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Mason: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, and thank you for the question. I know that the Member for Calgary-Greenway was a believer in transparency and accountability. He could always be counted on to put forward creative ideas to solve problems. The motion that he put forward is an example of that approach. I want to tell the member and the House that we believe that this is an interesting idea that is worth consideration as we move forward with our work to strengthen transparency and accountability in government.



The Speaker: Second supplemental.

Mr. Drysdale: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Minister, for the response. Again to the minister: given that the Member for Calgary-Greenway was most passionate about child welfare and youth vulnerability and given that the member's vision was to push for continuous improvement of supports for vulnerable children and their families, how is this government ensuring that the Member for Calgary-Greenway's five-point plan is being implemented and strengthened to continuously improve the child intervention system?

The Speaker: The Minister of Human Services.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Member, for the question. Our government agrees in principle with the five-point plan, which highlighted the need to address the root causes of many issues that affect the safety and well-being of children such as poverty, addiction, sexual abuse, mental health, and family violence. Our government will continue to fund sexual assault centres and will invest in preventative measures and programs such as FCSS, family and community support services, and the like to address these important issues.

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-South East.

Mr. Fraser: Mr. Speaker, I want to thank all the caucuses for their care, their grace, and their understanding during this difficult time. It means a lot.

Mr. Speaker, in speaking with Manmeet Bhullar's father last night, he spoke a bit about how he raised Manmeet. He referenced Monday's tragedy and said, and I quote: no matter what the circumstances, you must stop and help someone in need. You have to stop and help. End quote. So it's no surprise that Manmeet was such a caring, diligent, and effective advocate for his constituents. To the hon. Minister of Human Services: what improvements have been made in recent years to the ways that this government provides services to Albertans as a result of the many constituency cases Mr. Bhullar had brought to this government's attention?

The Speaker: The Minister of Human Services.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Member, for the question. We know that Manmeet was a passionate person and that he was passionate about helping others. He served in three different ministries, and because of this he was very

skilled at helping his constituents navigate the government system to access supports. While he was Human Services minister, as the hon. Premier and other members of this House mentioned, there were a number of changes that he made to support Albertans to receive and navigate those services, including opening two new Alberta sports centres in Edmonton and Red Deer, the launch of a province-wide mental health program, and a welcome to parenting initiative.

Thank you.

The Speaker: First supplemental.



Mr. Fraser: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Bhullar helped dozens of families establish themselves in Calgary and Alberta, including young doctors, nurses, dentists, engineers, accountants, transportation professionals, day home operators, labourers, researchers, and the list goes on. To the same hon. minister: which government programs have been improved to help attract and retain new Albertans to become established in Alberta based on the amazing work that Manmeet did?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Member, for the question. As many of us shared here

today, Manmeet was about helping others, and till the last moment that's essentially what he was doing. If I speak specifically to my department, the Department of Human Services, he made many important changes to this department. Specifically, I can talk about what everybody mentioned today, the publication ban around the deaths of children. There are many initiatives that we can see government-wide that he did when he was minister that will help Albertans, and there are many initiatives which he embarked upon as a community leader, as a member of his Sikh community, that will always be remembered and will set a path for future generations.

Thank you.

Mr. Fraser: Mr. Speaker, I have to say that I didn't realize there were this many people over there. Now that our good friend is gone, there's clearly a void.

You know, we all have a minute in time on this planet, and in that minute that Manmeet had, he did so much for so many. It's been referenced by the Premier and the caucuses and countless Albertans, the work that he's done. We have honoured previous advocates for people in their own right such as the hon. Grant Notley. To the Premier: would you so graciously consider naming the federal building after the hon. Manmeet Singh Bhullar?

Ms Notley: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. We absolutely believe that there should be an appropriate and ongoing tribute to the Member for Calgary-Greenway. We are beginning that, of course, in this House today, and we'll be talking more with the member's family about what future tributes might be appropriate. We welcome any and all ideas about how to appropriately pay tribute to the member and his dedication to Alberta. We've just been presented with this idea, and we will definitely give it some very vigorous consideration to honour a memory that must be acknowledged.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Elbow.

Mr. Clark: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Manmeet Singh Bhullar was a passionate advocate for his constituents and for Alberta. In the October 20 meeting of the Public Accounts Committee Mr. Bhullar asked about the operations of international student recruitment. Typically international students pay up to 3.5 times as much in tuition as domestic students because the government of Alberta does not provide them with base grant funding. This incentivizes institutions to heavily recruit international students. To the Minister of Advanced Education: are budget shortfalls in your ministry being filled through international student recruitment?

Ms Sigurdson: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, and thank you to the member for the question. Of course, it was the priority of our government upon being elected, and in our first session right away we put money back into postsecondary education to make sure that it's accessible and affordable and stable for all Albertans. That's been our priority. You know, enrolment is up. Many students are really taking advantage of this, and institutions are grateful for the new funding.

The Speaker: First supplemental.

Mr. Clark: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Now, with respect, I was asking about international students. Mr. Bhullar thought that increased revenues to the system from international students certainly felt like a commercial enterprise. In fact, international students were left out when the government reversed the postsecondary market modifiers and instituted a tuition freeze. Even more, some programs have increased international tuition by up to 30 per cent in this academic year. To the minister: why didn't the government's policies apply equally to all students studying in Alberta?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Sigurdson: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We don't have jurisdiction on controlling international tuition. Institutions do this. We are in the process, though, of very quickly rolling out the adult learning review. This is something that we have heard, the concerns about international tuition fees. We're looking at that, and we'll be listening to the community and others who are concerned about this, but right now we don't have jurisdiction over internationals. We did want to make it stable and affordable for our students here in Alberta, and that's why we moved forward very quickly to put back \$133 million in the postsecondary system.

The Speaker: Hon. member, second supplemental.

Mr. Clark: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Obviously, there's a discrepancy here between how we treat certain groups of students in this province, a discrepancy that Manmeet and his constituents were very concerned about. To the minister: will you commit to regulating international student tuition so that Alberta students are entitled to fair treatment regardless of where they come from?



The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Sigurdson: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. As I said, we are going ahead with the adult learning review,

and this will be one of the things that we're looking at. We welcome people's ideas around this. At this point we're just gathering that information. It's very important for us to hear from all groups regarding this. We look forward to reporting back after that's complete.

The Speaker: Hon. Government House Leader, I understand you may have a motion.

Mr. Mason: Yeah. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I would ask unanimous consent from the House to continue the daily Routine past 3 o'clock today. [Unanimous consent granted]

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Cross.

Miranda: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We're all very familiar with the statistics that show that indigenous women and girls are three times more likely to experience violence than nonindigenous women. Earlier this month in my own constituency of Calgary-Cross we lost Janel Squirrel to such violence. She was 26 years old and a mother of three. This needs to change. Can the Minister of Aboriginal Relations tell us what the government is doing to ensure that indigenous women are safe?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Ganley: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and to the member for the question. We know that too many indigenous women are going missing and being murdered. Each one of these women deserves to be honoured and mourned and has a family in need of healing and a community in need of answers. Alberta was proud to join these families and other provinces in the call for a national inquiry into missing and murdered indigenous women. I have had the opportunity to speak to my federal counterpart in Prime Minister Trudeau's new government, and I'm eager to get started on this important work.

The Speaker: First supplemental.

Miranda: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We can call for a national inquiry, but we need to see action now, and we need to see the dollars that are going to be invested in programs here in Alberta. Can the Minister of Aboriginal Relations tell us what initiatives are already under way that take a stand against violence towards indigenous women and girls?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Ganley: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and to the member for the question. Of course, I'm proud to see so many people today in this Legislature wearing the moosehide swatch in support of this important issue. The Moose Hide campaign was launched a year ago by the Alberta Native Friendship Centres Associa-

tion, one of our community partners. This powerful campaign asked indigenous and nonindigenous people to wear the swatch to show their commitment to standing up against violence to indigenous women and girls. We know we can be a part of the solution, and this is one way to show that commitment.

The Speaker: Second supplemental.

Miranda: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Moose Hide campaign was launched a year ago, and I truly believe in its power. We want to know what the government is doing now to show our commitment to keeping indigenous women and girls safe. To the same minister: what are we investing in today?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Ganley: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and to the member for the question. Well, this campaign was started a while ago. As we know, many of our friends across the House, including the hon. Member for Calgary-Greenway, were advocates for minorities. Certainly, our government has recently provided funding for an additional campaign. We provided \$125,000 to support the I Am a Kind Man program in nine communities across Alberta. The Alberta Native Friendship Centres Association is leading this initiative, which is based on traditional teachings, to help restore and repair family relationships in the indigenous community.

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-North West.

Ms Jansen: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you to my colleagues today for all your kind words. My friend the Member for Calgary-Greenway was someone who had a great passion for fighting injustice. He fostered a sense of hope wherever he went, asking the difficult questions, holding everyone to account, and making sure that the attention of the government was always squarely focused on the lives and needs of Albertans. When he saw a prob-

lem or someone who needed help, he would act. It's an example that we in this House should all strive for. To the Premier: how will you ensure that your government and your ministers remain focused on accountability and achieving the best possible outcome for Albertans, as Manmeet Bhullar did?

The Speaker: The hon. Premier.

Ms Notley: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you for the question. As has been mentioned before but I think bears repeating, Manmeet Bhullar, of course, took a very major step forward in terms of releasing the publication ban and moving forward in terms of reporting and the scope of reporting of fatalities and

injuries that occurred to children in care or receiving services. That information is the first part of accountability, so I think that we need to remember that and, of course, move on from that, which we will do and I'll talk about more in another question.

But I'd like to just say one thing, which I didn't have a chance to say before. When we talk about Human Services - you know, back when I was in opposition, it was a critic area for me, and it is arguable at the time that I had more access to front-line workers and information from front-line workers than those in government at the time might have had. I think it's important for all of you to know that I heard from most frontline workers that there was a tremendous level of

respect for the work that Manmeet Bhullar did at that time. He was very much seen by the people who worked for him as a champion for their cause.

Ms Jansen: Thank you to the Premier. One of the great successes, as the Premier just mentioned, of Minister Bhullar's tenure was the ending of the publication ban on children who died in care. The Member for Calgary-Greenway moved immediately to take action to open up the system to Albertans. To the Minister of Human Services now: what steps will you take to build on those accomplishments?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Member, for the question. As has been mentioned in this House, removing that ban was a huge achievement and a huge step forward in Human Services. Building on that, we will try to improve those services to take it another step forward by bringing in an independent mechanism to independently investigate all deaths of children in the care of the province.

Thank you.

The Speaker: Second supplemental.

Ms Jansen: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Finally, in February of last year the Member for Calgary-Greenway announced that the government would be putting up \$5 million to ensure that children facing mental health issues can get help as quickly as they can. Again to the Minister of Human Services: given the rising issues we have seen with addiction amongst our young people, can the minister assure this House that the plan and the funding committed by the Member for Calgary-Greenway are still in place?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, Member. We know that children involved with the intervention system are at higher risk to develop mental health disorders, and the funds committed by Manmeet Bhullar will continue within the children intervention division of Human Services. We have also added \$37 million back into the intervention system, which will also help us improve the lives of these children and youth. We have also launched a mental health review, which will also help us assess our needs and determine the path forward.

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Hays.

Mr. McIver: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Bhullar was Mr. Community Initiatives. Some members and staff remember accompanying Manmeet on one of his many mid-session trips between Edmonton and Calgary to unveil a facility in Calgary in the morning, attend question period, a community fundraiser in the afternoon, and back to Calgary for a community event that night. Many of us remember Manmeet – and he has some fame – as the first turbanwearing Sikh minister in the Alberta Legislature, and who can forget his emotional address during the recent Diwali celebrations here in the Legislature. To the minister of culture: what can you do to assist MLAs in this House and their staff to learn to best support Alberta's increasingly diverse population to establish success and, in so doing, strengthen all of Alberta?

The Speaker: The hon. minister of culture.

Mr. Eggen: Thanks, Mr. Speaker, and thank you so much for the question. I know that Manmeet was a tireless community advocate and had an amazing capacity to — I saw him, at one point, appear in two gurdwaras in two different cities in one single day. I know that he worked very hard to not just access the community development funds that we have through the ministry of culture for northeast Calgary but for the whole province as well, and you can see his work made manifest on many plaques around the province and you see where he's got the money for the important community work that he does. This year, for example, in northeast Calgary there was \$50,000 at the Cornerstone Youth Centre, which, I think, is very, very well done.

Mr. McIver: Again to the same minister. Given that Mr. Bhullar and the respective leaders of dozens of cultural and religious organizations – he supported them and helped troubleshoot their efforts to establish applications to the government. Mr. Bhullar along the way frustrated several Alberta agencies, boards, and committees by demanding that they treat ethnocultural organizations with the same due consideration as anyone else. In what ways is this government making sure that agencies, boards, and committees and government departments, for that matter, become open to Alberta's many diverse community organizations?

Mr. Eggen: Thank you for the question. Mr. Speaker, I think it's a very fitting tribute to the continuation of Manmeet's work that we look to ensure that we have cultural diversity in agencies, boards, and commissions and that we look at the grant structure. Of course, we have a long history of grants and institutions going in a certain way, but to move and to expand past some of the Eurocentric tendencies to invest in certain cultural institutions and look to having our investment as a government reflect the diversity of Alberta in 2015: certainly, all of us endeavour to do so.

Mr. McIver: Mr. Speaker, Manmeet Singh Bhullar didn't always wait for government policy to do what had to be done. He helped many young Albertans learn about and enter into the community development policy worlds in health, health care, law, public service, justice, and other careers, including using the STEP program, which the government is going to bring back, and sometimes, lots of cases, worked with parents in children's cases, that he helped resolve in the system. How will this government continue to support Mr. Bhullar's passion for fostering diversity and supporting Albertans who don't necessarily fit into the current government programs?

The Speaker: The minister of culture.

Mr. Eggen: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Certainly, Manmeet's tenacity and capacity to advocate for not just his constituents but for all Albertans is a good example to many of our new MLAs, to simply not take no for an answer, for one thing. If you perhaps didn't quite equal the physical stature of Manmeet, you could certainly work to have that tenacity in your heart. For all Albertans and for vulnerable Albertans especially, you know, I know that Manmeet would not stand down. I always like to lead by example, so I will endeavour to do so in my own personal life. Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Vermilion-Lloydminster.

Dr. Starke: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to preface my comments by stating that, certainly, the PC caucus and Manmeet's family have been greatly appreciative of the support that they have received outside of this Chamber, but I also want to say that the PC caucus is highly appreciative of all of the support we've received from inside of this Chamber, particularly from the House leaders from government, from the Official Opposition, and also from our independent members, to modify the rules under these extraordinary, exceptional circumstances - we appreciate it - and

especially to the Official Opposition caucus for affording us four additional questions so that we might be able to all ask questions.

Dr. Starke: Mr. Speaker, amongst Manmeet Bhullar's many passionate causes – and there were many of them – one that is perhaps a little bit less known is that he was a passionate advocate for midwifery. Midwifery has been recognized under Alberta's Health Professions Act since 1998. One year after Manmeet was first elected, midwifery was funded by Alberta Health Services. He was a passionate advocate for the expansion of midwifery services in Alberta. He understood that a good life began with a good birth, and he knew that skilled and compassionate midwives would provide these services to

women across Alberta, the women he so affectionately called his mothers and his sisters. To the Minister of Health: what expansion of midwifery services has Alberta seen since 2008?

The Speaker: The Minister of Health.

Ms Hoffman: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker and to the member for the question. The number of midwives in Alberta in the initial year, 2009, when it became publicly funded, was a 37 per cent increase in that year alone. Now there are approximately 90 midwives and midwifery staff appointments through

Alberta Health Services, which is great. You know, in the very first year it was funded, my niece, Anika, is proud to say that she was helped out by a midwife. It's certainly impacted our family in a personal way, and I want to say thank you for the contributions.

Dr. Starke: Mr. Speaker, one need only speak with Manny's mother and his sisters or his beloved wife to know how much he honoured and valued the role of women in our society. Now, his love for children is also very well known, and the fruits of his efforts as a role model and mentor to hundreds, if not thousands, of young people will be seen for many years to come. To the Minister of Health. In September additional funding for midwifery

services was announced. How many additional courses of care will be provided this year, and how will women be able to access these expanded care courses?

Ms Hoffman: Thank you very much for the question. More than 2,700 families will be receiving midwifery care in the coming year. That's an expansion of more than 400 supported midwifery births. There's actually a centralized database now through the midwifery website, and there are a number of communities that it's been expanded to. Some, actually, are still accepting new registrants this year. So good news: we haven't totally exceeded our capacity yet. Obviously, the demand is going to continue to grow with the expansion of this great service.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Dr. Starke: Mr. Speaker, Namrita would want to see us to continue expansion of midwifery services, not just in the number of courses that we offer, courses of care, but also in the opportunities for training new midwives in Alberta and for expanded availability of midwifery to all geographic areas of the province, including rural and urban areas. Could the Health minister share with Albertans her plans for fulfilling Manmeet's vision?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Hoffman: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and to the member for the question. We are certainly working closely with Mount Royal University and with the College of Midwives of Alberta to understand their needs and ensure that they understand the needs of women throughout Alberta. The expansion of midwifery services: I'm really proud to say that just this November we expanded to the community of Plamondon. That's great news. Additional midwifery services have also been recently added in other communities in addition to Edmonton and Calgary, which are the two where we currently have the greatest demand. We also have expanded services in Cardston, St. Albert, Medicine Hat, and underserved communities in northeast Calgary and surrounding areas as well.



Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-West.

Mr. Ellis: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. When he was Minister of Service Alberta, Manmeet Bhullar oversaw many services, including those offered by more than 200 registry agents. He always sought to ensure Albertans received efficient services while providing fairness to private-sector partners. To the Minister of Service Alberta: given that many rural-based registries are providing services at a loss to ensure rural residents have convenient access to them and given that these agents were slated to receive a dollar fee increase on July 1st, how is your government assuring the stability of rural-based registries, and will you be establishing a formula-based model for future increases?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Larivee: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you to the member for the question. I know that the Member for Calgary-Greenway believed that Service Alberta needed to continually move forward in providing quality services to the people of Alberta at the best value. Like him, we certainly value the role that registry agents play in delivering those services on behalf of the government. So we continue to work productively with registry agents to ensure that Albertans do receive the quality services they deserve, and we continue to be committed to ensuring that rural Albertans have access to the quality government services that they need.



The Speaker: First supplemental.

Mr. Ellis: Thank you, Minister, and thank you, Mr. Speaker. To the same minister: given that the province plans to offer more services online and has built the MyAlberta e-services portal to do so and given that Alberta has a proven partner which continues to offer convenient services to all citizens, will your government commit to offering registry agents the ability to participate in the government of Alberta's future plans for expanded online services?

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Larivee: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you once again to the member for the question. I certainly know that the Member for Calgary-Greenway recognized that our world is changing rapidly, and it's important that our government services keep up with the opportunities and demands that come with that. So we continue to seek opportunities to



strengthen our registry services, including expanding our online services so that Albertans who choose to access services that way will have the convenient access that they are looking for. As we move forward, I can commit to proceeding with the option that will best meet the needs of Albertans, that they have convenient services at the best value.

The Speaker: Second supplemental.

Mr. Ellis: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you to the minister. Same minister: given that the number of registries has not increased since 1993 and given that in estimates you indicated to Manmeet that you are looking into issuing requests for proposals for new registries when your ministry issues the new RFPs, will you guarantee that the government of Alberta is provided with the best value possible by ensuring the highest bidder is awarded the contract?

Thank you.

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Ms Larivee: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thanks to the member for the question. The procurement process that the government of Alberta established is open, transparent, and committed to ensuring that Albertans get the best value possible. So in terms of any possible changes to registry services I certainly can guarantee to follow that process to ensure that

we can continue to serve Albertans efficiently and effectively at the value that they expect and deserve.

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Fish Creek.

Mr. Gotfried: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to start out just adding to some comments by my colleague by thanking not only all the members of this House but you, Mr. Speaker, and all of the LAO staff for accommodating us in the House but also on the committee level as well. That's been very deeply felt by us. Thank you.

Mr. Gotfried: Born in Calgary, Manmeet grew up in an environment where the value of social and cultural fluency, in both the local and international contexts, was instilled in him at an early age. Former Premier Prentice recently mentioned meeting Manmeet when he was just 10 years old, following closely behind his father as he worked tirelessly to build a gurdwara in Calgary. His parents' example of hard work and community leadership stayed with Manmeet through his life, leading to his negotiation of a memorandum of understanding and further bridge building between the government of Alberta and the state of Punjab in India. To the minister of economic development: in what ways was this agreement to facilitate trade, enhance relationships and socioeconomic partnerships important to both postsecondary education and agriculture between the two jurisdictions?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Bilous: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, and I'll thank the hon. member for the question, recognizing that today has been quite an incredible day of learning about all the different successes that the hon. Member for Calgary-Greenway had and all the ways he touched Albertans' lives and those of the international community as well. I know that Alberta and India both share a co-operative and mutually beneficial trading relationship, and they are an important international partner for us. This agreement that the hon. member speaks of was announced in January of 2014, and it focuses on the aspects of agriculture, animal genetics to help increase trade in the areas of dairy production and swine genetics. It also established an agricultural working group to encourage communication between our jurisdictions. Our government is focused on looking at ways to increase market access and trade, and this trade agreement was made with a very similar focus, and I thank the member.

The Speaker: First supplemental.

Mr. Gotfried: Thank you. Again to the minister: given that relationships with a wide variety of peo-

ple from Alberta, Canada, and beyond were critical to Manmeet's success at home and abroad on topics as diverse as improving government services, domestic violence, and local entrepreneurship, what are the most important improvements this government is planning to ensure that its network of local and global relationships is grown and sustained in the broadest context?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Bilous: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and I'll thank the member for the question. Currently Alberta has 11 international offices, with one that is located in New Delhi. I'm working with my department to look at all of our foreign offices with an eye to efficiency, effectiveness, and productivity. We are very supportive of diversifying Alberta's economy and expanding new and existing markets, which includes a strategic and cost-effective international presence. These offices are key to sustaining these global relationships, and again I know that the Member for Calgary-Greenway was a very strong advocate and had a very strong hand in getting this office set up, which I look forward to adding to in my next response.

Thank you.

Mr. Gotfried: Thank you again to the minister, with our deepest appreciation. Given Manmeet's long-standing passion for community building based on mutual respect and understanding and given that his success in this area was an integral part of the successful signing of the aforementioned MOU with the state of Punjab and given the importance of postsecondary education and agriculture to both Alberta and Punjab, in what ways have residents of the two provinces benefited from the improved trade and partnerships, and how do you see those being strengthened in the future by this government?

The Speaker: The hon. minister.

Mr. Bilous: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, and I'll thank the member again for the question. Our strengthened ties and MOU with the state of Punjab that Manmeet worked so hard to see signed have had many benefits for the people of Alberta and Punjab. Again, I don't want to understate the role that the Member for Calgary-Greenway played in building the relationship between the state of Punjab and the government of Alberta, and for that we thank him. Punjab has benefited from an increased export market for agriculture. Approximately 72 per cent of India's population lives in rural areas, with 65 per cent employed in agriculture. The Indian agrifood industry is estimated to be worth about \$180 billion and is expected to grow to \$310 billion by 2020. Agriculture currently accounts for 17.4 per cent of India's GDP. These ties will be strengthened

as we continue to utilize our international offices to diversify Alberta's economy through expanding and existing markets.

Thank you. [Standing ovation]



The Speaker: Hon. members, I would make this observation, and I will be referencing it in my years ahead in this House. In my mind, it's going to be called the Bhullar phenomenon because today I heard people speaking, and it is a wonderful, wonderful event that we ought to repeat yet again many, many times. If you hear me mention his name in the future, you will know of what I speak. Hon. Government House Leader, I understand that we may have a motion.

Mr. Mason: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I hope you don't get too fond of this.

I would like to ask for unanimous consent that, notwithstanding Standing Order 7(4), the Member for Calgary-McCall be allowed to participate in Members' Statements today. [Unanimous consent granted]



Members' Statements

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-Foothills.

Mr. Panda: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in the House today to pay tribute to our beloved friend and colleague Manmeet Bhullar. He was a shining star of Alberta. Manmeet was a dedicated public servant. He went to work day in and day out representing the great people of Calgary-Greenway. Manmeet exhibited the core principles of Sikhism, the faith he practised and the religion that grounded him.

Mr. Speaker, today is Prakash Purab, the birthday of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the first of the 10 Sikh gurus. He was the founder of Sikhism, and his birthday is celebrated world-wide as Gurpurab. [Remarks in Punjabi] What this means is that when Guru Nanak was born, the darkness all around vanished, and there was amazing light everywhere. His main message of Sikhism is to spread the message of kindness and peace and to promote the equality of all human beings and for equal rights for women.

Manmeet Singh Bhullar was able to live a life that Guru Nanak Dev Ji called for, and all of us should be proud of this. His educational background, character traits, and his personal appearance always gave the comfort and confidence anticipated from an authentic and brave sardar ji.

When Sikhs and Hindus were persecuted in Afghanistan, the ones that could afford to managed to get out. The poor and the weak remained stuck there. Of late Manmeet had been working tirelessly to get them out also and to settle them in a safe country.

Looking at what he accomplished in his brief 35 years, it is not difficult to understand how much potential was taken away so soon. Although he is not physically with us anymore, that star will forever be enshrined in this province's history. Sir William Osler once said, "We are here to add what we can to life, not to get what we can from life." Manmeet Bhullar died doing what he always did, helping others.

In closing, I would like to extend my deepest condolences to Manmeet's family and friends here and all over the world. Our thoughts and prayers are with them. I hope that they'll find comfort in knowing that their loved one made all the difference to his community, to his province, and to his country. He served this province, and for that we are forever grateful. May he rest in peace. [Remarks in Punjabi]

The Speaker: The hon. Member for Calgary-West.



Mr. Ellis: Thank you. As Manny would say: don't worry; I've got this. Mr. Speaker, this has been a hard one. For us, losing Manmeet is like losing a partner in the line of duty. When we're up here in Edmonton, we spend more time with each other than we do with our own families. One of the reasons Manmeet and I got along so well was because the doors of both our constituency offices are always open to the people, and Manmeet listened to the people. He did not hear; he listened. And after listening, he tried to find a solution, and that's why he was so beloved. Regardless of who they were or what their background was, Manny knew that the people knew that they could go to Manmeet and that he would listen and that he would try to find a solution for you or for your people. His work at the Legislature was equally impressive. Manmeet was the first turbaned Sikh to hold a ministerial position in Alberta and, although I don't have confirmation of this, in Canada, I've heard. The symbolism of that appointment was not just significant for the Sikhs and other ethnic communities; it was important for all of us. He became Canada's most visible minority, and in doing so, he inspired anyone and everyone. For youth he was a particularly powerful symbol because they saw that in growing up in Canada, they could be who they are and could still achieve greatness. He was a man of influence in his community, and he took that responsibility to heart. Because of his physical stature – let's face it; he was a mountain of a man – we never expected the gentleness that we saw. Within moments of meeting this gentle giant, he won you over with his warm smile and his huge heart. That doesn't mean that he was a pushover. Manmeet was a force of nature, with a strong will to match his big heart. He took charge of his ministries, and he was passionate about ensuring their work was ethical and efficient. He led by example, had high expectations of the people that worked for him, and he was a natural leader. Public consultation was the hallmark of every initiative he prompted.

Along with his ministries Manmeet was passionate about other causes close to his heart. He was an advocate with regard to violence against women. In fact, on the day of his passing he had spoken on that very same subject in Calgary. I've already mentioned his constituency work, which set a fine example for all of us. His constituency office was a champion for all cultures. He had a level of understanding of a person's struggles no matter what background they came from.

Now, as a former police officer I have to take a moment to address the people involved in Monday's ac-



cident. Please don't carry the burden of guilt for the events that unfolded on that day. You've got to know that Manny would not have wanted that because he was a generous soul, and he was doing what he loved. He was helping people.

I will leave you with one final quote. As I embraced his father yesterday and we hugged and we cried, he said to me: God needed him more. But it was nice to Manmeet you. We love you, and we miss you.

The Speaker: The hon. Minister of Human Services.

Mr. Sabir: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you, colleagues, for allowing me to speak. It is with a sad heart that I rise today to speak about the untimely passing of a fellow member of this Legislature, Sardar Manmeet Singh Bhullar. A life that was dedicated to public service, to helping others, and to representing the constituents of Calgary-Greenway has been cut tragically short. Mr. Bhullar had a drive to do better for Alberta, which he showed during his seven years as a member of this Assembly and in his capacity as a minister of government, including the portfolio of Human Services, that I hold today. Manmeet wanted to make a difference in people's lives, and that's what he was doing at the time of Monday's tragic incident.

Mr. Speaker, I met Manmeet recently at various events, where he shared with me very passionately his work around Afghan Sikh refugee resettlement. In his remarks at the Diwali event here in the Legislature rotunda and at the Genesis Centre in Calgary he discussed the symbol of lights from the Diwali festival – and I paraphrase – as a metaphoric reference to stress that light must be shone in all dark corners around this globe against all oppression and against all violations of basic human and democratic rights. He certainly has shone light on many lives and worthy causes, and his work will live on in our province. His efforts will be remembered by Albertans and all those whose lives he touched.

It's beyond imagination to think of the devastation of Mr. Bhullar's family. I would just say that my thoughts and prayers go to Mr. Bhullar's family and to all those who knew and loved him, and I will join all my colleagues here to offer my heartfelt condolences to all of them.

Remarks from the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan

Hon. Mr. Ottenbreit (Yorkton): — Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in the Assembly today with a heavy heart but fond memories to join with colleagues and people from across our country to offer condolences on the tragic passing of a big man with a huge heart.

Alberta MLA Manmeet Singh Bhullar lost his life yesterday as he had selflessly stopped to help another driver who was in need during a blizzard on a busy Alberta highway, a reflection of how he lived his life. His nature was to always put others first.

Manmeet, affectionately known as Manny, cared about everyone he came into contact with. He never lost focus on the people he served, and represented not only the people of Alberta and his constituency but, as I experienced, well represented Canada when the opportunity arose.

Outside of politics, he was a dedicated family man with a strong faith, and was always community minded. I first met Manny on a trip to Germany many years ago. We were both part of a Canadian delegation. On that trip and thereafter, we developed a great professional and a very friendly personal relationship. I remember fondly his infectious laugh, his intelligence, wit, his great sense of humour, and how, no matter the circumstance, he always stood up for what was right.

Mr. Speaker, I would ask that all the members of this Assembly and the people of Saskatchewan join in offering our most sincere condolences to the Bhullar family, Manny's many friends, the Sikh community, and many colleagues. You are in our thoughts and prayers as you grapple with Manny's tragic death.

Our Premier often reminds us to strive to leave the world better than we found it. Mr. Speaker, Manny Singh Bhullar, Manny, he did. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Remarks from the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba

Hon. Greg Selinger (Premier): Mr. Speaker, it was with great sadness that I rise today on behalf of our government and my colleagues in the Legislature to express our deepest condolences to the family and friends of Alberta member of the Legislature, Manmeet Bhullar, who was tragically killed in a highway accident yesterday afternoon after he had pulled over his own vehicle to help a fellow motorist who had rolled off into the median.

It is truly touching to see the incredible outpouring of love and support from Mr. Bhullar's colleagues, friends and family. He was a deeply caring man who devoted his life to helping others. I think his own family said it best: Manmeet left us doing what he loved more than anything, helping someone else.

From Mr. Bhullar's efforts in the community, it is clear that this same caring spirit guided his work each day. As members of the Legislature, we're all trying to bring this kind of compassion to the work that we all do here. Mr. Bhullar made tremendous contributions to his community and to the province of Alberta. He was taken from us far too soon and will be deeply missed.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I ask upon conclusion of other statements in the House today that we take a moment of silence in honour of Mr. Bhullar.

Mr. Kelvin Goertzen (Steinbach): Mr. Speaker, I want to thank the Premier (Mr. Selinger) for his comments on the tragic passing of Manmeet Bhullar.

We know he was only 35 years old, but he lived an extraordinary life even within those short amount of years, being the youngest member of the Legislature in his particular election year, at age 28, to be elected.

Last night I saw on social media many of the tributes that were flowing in from his colleagues in Alberta and from his constituents, and you got a sense of a man who truly had a servant's heart and someone who truly believed in supporting and serving his constituents first among—above everything else.

We know that this Legislature, just like Alberta's, is in many ways a fraternity, but at a time of a loss—and we've experienced that here in Manitoba—it feels more like a family, Mr. Speaker, and I know that

they'll be suffering some of the same emotions in the Alberta Legislature.

We want to extend our condolences to his family and to each of his colleagues. At times like this, people look for reasons and they look for solace, and we hope that they'll find solace in the tremendous legacy that he has left both in Alberta and for his family.

Mr. Speaker, I would ask that you, under your signature, provide the comments that are made this afternoon to the Speaker of the Alberta Legislature and extend our condolences to each of the MLAs in Alberta and to the family. We hope that his legacy lives on for many, many years, and he'll always be fondly remembered.

Hon. Jon Gerrard (River Heights): It is with great sadness and sorrow that I rise to speak to the passing of Manmeet Bhullar, who was an MLA in Alberta.

It is sad whenever an MLA or MP dies in office, and particularly so when it is in a traffic—driving

traffic accident. We all, as MLAs, travel a great deal, and there is no doubt that this could happen to any one of us. I remember Gaston Péloquin, who was a Member of Parliament in Ottawa when I was there. He died in a traffic accident as well.

It is particularly tragic with Manmeet Bhullar because he was young and had done so much for others, indeed, had stopped along the road to help another individual. Manmeet Bhullar had founded a youth organization called Inspire. He co-ordinated a Walking Hunger Away campaign in Calgary. He helped connect Albertans to high-speed Internet. He led changes in child and family services to help families in Alberta. He was an individual who contributed a lot to his province, and we remember that as we mourn his passing with great sadness and extend sympathies and condolences to his family and to his friends and, indeed, to all Albertans.



Mr. Bhullar: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Let me congratulate you on once again assuming the position and being elected to the position of Speaker. You, sir, are an ambassador for Alberta values, and I salute you and I thank you.

It is a profound pleasure for me to stand today and second the Speech from the Throne. It is an honour to have been asked by the Premier. It is especially an honour because we are the government that has a vision that will take Alberta to new frontiers. This, sir, is a moment that I will forever cherish.

As the Member for Calgary-Montrose it will be an honour to serve the community in which I was born. I was born in Penbrooke in 1980, and I was born in a family of immigrants, a family of individuals that came to this country with not more than their dreams. Sir, we have come to this country, all of us. Some were born here, some families have been here for many generations, and others have just arrived, but the one common denominator is dreams. Everybody has come here with dreams. It is my hope and my pursuit to ensure that new Canadians fulfill their dreams for their families and for future generations to come, but it is also my hope and my pursuit that they engage in Alberta, they engage in Canada, and they take an active leadership position in this country to help shape the future of this province and this country.

Beyond the external diversity of my constituents there are great similarities. There are grandparents, there are parents, there are siblings, there are many children, all of whom want the same things in life. Mr. Speaker, I'm proud to say that the young families in my constituency will be delighted to know that this government is working to create 14,000 new child care spaces in this province.

Calgary-Montrose is composed of hard-working people, people that do their part and expect the government to do the same. We have proved that we are sound fiscal managers of this province, and that is why we are able to get rid of health care premiums in a fiscally responsible manner. That is giving back to our constituents.

Upon coming to Canada, she's worked many jobs, two jobs at a time, whatever it took to ensure that I and my siblings had opportunities they were never given. So this, sir, is so personal for me, and I will do everything I can to encourage young people in my constituency to complete high school and to get a postsecondary education.

Mr. Speaker, as you may know, I've devoted much of my time to working with young people. I have found that what young people often need is a mentor, a positive role model, someone that believes in them, because as Marianne Williamson once said, "Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure."

Sir, I had one such mentor, a humanitarian like none other: Bhai Jasbir Singh, a humanitarian in India who started health care initiatives, who started four hospitals where the rich went because it was the best treatment and the poor went because they could pay whatever they could afford. He was a testament to true service. It is easy for us to stand and say that we are public servants, but he received no salary for his public service. He received no benefits for his public service. In my pursuit I hope and I pray that I can just do an ounce of what he was able to do in his life.

Mr. Speaker, I see hope all around us. That hope we need to instill in our young people is all around us. The volunteers who give so tirelessly give us hope. The police officers and firefighters and EMS personnel that lay their lives on the line every single day give

us hope. The teachers who see potential in children that children don't see in themselves and in some cases potential that parents don't even see in children: that gives me hope. The nurses who take an extra minute to comfort a patient give me hope. The single mother who doesn't let the fatigue of a long day of work at home and outside of the home prevent her from reading to her children every night gives me hope.

Sir, the woman I met door-knocking who is raising her grandchildren because, as she put it, her daughter was not ready to grow up—this woman fought for legal custody of her grandchildren so that she could give them some opportunity, give them some hope—gives me hope. Now, the beautiful part of that is that we chatted for some 15 to 20 minutes at her doorstep, and I said: "You know, I applaud you. I applaud you for being so strong." She said to me: "You know, most days I don't feel strong. Most days I actually feel quite weak, and some mornings I wake up thinking I don't know if I can carry on with this." I wasn't quite sure what to say, but as I looked in her eyes, I could see the tears.

The answer was that she is stronger than most of us because in spite of fear, she acts. In spite of being terribly afraid, she acted. In spite of being terribly afraid for the future of her children, she acted. I applaud her for her strength and courage to take such a bold step. She is the sort of individual that gives me hope.

Yesterday's Speech from the Throne offers hope for the present, hope for the future, and hope for taking advantage of all that Alberta has to offer. The government is putting forward an ambitious plan that appeals to Albertans' wants and needs. This is a track that delivers on promises and offers an ever-increasing quality of life. My constituents are going to be pleased with the new ring road around Calgary because that's more time they get to spend at home instead of in traffic. By making it a priority to improve the efficiency and the effectiveness of health care delivery and providing hospitals to meet the needs of a growing province, we are demonstrating, sir, that the government has the right plan for health care.

There's one more story that I must share, and it's of a constituent I met during the campaign. My volunteer knocked on her door and said, you know: I'm here with your candidate. We heard some rustling, and after about a minute the door opened. I was shocked to see a young woman standing before me in tears. I said: "My apologies. I don't mean to interrupt you. You seem to be going through something." She said: "No, I wanted to open the door for you. I've just lost somebody, but I still wanted to meet you."

That moment touched me because it shows us the great position we are in. The people of this province and the people of Calgary-Montrose have entrusted us with such a position. We shall never take this for granted. This shows me the importance of public life, something that we should remember when we take every action, something that we should consider every time we make a decision and have to consider whether it's a decision for greatness or if it's just a political move.

I want to inspire young people in my constituency. I want to inspire a generation of young people, and if I can inspire just one of them to get a postsecondary education, I will have done my job. In order to inspire young people, though, we need to ensure that instead of our young people feeling inadequate, we must instill in them the understanding that they have the seeds of greatness implanted in them. Instead of our young people feeling limited because of the financial means of their parents, we must express to them that they have unlimited potential and unlimited opportunity in our great province.

Instead of people seeing divisions and borders between people of different faiths and cultures, we must provide a venue for young people to experience human unity. Instead of our young people being marginalized by the way they dress, the music they listen to, or the one mistake they've made, we must accept them, we must love them, and we must give them a chance to change. Instead of teaching our young people to judge others, they must learn to bring out the best in others. Instead of young people feeling that beauty is based on shapes and sizes and that love is conditional, they must see and they must feel that they are beautiful and they are loved. Instead of our young people hearing that one person just can't do anything or witnessing prejudice and judgment, they must know that the ability to do great things, to uplift humanity, to serve, to prosper, to contribute, to live in harmony with fellow human beings is their potential.

The greatness of humanity, the greatness instilled in every human being, the greatness of serving is to be realized and developed. That is my hope, that is my dream, and that is why I am the MLA for Calgary-Montrose.

Thank you, sir.

By way of constituency background for my fellow members, the riding of Airdrie-Chestermere has seen remarkable growth over the past several years. In fact, Airdrie has been one of the fastest growing cities and Chestermere one of the fastest growing towns in all of Canada. Although there are many new faces, we also have fifth-generation Alberta families working the same lands that their great-grandparents did, although they use a little more horsepower than their forebears ever did.

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Recently he had taken up the cause of religious minorities in Afghanistan and was pressing Ottawa to speed their refugee claims. He travelled to New Delhi earlier this year, where he met with Sikh refugees. He said there are at least 300 Sikh and Hindu families living in Afghanistan who face constant discrimination, the inability to fully practise their faith and threats of violence. In the past years he played a large role in insuring the accommodation for the kirpan in courthouses in Alberta. He has helped countless local youth by encouraging them through his actions and presence. He was monumental in starting up Dashmesh Mission and the first ever Nagar Keertan in Calgary. He also helped start the Walk Away Hunger Campaign that has been happening for over 10 years and has raised thousands of dollars for the Interfaith Food Bank.

He helped out with the Langar Week initiative that happened last month in October and with the Guru Nanak Dev Ji Clothing Drive that happened last year and again this year. He was involved with getting the inaugural Sikh Youth Leadership Institute started here in Calgary this summer. Manmeet Singh delivered an emotional speech in Alberta's legislature in early November of this year about violence that had claimed thousands of Sikh lives in India in 1984.

He was first elected in 2008 as one of Alberta's youngest MLAs and from there has served different roles in government. He encouraged other future leaders to step up on the political ladder and further serve the larger Canadian community. 
