59. UNMARRIED PARENT SERVICES

To assist unwed mothers both prior to and following birth of the child with appropriate plans for both mother and child. Assistance is provided as follows: (1) locating suitable accommodation, if required, principally through private wage homes in the community and in maternity homes during the late stages of pregnancy: (2) financial assistance during the last three months of pregnancy and for a short period following the birth of the child: (3) contact with the father of the child with a view to having him assume responsibilities for confinement expenses incurred by the mother both prior to and following birth if she has kept her infant: (4) temporary care for the child in approved foster homes in order to enable the mother to make adequate arrangements for the subsequent care of her infant if she is keeping the child or to enable her to reach a decision in future planning for the child: (5) counselling of the unmarried mother to assist in the resolution of problems resulting in and from the illegitimate pregnancy, and (6) completion of the legal documents with respect to relinquishment of the child if this is the mother's final decision.

Generally it will include the employable, transient persons who require financial assistance for a temporary period pending employment.

This program also includes provision of additional income, usually on an emergency basis, to those persons who may be employed or have sources of income which are not entirely sufficient for their needs. Includes cash grants, loans, food, clothing, fuel, dental or medical services and appliances, camp fees, or other items provided by voluntary agencies to, or on behalf of, families and individuals. May be given as part of casework service to assist in rehabilitation.
