#### 1. CIHR Update

Pierre Cote, Director General, Operations Support, provided a verbal CIHR update.

#### **New Member**

CIHR welcomed Dr. Roger McLeod as the new UD for Dalhousie University (replacing Dr. Mark Filiaggi).

### **UDEC Recruitment**

Dr. Brian Christie, the UD from the University of Victoria, has accepted his appointment to join the UDEC. Pierre thanked all candidates and everyone who voted. Pierre also thanked Dr. Shanthi Johnson for her continued support as a long-standing UDEC member.

### Appointment of the CIHR President

On June 20, 2018, CIHR announced the appointment of Dr. Michael Strong as President of CIHR – effective October 1, 2018. Members were reminded to share the announcement with their research communities. The announcement is available online (en français).

CIHR was pleased to inform UD members that Dr. Strong is already engaging with CIHR on some key files.

# Internal Staffing Updates

Dr. Rod McInnes' last day as Acting President of CIHR was on June 30. Michel Perron, Executive Vice-President, will lead the transition process until Dr. Strong's arrival on October 1, 2018.

Dr. Anne Martin-Matthews' term as Acting Vice-President, Research, Knowledge Translation and Ethics (RKTE) ended in June 2018. She has since moved back to BC but is working part-time until her position is filled. Interviews are scheduled to take place in August. An update is expected to be provided shortly thereafter. Odgers Berndtson is the professional recruiting organization who is handling this posting.

In the meantime, Anne continues to manage priority files related to SPOR and Ethics.

#### Equity and Diversity Questionnaire

Members will be provided with text to help promote the recently launched Equity and Diversity Questionnaire via their institutions. As of May 15, 2018, application participants for all CIHR programs are required to complete the questionnaire.

CIHR is monitoring the questionnaire for completeness at the registration stage of each competition. Targeted communications will be used as required to minimize any issues at the application stage.

#### College of Reviewers

- Observer Program: Over 400 Early Career Researchers (ECRs) have submitted an application to be an observer for the Spring 2018: Project Grant face-to-face peer review meetings. Of those individuals, 60 were selected through a lottery process. CIHR plans to use the same approach to the program for the Fall 2018: Project Grant competition. Individuals who applied to the Observer Program for the Spring 2018: Project Grant competition and who were not selected will need to re-apply if interested.
- Associate Membership Program: In February 2018, the College launched its first pilot
  wave of recruitment for the program which creates a membership opportunity for new or
  less experienced reviewers. More specifically, it supports them in building the peer
  review skills and experiences required to obtain full member status within the College.
  CIHR is working with its initial wave of 59 Associates to inform the expansion of this
  program.
- College Members in Peer Review: We are delighted to confirm that 78% and 98% of peer reviewers for the Spring 2018: Project Grant and 2017-18 Foundation Grant competitions respectively were also College Members.

College Recruitment: CIHR currently has a membership base of 4457 reviewers. The
College is now focusing its efforts on targeted recruitment to fill gaps in expertise and
demographics (i.e., Early Career Researchers, Indigenous Health researchers,
Knowledge Users and International reviewers).

There is a total of 38% and 62% female and male representation respectively within the College membership base. This currently aligns with the gender representation seen in the academic workforce, as per Statistics Canada's University and College Academic Staff System (UCASS) survey.

Nominations: To date, CIHR has received 1342 nominations from over 35 institutions, as
well as 174 self-nominations to join the College. Nominations are validated by CIHR staff
using a set of membership-specific selection criteria. To date, close to 900 people have
been invited to join the College based on nominations received. The nominations
process is ongoing and members were encouraged to send an email to college@cihrirsc.qc.ca to nominate a colleague.

#### 2. Update on the Project Grant Program

Martine Lafrance, Manager, Project Grant Program, provided a verbal update on the Spring 2018 and Fall 2018 Project Grant competitions.

#### Spring 2018 competition

57 peer review committee meetings were held between May 15 and June 15. Notice of Decision (NOD) will be available to applicants via their ResearchNet accounts on July 10, to coincide with the release of the institutional reports. Competition results will be posted on the Funding Decision Database (FDD) on July 11.

#### Fall 2018 competition

Funding opportunity details and instructional materials will be posted on ResearchNet and the CIHR corporate website on July 11. Registration will open on July 11, with a deadline of August 15 at 8:00 p.m. ET. Applicants may complete their application as soon as registration is completed/submitted. The application deadline for this competition is September 12 at 8:00 p.m. ET. A series of 8 applicant webinars will be offered between mid-July and early September. Webinar information is available online (en français).

Updated peer review committee mandates will be posted on July 11 to reflect feedback gathered from Chairs, Scientific Officers, and peer reviewers. CIHR encourages the research community to continue providing input on this subject.

#### 3. Update on the Foundation Grant Program

Dale Dempsey, Manager, Foundation Grant Program, provided a verbal update on the Foundation Grant: 2017-2018 competition. An announcement regarding next steps for the program will be made on Monday July 9. The Notice of Decision for the competition will be released on July 17.

## 4. Strategic Update

Nathalie Gendron, Manager, Program Design and Delivery, provided a verbal update on CIHR's strategic competitions. Strategic Initiatives with registration and application deadlines planned for the next 3 months were presented. #### 5. Harmonized Grants Management Solution

Pierre informed members that the tri-agencies are working together to explore the creation of a harmonized grants management solution which would be a "one-stop-shop" for everything from the launch of a funding opportunity to end-of-grant reporting. In designing this new solution, tri-

agencies will focus on creating a secure, user-friendly interface that reduces burden on staff and the research community.

Updates will be shared at upcoming meetings.

## 6. Tri-Agency Financial Administration Guide

The tri-agencies will be working with the 12 institutions that have manifested an interest in participating in a pilot project for the new guide. More information, including the list of participating institutions, will be available at a later date.

### 7. Varia

One member asked if there is a plan to improve equity and diversity imbalances within peer review committees. Pierre confirmed that this, along with issues related to Early Career Researchers, is a priority for CIHR and that evidence-informed decisions are necessary to ensure progress on this front.
