SOME SAMPLE PROBLEMS

We have listed below some of the major problem areas you may encounter, and some suggestions on which agency to use in each case.

If in doubt phone Welfare Information Service, 4247966.

1. **FINANCIAL NEED:** The City, the Province or the Dominion, separately or together, are responsible for meeting financial need. Persons living in any municipality, town or city (12 months out of the previous 24) may apply to City Welfare Department; those not living in any municipality, city or town, or having residence outside Alberta, may apply to Department of Public Welfare, Government of Alberta.
2. **CHILD NEGLECT:** Where it is thought a child is being mistreated, abused, or neglected within the boundaries of the City of Edmonton, contact the City Welfare Department. If such is happening outside the City boundaries, contact the Department of Public Welfare, Regional Office.
3. **UNMARRIED MOTHER:** The unmarried mother is the responsibility of the Provincial Government, Department of Public Welfare and is entitled to receive services such as financial assistance, counselling, placement, medical and hospital services, and adoption. Other agencies working with the unmarried mother are the Family Service Bureau, the Misericordia Hospital Social Service Department, Beulah Home, St. John's House, and the Catholic Family and Child Service.
4. **REHABILITATION FOR THE DISABLED:** Financial assistance, casework and referral services are provided through the Rehabilitation Unit Department of Public Welfare, Regional Office. Other agencies providing services in this area are: the Rehabilitation Society, the Polio Foundation, the Alberta Council

4. REHABILITATION FOR THE DISABLED: Continued
for Crippled Children and Adults, the Alberta Tuberculosis Association, the Workmen's Compensation Board, National Employment Service - Special Placement Section, and others.
5. SERVICES FOR THE AGED: Pensions to all persons 70 years of age and over are available upon application from the Post Office. Other problems such as financial, housing, bus passes, etc., are provided through either the City Welfare Department or the Department of Public Welfare.
6. JUVENILE DELINQUENCY: Responsibility for detection and apprehension rests with the Police Department's Juvenile Investigation Branch.
7. FAMILY PROBLEMS: For personal problems, marital difficulties, or problems with children a counselling service is provided at the Catholic Family and Child Service, the Family Service Bureau, the Jewish Family Services, and the Family Welfare Section of the Salvation Army. Services are also provided by the Family Court which has at its disposal the services of the City Welfare Department, Family Counselling Section.
8. HEALTH NEEDS: Primary responsibility rests with the Provincial Department of Health, for instance, Cancer Services, Polio Services, Drugs for the diabetic, tuberculosis treatments, and treatment of venereal disease. Certain preventative services are offered by the Local Board of Health of the City of Edmonton, such as free inoculation clinics, vaccination against polio, school health services, and pre-natal and well-baby clinics.
9. RECREATION NEEDS: Questions concerning parks, golf links, swimming pools, etc., should be directed to the Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Edmonton. Other programs are offered by such organizations as the YMCA, YWCA, Boy Scouts, Girl Guides, and others.
