GUIDE TO THE USE OF DIRECTORY

- If you wish to find the address of an organization, or wish to check its services, you can do this by going through the listings as they are organized alphabetically. We have followed, as much as possible, the alphabetical listing of the City Telephone Directory, for example:
 - a) All Federal Government services are listed under "Government of Canada".
 - b) All Provincial Government services are listed under "Government of Alberta".
 - c) All City of Edmonton services are listed under "City of Edmonton".

EXCEPTIONS:

- a) <u>All Camps</u> are listed, irrespective of the name of the parent organization, under "C Camps and Camping".
- b) Since services provided by <u>Service Clubs</u>, <u>Auxiliaries</u>, <u>Fraternal and other similar organizations</u> may vary from year to year, and since names and addresses of officers change annually, no listing has been attempted in this Directory. However, information of this nature may be secured from the current files of Welfare Information Service at GA 4-7966.

2. USE OF CLASSIFIED INDEX, SEE PAGE 9 - "CLASSIFIED INDEX"

- If you have any doubt about where to turn, or if you need more specific information not contained in the Directory, phone the Welfare Information Service GA 4-7966.
- For quick reference, phone numbers of agencies are listed on the back cover.
- 5. Blank pages have been inserted in the back for your convenience to list additions and changes. Revisions will be mailed to you from time to time.

SOME SAMPLE PROBLEMS

We have listed below some of the major problem areas you may encounter, and some suggestions on which agency to use in each case. If in doubt phone Welfare Information Service, GA 4-7966.

- FINANCIAL NEED: The City, the Province or the Dominion, separately or together, are responsible for meeting financial need. Persons living in any municipality, town or city (12 months out of the previous 24) may apply to City Welfare Department; those not living in any municipality, city or town, or having residence outside Alberta, may apply to Department of Public Welfare, Government of Alberta.
- 2. <u>CHILD NEGLECT</u>: Where it is thought a child is being mistreated, abused or neglected within the boundaries of the City of Edmonton, contact the City Welfare Department. If such is happening outside the City boundaries, contact the Department of Public Welfare, Regional Office.
- 3. <u>UNMARRIED MOTHER</u>: The unmarried mother is the responsibility of the Provincial Government, Department of Public Welfare and is entitled to receive services such as financial assistance, counselling, placement, medical and hospital services, and adoption. Other agencies working with the unmarried mother are the Family Service Bureau, the Misericordia Hospital Social Service Department, Beulah Home and St. John's House.
- 4. <u>REHABILITATION FOR THE DISABLED</u>: Financial assistance, casework and referral services are provided through the office of the Co-ordinator for Rehabilitation, Department of Public Welfare, Regional Office. Other agencies providing services in this area are: the Rehabilitation Society, the Polio Foundation, the Alberta Council for Crippled Children and Adults, the Alberta Tuberculosis Association,

the Workmen's Compensation Board, National Employment Service -Special Placement Section, and others.

- 5. <u>SERVICES FOR THE AGED</u>: Pensions to all persons 70 years of age and over are available upon application from the Post Office. Other problems such as financial, housing, bus passes, etc., are provided through either the City Welfare Department or the Department of Public Welfare.
- <u>JUVENILE DELINQUENCY</u>: Responsibility for detection and apprehension rests with the Police Department's Juvenile Investigation Branch.
- 7. <u>FAMILY PROBLEMS</u>: For personal problems, marital difficulties, or problems with children a counselling service is provided at the Family Service Bureau or the Jewish Welfare Society. Services are also provided by the Family Court which has at its disposal the services of the City Welfare Department, Family Counselling Section.
- 8. <u>HEALTH NEEDS</u>: Primary responsibility rests with the Provincial Department of Health, for instance, Cancer Services, Polio Services, Drugs for the diabetic, tuberculosis treatments and treatment of venereal disease. Certain preventative services are offered by the Local Board of Health of the City of Edmonton, such as free inoculation clinics, vaccination against polio, school health services and pre-natal and well-baby clinics.
- 9. <u>RECREATION NEEDS</u>: Questions concerning parks, golf links, swimming pools, etc., should be directed to the City Parks Department. The City Recreation Department is responsible for providing playground programs, and leadership for community recreation programs, etc. Other programs are offered by such organizations as the YMCA, YWCA, Boy Scouts, Girl Guides and others.

They are represented by delegates who make up the General Council Membership and serve on study committees through which the Council works. A voluntary Board of Directors, elected at annual meetings, governs its policy.
