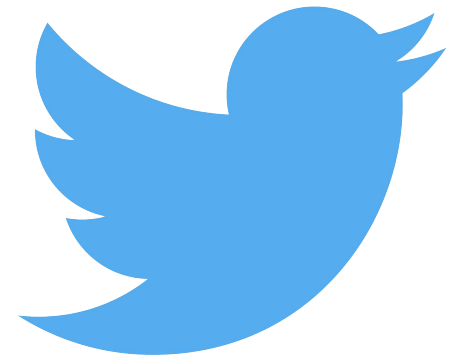

# Student Response Systems

A few ways to use a student response system include:

- exposing and clarifying students' common misconceptions (e.g. making predictions)
- promoting interactivity and discussion
- assessing students' prior knowledge or level of new content knowledge - providing feedback
- polling students anonymously about controversial topics

## Collaborative Writing - Novel in a Day (#digiwrimo)

- demonstrate examples of writing as a communal act
- develop a sense of audience and citizenship
- practice in analyzing writing; easier to analyze another's work than your own
- encourage students to discuss their writing
- illustrates writing as a process

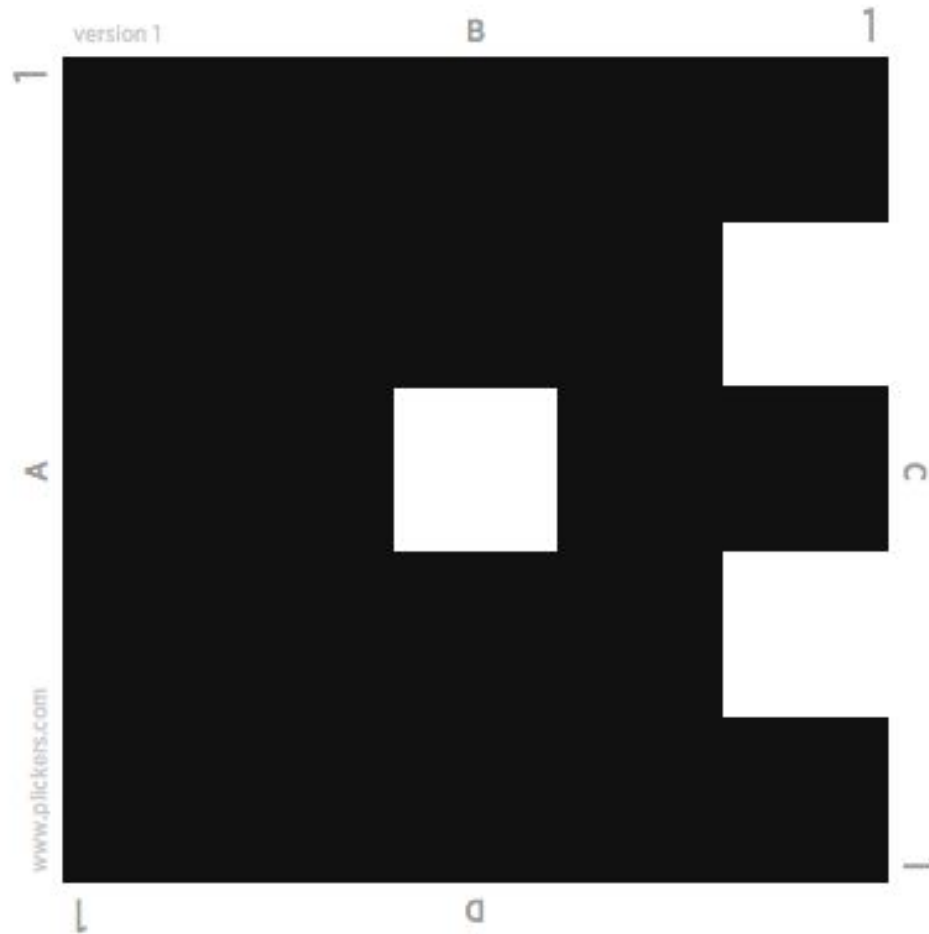
## A Few Final Thoughts
