- Not necessarily relevant information
- Information quickly outdated
- Working with a variety of writers
  - Adapting to each writer's unique preferences
  - Lack of familiarity with the rapid review process

- Short timelines
  - 2-8 hours turnaround
  - Potential impact on quality and comprehensiveness
  - Managing expectations
- Learning as we go
  - Constantly adjusting search filters
  - Discovering new resources

### AHS Scientific Advisory Group COVID-19 Recommendations

The SAG Rapid Response Reports and Rapid Reviews provide recommendations pertaining to COVID-19. The recommendations are intended to be used in addition to clinical judgment. As evidence evolves, the SAG develops updates as needed. Latest reports (June 4):

- Singing as a risk for transmission of SARS-Cov-2 virus
- · Rehabilitation needs of COVID-19 patients
- Awake prone positioning for non-intubated patients
- Can COVID-19 patient's become re-infected?
- Clinician's guide to non-respiratory symptoms of COVID-19
- Non-invasive ventilation recommendations
  (reassessed)
- · Anti-microbial use for secondary infections
- · Are healthcare workers at increased risk?
