



Tonight's concert is the last Academy Strings concert he will conduct before he retires from the University of Alberta in April. After many years of teaching and performing in Edmonton, Norman will be moving to Victoria where he will continue his music career.

Born in Dublin and raised primarily in England, Norman began playing the violin at the age of ten. At 15, he was winning national awards and performing for royalty. At the age of 24, he held the position of Assistant Concertmaster with the London Symphony Orchestra, subsequently holding the same position with the Royal Philharmonic and the BBC Symphony Orchestra. Upon coming to Canada, he became Concertmaster with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra.

As a solo violinist Norman performed with major symphony orchestras including the London Symphony Orchestra, the BBC Symphony Orchestra, the Vancouver CBC Chamber Orchestra and the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra.

Norman has been instrumental in establishing some of the most prestigious music ensembles in the world. Whilst living in London, England, Norman and four of his friends from the London Symphony Orchestra started their own string ensemble specializing in the performance of baroque music. Named for the original rehearsal and performance site of St. Martin-in-the-Fields church on Trafalgar Square, this group was known as The Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields.

In Canada, Norman formed the Purcell String Quartet with three other members of the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. The quartet toured throughout Canada, the United States and Europe, performing at Wigmore Hall in London, Carnegie Hall in New York and before the Governor-General at Government House in Ottawa.

Norman moved to Edmonton in 1979 to lead the University of Alberta String Quartet. His role at the university included teaching and leading small ensembles, including Academy Strings.

The Academy Strings, like all of his students, have received the benefit of his teaching, his hilarious stories and his love for and understanding of music. Academy members have also been fortunate to have many unique performance, travelling and general life experiences on Academy tours through Europe, Alberta and B.C., which Norman has courageously undertaken as our fearless leader. Norman took Academy Strings to Europe twice, in 1988 and 1990 where we performed in many locations in France, Italy and England.

Norman is admired, enjoyed and respected by the members of Academy. He teaches us not only to play, but to feel, and imbues his students with a deep appreciation for and understanding of the music they play. Norman has the rare ability to create the perfectly balanced recipe of stories, jokes, mood, technical hints and admonishment in order to encourage the best performance from his students.

And now, we are very sorry to see Norman leave. We have all greatly benefited from and enjoyed him, his talent and leadership.

We thank you, Norman. We wish you well. And we will certainly miss you.
