Program Notes

Born in Oakville, Ontario, Jonathan Craig began his musical studies on the violin at the age of six. After two years, at the suggestion of his teacher, the viola was added to his studies. A year later he won a scholarship to study at the Royal College of Music in Hamilton. As a student, Jonathan has been Principal Violist with the Hamilton Philharmonic Youth Orchestra, the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra, the University of Toronto Symphony Orchestra and the University of Southern California Symphony Orchestra.

Jonathan has also participated in many chamber music festivals both in Canada and in the United States, including the Banff School of Fine Arts, the Sarasota Music Festival and the Music Academy of the West. In the 1991 he was a prize winner at the Lionel Tertis International Viola Competition on the Isle of Mann.

After completing a Bachelors degree in Music Performance with David Zafer at the University of Toronto, Jonathan received a Masters in Music Performance degree with Donald McInnes at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles. Since then, he has been Principal Violist with the Millenial Arts Chamber Orchestra of Los Angeles, the Amedeus Ensemble in Toronto, and the National Ballet of Canada.

Jonathan is currently Principal Violist with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and is on the faculty of the Department of Music at the University of Alberta, a position made possible by the generosity of Dr Francis Winspear.

Marijke Roos is a South-African musician with a varied background as chamber musician, piano teacher, vocal coach, music journalist and artist manager. She studied under Lamar Crowson in Cape Town, Astrid Schmidt-Neuhaus in Cologne, Bruno Sacchetti in Florence and Jules Gentil in Paris. For eight years, Ms Roos was a lecturer in chamber music at Stellerbosch University.

In September of 1993 Ms Roos began working on a doctorate in piano at the University of Alberta under the guidance of Stéphane Lemelin. Future projects include teaching at the International Summer Academy in Nice, France, in July, as assistant to the French pianist Pascal Rogé.

Joowon Kim, a native of South Korea, began her musical education on piano at the age of five. Upon immigration to Canada with her family, she took up the violin, and two years later, at the age of twelve, she started to play the cello. It was not until her junior year in high school, however, that she embarked on her formal cello studies under the tutelage of Vlademir Orloff and David Hetherington.

Ms Kim earned a Bachelor of Music Performance degree at the University of Toronto in 1987 and a Masters of Music degree at the University of Souther California in 1991. From 1988-1989, she took part in an advanced studies programme at the Columbus College in Columbus, Georgia where she received a full scholarship. In 1988, she won the first prize at the Atlanta Music Society Competition and the following year to capture the top honors prize. Ms Kim was also invited to give a recital tour of the Missouri, Kansas, and Nebraska State University. She was the associate principal of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Macon Symphony.

Ms Kim studied with Eleonor Schoenfeld at the University of Southern California and was the recipient of the Dean's Scholarship. While in Los Angeles Ms Kim was a member of the Pasadena Symphony Orchestra and on faculty at the Korean American Institute of Fine Arts. Ms Kim is living in Edmonton and working as a freelance cellist and private teacher.
