



Alberta Indigenous Mentorship in Health Innovation (AIM-HI) Network Indigenous Health Research Principal Investigator Recruitment

Project Background

The AIM-HI Network and the Alberta First Nations Information Governance Centre (AFNIGC) have collaborated with the goal of supporting Indigenous Health Research Initiatives in Alberta, which includes increasing the number of Indigenous Researchers. Through this collaboration, AIM-HI and AFNIGC will be providing salary funding to First Nations, Métis and Inuit research undergraduate and graduate students, who will work to support the development of proposals to be submitted to the Federal Research Granting Agencies in Canada (Canadian Institute of Health Research, Social Science and Humanities Research Council, and the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council) by Indigenous Health Research Principal Investigators located in Universities across the Province of Alberta. This recruitment call is to identify interested Indigenous Health Research Principal Investigators who are willing to supervise and mentor students throughout the duration of the project term.

Project Term

May 1, 2019 - September 1, 2019

Project Resources

A salary of up to \$10,000.00 will be awarded to First Nations, Métis and Inuit research undergraduate and graduate students for the duration of the project term. The expectation is that the student will work with the Principal Investigator to develop a grant proposal for submission to one of the Federal Research Granting Agencies in Canada. The student will participate in AIM-HI activities. In addition, AFNIGC will be providing administrative support and learning opportunities for the students to further enhance understandings of First Nation worldviews. A minimum of 4 awards will be distributed, with the possibility for additional awards pending current funding applications.

Principal Investigator (PI) Eligibility

- Proposal topics must focus on Indigenous health, this includes social sciences and natural sciences;
- Ability to mentor a First Nations, Métis and Inuit research undergraduate or graduate student for the duration of the identified term; and
- Willingness to participate in AFNIGC & AIM HI Mentor Orientation Training Session.
