- Help create a literate environment with special attention to • prisoners with low literacy levels and non-native language backgrounds
- Allows inmates to be life-long learners
- Allows freedom of choice (a rarity in prison) and reminds inmates that there are still aspects of their lives they can control

Email message from Karen Cook-Newbury,

November 2, 2020

"We do not have wifi in the Centre ...Currently, students request books through their instructors and the instructors pull them and deliver them to the students. This is why having the library catalogued would be so ideal at this time. The instructors need to know what is there and where to find it. We also need to be able to track what students, on what living units (their address) took out the books and returned them. Before COVID students would have access to the library and would choose their own books. We would keep a borrowing Excel spreadsheet. This worked, but we still were not easily able to see what books were missing, popular, where they were, etc. Also, with the spreadsheet kept on a USB and many instructors using it the formatting, and other things would often be changed and/or lost.

- Once I received the Excel spreadsheet, I would convert to a .csv and upload into Libib
- Once the items were uploaded, I would go into Libib and edit the item information and add tagging information to aid in organization
