

Only about 20% of Indigenous people in Canada can speak an ancestral language (2017).

High resource languages, like English, are often the main focus of natural language processing. These tools can help with the revitalization of Indigenous languages like Cree.

Primary Objective: Make Cree Language Resources Accessible


To distribute language resources and educational tools in order to share the Cree language.

The Corpus Website

- When the server is running, users are brought to the home page.
- It has the organization name (EdTeKLA), an introduction message, and a credit area.
- There is a non-functional input for future email collection and two buttons.

- If the download cannot be completed, the website returns an error message.
