NEW ORLI ANS (AP) — Good weather over the next several weeks could do a lot to reduce a pre iminary estimate of \$100 million in Louisiana crop damage from Hurricane Isaac, LSL AgCenter economist Kurt Guidry said Tuesday. Of course, bad weather would do the opposite.

Since several crops were thought likely to have near-record harvests before the storm, the state's agricultural sector could still have a good year if skies stay blue, Guidry said. The preliminary figure is less than damage from last year's drought or from other storms in recent years, and less than farmers feared, he said. Which isn't to say that all damage was light. Some farmers lost entire crops.

APA Format Style

- APA Format: typeface, line spacing, margins, length, alignment
- APA Style: established set of procedures, standards, and rules chosen by your discipline to communicate with your readers and engage in (written) discourse.



Moving from High School to University Writing

Academic Writing:

- Discourse-driven: FON = "evidence-based;
 CBL; CARNA; reflective practice; scholarly"
- Research-driven: requires you to read, summarize, and respond according to your discipline's academic requirements
- Genre-driven: Scholarly paper is very different from an English essays; other FON genres: reflective journal, learning goals, care plan



Your N190 Scholarly Essay

- Locate credible information i.e., sources
- Reflect on what these sources tell you
- Acknowledge all of sources that you have used in writing your assignment

- Organization, structure, cohesion





Scholarly essay: Crediting sources

1. In-text references

The author and year of your source are written into the paragraph.

2. The reference list

At the back of your assignment is a complete list of all the sources you used in your assignment.



In-text references:

- **1. Summary:** Concise overview; You briefly restate the author's main points and conclusions
- 2. Paraphrase: You use the ideas from the source and put them into your own words
- 3. Quote: You copy the exact words from the source and use it in your assignment



In-text references:

1. Surname of author(s)

WHO

2. Date published

WHEN

3. Page number (for direct quotes) WHAT



Summary: one or two authors

Reves (2009) studied university instructor's self-esteem and concluded that the fear of students' judgments made teachers overly self-conscious about their own mistakes.

Cheung and Hyland (2005) investigated the academic performance of 420 Hong Kong university students and found that females outperformed males in math and science.

Spot the order?



Paraphrase: one author

Attachment is the special emotional bond that we feel for those who we are very close to (Berk, 2004).

Berk (2004) described attachment as the special emotional bond that we feel for those who we are very close to.

Spot the difference(s)?



Paraphrase: two authors

Media has a huge influence on the way people assess their health needs and view healthcare professionals (Dew & Kirkman, 2002).

Dew and Kirkman (2002) reported that media has a huge influence on the way people assess their health needs and view healthcare professionals.

Spot the difference(s)?



Paraphrase:multiple sources

There is a high rate of comorbidity with alcohol abuse or dependence and major depression (Bowlby, 2006; Engeland & Kreutzer, 2010; Werner, Smith, & Laub, 2011).

Alphabetical order by first author

Separated by semi-colons

"&" inside parenthesis



Paraphrase:organizations

Among standards of nursing practice, communicating with the patient's family or significant others is an integral part of nursing services (CARNA, 2008, p. 1).

Notice the order?

Name, date, page (optional for paraphrase)



Quotes: one author

Berk (2004) stated that "attachment is the strong, affectional tie we have with special people in our lives" (p.185).

Berk (2004, p. 185) stated that "attachment is the strong, affectional tie we have with special people in our lives."

Spot the difference?



Quotes:definitions

Eagly and Chaiken (2003) define attitude as "a psychological tendency that is expressed by evaluating a particular entity with some degree of favor or disfavor" (p. 1).

For the purposes of this assignment, attitude is defined as "a psychological tendency that is expressed by evaluating a particular entity with some degree of favor or disfavor" (Eagly & Chaiken, 2003, p. 1)

Reference List:What

- Title of the source
- Capitalize the first word of the entire title, any subtitles, and proper nouns.
- Finish the title with a period.



Reference List:What

Periodical title (article, newspaper): no italics

Mental and nervous diseases in the Russo-Japanese war: A historical analysis.



Reference List:What

Non-periodical title (books, reports): italics

Development of entry-level tests to select FBI agents.



Reference List:Where

- Location of the source
- Periodicals (journals) entered differently than non-periodicals (books, reports)
- Finish the location with a period.



Reference List:Where

Periodicals: give journal title, volume(issue), pages

Social Science Quarterly, 84, 508-525.



Reference List:Where

Non-periodicals: give location and publisher

New York: Sage.

Thousand Oaks, CA: Penguin Books.

Toronto: Pearson Canada.

APA Manual of Style: Reference List

Purpose?

So readers can easily follow your exposure to nursing research

(your exploration trail)



In-text

- Author(s)
- (Date)
- Page(s)

Reference List

- Author(s)
- (Date)
- Title
- Location



About Authors

- In-text (parenthesis): Alphabetize by first author of each source
- Reference list: Alphabetize by first author of each entry
- If two sources from same author, list earliest work first (2006 listed before 2009)



Other aspects of APA Style

- Headings: Section 3
- Running heads: Section 2
- Numbers: Section 4
 - Below 10: one, five, two
 - Start of sentence: "Twenty-five percent of adults...."
 - 10 & above: 10, 200, 25%
- Footnotes: don't use them short papers



Other aspects of APA Style

- Personal communication, class notes not included in the reference list (only cited in the text of your assignment)
- Verify each reference in text appears in the reference list & vice-versa
- Double spaced (check with your instructor)



WHAT MATTERS MOST?

ADVICE from IAN in Year 2:

- Make sure that formatting doesn't get in the way of writing a good paper. Don't get too caught up in getting it down perfectly, this is your first paper and mistakes are expected. Make sure that you spend enough time on the actual flow and substance of the essay to get your claim and direction across in a focused way. The formatting will come in time, there will be many, many opportunities to practise it in the coming years.
- Use the tools in CINAHL and other databases that are available for citation. They save time and are quite accurate.



Norman in Emergency: A Case Study on Care

Primary health care is health in "homes, schools, communities, and places of employment," (Anderson & McFarlane, 2000, p.13). It is based on accessibility, with full participation that is not too big of a deal in terms of money (Stamler & Yui, 2005). According to Stamler & Yui (2005) five main principals of primary health care: accessibility, public participation, health promotion, appropriate technology and intersectoral coperation. Health promotion is a concept that relies on teaching people skills to enhance their own health and wellbeing (Stamler & Yiu). Appropriate technology relates to the community's development socially, economically and culturally (Stamler & Yui). The variety of professionals to collaborate to provide care such as a doctor, nurse and dietician encompasses the idea of intersectoral cooperation (Stamler & Yui). Primary health care services try to benefit your health, prevent you from unnecessary illness or injury, provide you with treatments and assist rehabilitations (Stamler and Yui).

Norman in Emergency: A Case Study on Care

Based on Martin's (2005, p. 25) description of Norman's current life situation, Norman is a fifty three year old male admitted to this site because of sudden profound right sided weakness and fell twice while trying to move down the aisle of a train four hours ago. Norman is transported to the University of Alberta emergency department. It being the only neurological trauma emergency department in Edmonton, this site is the most logical choice for Norman (E. Bryldt, personal communication, January 26th, 2007). Following his initial assessment and treatment, Norman is admitted to a medical unit on the third floor. The nurse admitting Norman is working through the process of developing a priority plan of care. In this paper, the writer will engage in a detailed discussion of Norman's priority needs given the sudden turn in his health and offer a theory-based plan of care guided by Orem's (as cited in George, 2002) self-care deficit theory.

Conclusion

Complications of diabetes can result in long hospital stays and low quality of life. By doing something about it today, you increase your chances of a healthier tomorrow (Canadian Diabetes Association, 2006).

A community health nurse is in a prime role to assist with issues such as these in a community.

Conclusion

The purpose of this paper was to describe the sudden turn in Norman's health and develop a priority plan of care based upon Orem's (2002) self-care deficit theory. Doing so revealed the struggles faced by Norman - a fifty-three year old stroke victim experiencing abrupt changes to his physical independence and connectedness to his family. In having applied Orem's (2002) self-care deficit theory, the nurse concluded that Norman was at risk for low self esteem. Interventions established to help Norman overcome this priority need primarily fell within the supportive-educative system. Key suggested interventions included assisting Norman to grieve his loses, and educating Norman and his wife based on the knowledge gaps they identified as priorities. Several weeks after this plan of care was implemented and in accordance with Martin's (2005) subsequent scenario description, Norman experienced a full recovery, was discharged from the medical unit, and returned to work at his prior place of employment in Montreal.
