The Department of Rural Economy, Faculty of Agriculture, Forestry and Home Economics is proud of our students who participated in the Undergraduate Student Competitions at the American Agricultural Economics Association Meetings held in Long Beach, California, July 28-31, 2002. The students were Mike Rausch, BSc Environmental Conservation, Chantelle l'Hoir, BCom Co-operatives, Michelle Spence, BSc Environmental Conservation, Jason Walker, BSc Agriculture and Adair Rigney, BSc Environmental Conservation. All five students presented papers in the Undergraduate Student Paper Competition. Michelle won first place with her paper entitled: "Effect of Age on the Probability of Participation in Wildlife Related Activities: A Birth Year Cohort Study." Chantelle placed third with her paper entitled: "Marketing Organic Grain in Alberta." Mike, Chantelle and Michelle also competed against teams from all over North America in the Academic Bowl. Fun was had by all!

On October 27-30, 2002, three students from the Department of Rural Economy at the University of Alberta traveled to Miami, Florida, to take part in the annual case study competition of the Food Distribution Research Society. The students were Ryan Furtas, BSc Agriculture, Kyla Rice, BSc Environment Conservation Sciences, and Steven Tannas, BSc Agriculture. They were accompanied by Getu Hailu, a PhD candidate in Agricultural Economics, and Professor Mel Lerohl. Teams from Universities as far distant as California and Michigan were represented at the competition, and the team from the University of Alberta was the first Canadian team to take part in the competition.

Students presented their solution to a case study based on how best to meet the easy-to-prepare food needs of customers in a mid-size city in North America. Team members from Rural Economy got high marks from adjudicators for their ability to look for new solutions to the case study problem, and for their ability to think on their feet. Overview of the Cooperative Program in Agricultural Marketing and Business

The Cooperative Program in Agricultural Marketing and Business was created by industry funding in the late 1980's. The broad purposes of the program are to conduct research, extension and teaching in the areas of agricultural marketing and business. The focus is on issues related to group activities whether these be for cooperatives or other organizations.

The program funding is largely used to fund graduate student research. Currently there are six Masters students and one Phd student being funded through the program. Their research topics are :

The Impact of Foreign Direct Investment on Canadian Agribusiness Potential for Increased Poultry exports from Canada Should Environmental Cooperatives be used in Canada Principal-Agent Problems and Capital Constraints in Canadian Agribusiness Supply and Marketing Co-operatives Consumer Demand for Chicken by Type of Product Games in Branding and New Product Development in the Canadian Poultry Processing Industry Factors affecting the Demand for Beef in Canada

A new project on the effects of deregulation on rural electricity cooperatives in Alberta has been established in collaboration with Professor Becky Richards, University of Montana.

The program also encourages various extension activities. This year the highlight of the program was the Annual Symposium. Symposium 2002 "*Structural Change in the Agribusiness Sector*" was held on June 5, 2002 at the University of Alberta. Ninety-two people representing industry, government and academia registered for the symposium. A new feature at this year's symposium was a poster display of 16 posters highlighting current research within the Department of Rural Economy.

Dr. Ray Bollman, Statistics Canada led off Symposium 2002 with a look at "Structural Changes in the Rural/Agricultural Sector in Canada". "The Diffusion of Innovative Organizational Structures in Saskatchewan's New Agriculture" was Roger Herman's topic. Herman from the Center for Study of Cooperatives at the University of Saskatchewan used 3 Saskatchewan based case studies to examine how economies of scale, path dependence, and the presence of social cohesion within the community impacted on the choice of organizational structure chosen to pursue these value added activities. The substantial decline in cash fed cattle trade as a result of progressive producers attempts to more effectively meet consumer demand through marketing agreements, alliances, and other non-cash arrangements was the subject of Dr. Ted Schroeder's (Kansas State University) presentation entitled "Structural Change in the North American Beef Industry". Drs. Goddard, Lerohl, and Boxall of the Department of Rural Economy combined to take a new approach -- public choice theory -- at examining the implications for a cooperative of satisfying the twin objectives of economic welfare and political lobbying on the part of the farmer members and whether this objective function contributes to some of the current problems faced by cooperatives. The day concluded with Mike Trant, Statistics Canada presenting the results of a look at "Structural Changes in the Canadian Retail Food Industry". Trant's conclusion was that large food retailers are more profitable than the rest of the retail sector and than the economy in general -- 12% rate of return vs. 7% vs. 7.3%.

A Major Academic Activity: Rural Economy Participation in Sustainable Forest Management - The Network of Centres of Excellence

The Sustainable Forest Management Network, one of Canada's Networks of Centres of Excellence, is centred at the University of Alberta. This is a national research network focused on management of Canada's forests, involving university, industry, Aboriginal and government collaboration in research. The Faculty of Agriculture, Forestry and Home Economics plays a major role in this NCE. Several faculty members are principal investigators in the Network. Dr. Vic Adamowicz (Rural Economy) returned to the position of Program Leader of the Network after returning from his study leave from July 1 2001. Dr. Terry Veeman (Economics/Rural Economy) was Interim Leader of the Network from July 2001 through June 2002. In addition several Rural Economy faculty members have research projects and graduate students funded through the network.

The Sustainable Forest Management NCE is core funded by two federal granting councils: The Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), in collaboration with Industry Canada. The Network is also supported by several industry partners, provincial governments, conservation organizations and First Nations partners. The Network's annual budget for research and networking is now over \$7 million. The Network has been extended with expanded federal funding for another four years in its second seven-year cycle.

The Network examines new approaches to forest management that can maintain the nation's forest

based-economy while not compromising biodiversity and ecological goals. The Network has two major research goals, developing innovative strategies for forest management and constructing indicators and approaches to monitor progress towards sustainability. Rural Economy staff contribute significantly to the social science components of the Network including the Policy and Institutions area and Integrated Resource Management area (under innovative strategies) and Social and Economic Indicators of Sustainability and Sustainable Aboriginal Communities themes within the indicators and monitoring area.

International Projects

The Department of Rural Economy has been active in a number of international projects. In 2002, the project *Agroforestry: Southern Africa,* funded by the Canadian International Development Agency and numerous other donors, was brought to a close. This project funded the graduate studies of 6 Zimbabwean students in the Department of Rural Economy (4 MScs and 2 PHds) and trained over 200 professionals in Southern Africa. It created numerous curricula materials that are being used in Zimbabwe and internationally, and supported numerous research projects which generated results that were presented to policy makers and published in international journals. It played a major role in internationalizing the department, facilitating 40 faculty and student exchanges between the University of Alberta and the University of Zimbabwe. It also provided expertise and interest to pursue further international projects.

A number of Faculty in the Department have also been involved in building collaborative research relationships with scholars in Mexico to develop a network of researchers for participation in a project related to forest management in Mexico. One research project on community forestry management and democracy in Oaxaca, Mexico, has already been conducted by one Faculty member and one Doctoral student in rural sociology in 2002-2003, funded by SSHRC, Organization of American States, and IDRC.

Two further international projects of Rural Economy continue. One of these, funded by IDRC, is the *Community Land Management* (Zimbabwe) project. This is providing for research by the University of Zimbabwe and the University of Alberta (through Rural Economy) on how communal property rights affect land management in Zimbabwe. The project is providing funding for three PhD students, one of whom is based at the University of Alberta. The second currently ongoing project is a linkage agreement between Rural Economy and the Kenya-Based World Agroforestry Centre which focuses on Valuation of Environmental Services of Agroforestry Systems. This project has facilitated workshops, faculty exchanges, and student research.

There are also other international initiatives underway. Rural Economy is currently involved in ongoing research and project planning with the Centre for International Forestry Research (CIFOR), where we hope to plug more Rural Economy students and staff into upcoming CIFOR research. Furthermore, we are in the process of developing further potential projects with CIFOR and the World Agroforestry Centre. We have also begun inquiries into potential future collaboration on projects in cooperation with the Global Health Committee in the faculty of Medicine and Dentistry at the University of Alberta. One planning grant, currently underway, is designed to identify rural conditions associated with HIV infection prevention in rural southern Mongolia, which is funded by the Center for International Health Research (CIHR).

Rural Economy Facilities

The Rural Economy Reading Room continues to be a valuable resource for the department and is wellused by students. The scope of the collection includes, in addition to the traditional areas of agricultural and resource economics, forest economics and rural sociology, related material on agroforestry, environmental economics, and resource sociology.

The Rural Economy Graduate Computing Laboratory was expanded in 2002 to a 12 work station research facility. This focuses on specialized software used in the disciplines of Agricultural and Resource Economics, Forest Economics and Rural Sociology. Debra Davidson and Peter Boxall were successful in obtaining capital funding for the development of a core facility for spatial applications of social ecology funded by Canadian Foundation for Innovation. This funding will enable further expansion of the scope and capacity of this facility.
