Marnie Giesbrecht has performed solo and duo recitals (duos with Joachim Segger) in various venues and cathedrals in Canada, the United States, Europe, and South Africa, many of which were broadcast by the CBC and SABC (South African Broadcasting Corp). Her formal musical studies have been in Alberta (University of Alberta), Austria (Mozarteum, Salzburg) and the USA (Eastman School of Music). Marnie Giesbrecht is Associate Professor of Music in the Department of Music at the University of Alberta (Organ Performance and related subjects) and is National President of the Royal Canadian College of Organists.

Canadian keyboard artists Marnie Giesbrecht and Joachim Segger, **Duo Majoya**, perform frequently as soloists and chamber musicians. They have performed in Canada, United States, Europe and South Africa. Their repertoire and concert programs are broad in scope including transcriptions, improvisations (Joachim), new music, music with dance and music with narration in addition to well known repertoire.

Joachim Segger has performed piano solo and chamber music concerts as well as organ duos in various venues in North America, Europe and South Africa. He has often been heard on the CBC and was winner of the prestigious Canadian Women's Club Competition in New York City resulting in a Carnegie Hall debut. His formal musical studies have been in Alberta (University of Alberta), Austria (Mozarteum, Salzburg) and the USA (Eastman School of Music). He has frequently premiered Canadian piano works and is Associate Professor of Piano and Theory at The King's University College in Edmonton.

Saxophonist Charles Stolte has appeared as soloist, chamber musician and composer in Canada, the United States and in Europe. His performances and compositions have been broadcast nationally by the CBC and his music for saxophone has been performed in North America and in Europe. He can be heard on several recordings both as soloist and as tenor saxophonist of IMPULS Saxophone Quartet. Charles Stolte is currently Lecturer in Saxophone and Music Theory at the King's University College in Edmonton, Alberta and at Augustana University College in Camrose, Alberta. He serves as Instructor of Music Theory at the University of Alberta. He has taught on the faculties of Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Roosevelt University of Chicago and holds degrees from the University of Alberta and The King's University College. His teachers include Frederick Hemke, William Street, Malcolm Forsyth, M. William Karlins, Jay Alan Yim and Howard Bashaw. He is completing his dissertation, "The Postmodern Saxophone," as a doctoral candidate at Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois.

Cellist Tanya Prochazka has a remarkably varied international career as soloist, chamber musician, freelance player and teacher. Born in Melbourne, Australia, her music has taken her throughout the world. She pursued her studies at the Paris Conservatoire with Andre Navarra, and in Bloomington, Indiana, with Janos Starker. She gathered a number of prizes at prestigious competitions: Australian Broadcasting Commission Concerto Competition, Cassado Competition in Florence, Italy, International Tribune in Czechoslovakia, semi-finalist at the Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, the Suggia Prize in London. She has performed throughout Europe, the Middle East, SouthEast Asia, Russia, and Australia. She has been heard frequently on the BBC and the CBC. Tanya Prochazka is an active recording artist for the ATMA and ARKTOS labels. Tanya is also highly regarded as a teacher and pedagogue. She has taught at the Royal Academy of Music, and at the Guildhall School of Music. Since 1987, she has taught at the University of Alberta and at Alberta College, and in July 1998, Tanya was appointed Professor of Strings at the University of Alberta.
