Kenneth Logan, Canadian Union College assistant professor of music, teaches organ and music history as well as other areas of music. His undergraduate degree is in piano performance with honours from Andrews University (1980). His Master's Degree is in organ performance from Andrews University (1984); C Warren Becker was his major professor. His Doctor of Musical Arts degree with honours is in organ performance from The University of Michigan—Ann Arbor, where his major professor was Marilyn Mason.

Orginally from Maryland, Dr Logan is a published handbell composer (Augsburg Fortress, 1991). He commenced in 1988 an extensive study of poetic texts used in sacred music in early America to 1810, in association with eminent American musicologist Richard Crawford. Other interests in music include computer music notation and musical performances assisted by electronic media.
