Looking to events, Governor General David Johnston will host a citizenship ceremony in Ottawa. He will be accompanied by Adrienne Clarkson, 26th Governor General of Canada, co-founder and co-chair of the Institute for Canadian Citizenship. This ceremony is part of a series of enhanced citizenship ceremonies celebrating Canada's 150th anniversary in 2017. Prior to the ceremony, the 40 candidates for Canadian citizenship will share their views on citizenship during a round-table discussion. The event will be held at Rideau Hall.

Also in Ottawa, to mark National Medicare Week, 125 public health care advocates from across Canada will meet with over 100 MPs to call for the creation of a National Public Drug Plan. Canada remains the only country in the world with a universal health care system that doesn't cover prescription medication. The event will be held on Parliament Hill.

Of note, the Parliamentary Budget Officer will post a new report entitled "Corporate Tax Model" online. The PBO developed a microsimulation model to estimate the fiscal impact of changes to the federal corporate tax system.
