Statistics Canada

Statistics Canada published its Consumer Price Index, December 2016. The Consumer Price Index rose 1.5 per cent on a year-over-year basis in December, following a 1.2 per cent increase in November. On a seasonally adjusted monthly basis, the Consumer Price Index was up 0.3 per cent in December, after decreasing 0.1 per cent in November. The full release is available [online](#).

Statistics Canada released its Consumer Price Index: Annual review, 2016. In 2016, the annual average increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) was 1.4 per cent. This increase followed gains of 1.1 per cent in 2015 and 2.0% in 2014. The full release is available [online](#).

Statistics Canada issued data on retail trade, November 2016. Retail sales rose for the fourth consecutive month, edging up 0.2 per cent to \$45.2 billion in November. Higher sales at motor vehicle and parts dealers and building material and garden equipment and supplies dealers were the main contributors to the gain. The full release is available [online](#).

Statistics Canada released data on investment in new housing construction, November 2016. Investment in new residential construction totalled \$4.5 billion in November, up 4.1 per cent from November 2015. The full release is available [online](#).
