Statistics Canada published its study: Skill requirements of jobs of postsecondary graduates,. Jobs held by graduates of architecture and engineering programs in 2011 required the highest skill levels among male and female bachelor's degree holders from different academic programs. A new study also found that jobs held by graduates of education, visual and performing arts, and humanities programs generally required lower level skills than other bachelor's degree graduates. Statistics Canada released data on annual wholesale trade, 2015. The operating revenue of Canadian wholesalers declined 6.6 per cent in 2015, falling below the \$1.0 trillion mark reached in 2014. The full release is available [online](#).

Statistics Canada issued data on architectural services, 2015. Architectural and landscape architectural services industries earned a combined operating revenue of \$3.8 billion in 2015, up 2.5 per cent from 2014. The operating expenses of these two industries increased 4.1 per cent to \$3.2 billion in 2015. This resulted in an operating profit margin of 15.3 per cent, down from 16.6 per cent in 2014. The Canadian Agricultural Human Resource Council has completed a three-year study and released the *Dairy: Labour Market Forecast to 2025* and *Poultry and Egg: Labour Market Forecast to 2025*. These studies examine two of Canada’s most significant agricultural industries, which together account for 55,500 jobs, or 15 per cent of the total agricultural workforce. Through consolidation, automation and other efficiencies, the dairy-cattle industry has shed more than a third of its workers since 2009, employing 39,900 as of 2014. However, despite this reduction in the size of the workforce, an additional 3,400 jobs went unfilled due to a lack of available domestic workers.
