Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission

On December 21, 2018, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission issued the detailed Record of Decision, including the Commission's reasons for decision for the renewal of Ontario Power Generation Inc.'s Nuclear Power Reactor Operating Licence for the Pickering Nuclear Generating Station. This decision was issued following a two-part public hearing held on April 4, 2018, in Ottawa, Ontario, and from June 25 to 29, 2018, in Pickering, Ontario. On August 8, 2018, the Commission had announced through a Summary Record of Decision its decision to renew OPG's licence to operate the PNGS from September 1, 2018 until August 31, 2028. The Commission also authorized OPG to operate PNGS Units 5 to 8 up to a maximum of 295,000 equivalent full power hours. The full release is available [online](#). Call 613-996-6860.
